JANUARY 6, 2014

The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Jerry Bailey presiding and the following members of the City Council present: Lawrence Hoerman, James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel and Dylan Shotton. Also present were Sheriff Troy Briggs, City Attorney Lynn Koehn, City Superintendent Daylen Elsey and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg.

Mayor Bailey opened with a prayer.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and special meeting were approved as distributed with a motion made by Councilmember Hoerman, seconded by Councilmember Barber. The motion carried 5-0.

Mayor Bailey informed the Council that the next Long Term Committee Meeting on Monday, January 13th at 7:00 p.m.

Sheriff Troy Briggs gave the monthly law enforcement report for the City. He discussed an issue reported to him of a plumbing company that put in a new sewer line at a residence in the City. The company was not licensed and did not obtain a permit or show a proof of liability insurance to the City. The Council discussed adding a penalty provision for companies/individuals not following the Ordinance.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He discussed the Morris Well status. He discussed Sewer Improvement progress. He informed the Council on repairs and new tires for the Front End Loader.

Councilmember Barber made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Hoerman to waive the requirements of generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) as required by K.S.A. 75-1220a for the fiscal year ending 2014. The Resolution is No. 010614. The motion carried 5-0.

The Council discussed an individual wanting to use propane for heating a shed in town.

Councilmember Hoerman discussed trash receptacles for the City and a credit/debit machine for Utility payments.

A motion was made by Councilmember Hoerman, seconded by Councilmember Shotton to approve and allow payment of the bills as distributed. The motion carried 5-0, with Councilmember Barber abstaining from James Barber Repair.

Councilmember Barber made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 5-0.
