OCTOBER 2, 2017

The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Jerry Bailey presiding and the following members of the City Council present: Lawrence Hoerman, James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel and Dylan Shotton. Also present were City Superintendent Daylen Elsey, Sheriff Troy Briggs, Assistant Fire Chief John Hall and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg. Visitors were Ashton Koehn, Deanna Burkhart, Ronnie Sumners and Stan Moser.

Mayor Bailey opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved as distributed with a motion by Councilmember Hoerman, seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 5-0.

Deanna Burkhart and Ronnie Sumner, representatives from Black Hills Energy, were present for the yearly visit. Ronnie Sumner informed the Council on the Black Hills Energy service and the pipeline improvements that they are doing within the City.

Stan Moser was present with a Cereal Malt Beverage License application for Stan Moser dba Mama Mo's Pizza, for Council approval. A motion was made by Councilmember Birney, seconded by Councilmember Hoerman for Mama Mo's Pizza to sell for consumption on the premises. The motion carried 5-0.

Sheriff Troy Briggs was present to give monthly law enforcement report. He discussed highway 83 road work status. Superintendent Elsey discussed dog impoundment for seized dogs.

City Clerk Trigg informed the Council that Jarrod Weeks, Chamber President, has asked for permission to block off Inman Street for the Fall Fest on November 2, 2017 from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m.

A motion was made by Councilmember Hoerman, seconded by Councilmember Shotton to allow the Chamber to block off Inman Street on November 2, 2017. The motion carried 5-0.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He reported on the new monitoring system for the water tower. He reported on the status of installing the heaters for the shop and spray foam insulation. He discussed starting on laying the new water line on South Inman. He informed the Council that Stoppel Dirt has finished cleaning the ditches on Dennis Street and the labor wasn't as much as expected and that they will clean ditches on North Inman for remainder of the contract amount.

Councilmember Stoppel discussed the tin and the rain gutter downspout on the south side of shop. A motion was made by Councilmember Birney, seconded by Councilmember Hoerman to install new tin and move the rain gutter downspouts. The motion failed 2-3, with Councilmember Stoppel, Barber and Shotton voting no. A motion was made by Councilmember Stoppel, seconded by Councilmember Barber to discuss with the contractor replacing the tin on shop and moving the rain gutter downspout at no cost to the City. The motion carried 4-1, with Councilmember Hoerman voting no.

A motion was made by Councilmember Hoerman, seconded by Councilmember Shotton to approve and allow payment of the bills as distributed. The motion carried 5-0, with Councilmember Barber abstaining from James Barber Sales and Repairs.

Councilmember Barber made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilmember Stoppel. The motion carried 5-0.
