ORDINANCE NO. 419

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A FIFTEEN MILE PER HOUR VEHICLE SPEED FOR CERTAIN AREAS LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY OF SUBLETTE, KANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SUBLETTE, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. INTENT: The City is passing this ordinance in order to better protect children and motorists in a high traffic area around the Sublette Elementary School.

SECTION 2. SPEED: The speed for any motorized vehicle traveling in the area defined in Section 3 shall be at a rate of speed not to exceed fifteen miles per hour (15 mph) only during the time in which flashing lights display the same.

SECTION 3. AREA OF APPLICATION: The following streets in the city of Sublette, Kansas which surround the Sublette Elementary School shall be subject to the limitations as set forth in Section 2 above:

- 1.) South Inman Street from the intersection of Chouteau Avenue to Courthouse Avenue.
- 2.) Chouteau Avenue from the intersection of South Inman Street to Pike Street.
- 3.) Pike Street from the intersection of Chouteau Avenue to Fern Avenue.
- 4.) Fern Avenue from the intersection of Pike Street to South Inman Street.

SECTION 4. PENALTIES: In the event an operator of a motorized vehicle is in excess of the speed limit as discussed herein, then such violation shall be punishable by a traffic citation and a fine as set forth in the Standard Traffic Ordinance as adopted by the City.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication once in the official newspaper.

SECTION 6. PREVIOUS ORDINANCES: All Ordinances or portions thereof which are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed. Any section or part of this ordinance deemed to be unconstitutional or invalid shall not invalidate the remaining provisions of this ordinance.
