Dear Calvary,

It was such a blessing to travel through Holy Week with all of you at Calvary. Participating in sacred traditions that date back centuries and knowing that we are partaking in these beautiful rituals with people from all over the world always reminds me of the vastness of our Risen Christ!

When we think of Christ sometimes we forget that this isn't Jesus' last name but rather his eternal identity that existed both before and after the Resurrection.

The raising up of Jesus isn't a one-time miracle but rather the revelation of a pattern that has always been. Through this act of resurrection God is telling us two incredible things about ourselves.

The first is that nothing dies permanently but life is merely changed after our physical body fades away. The second is that ALL of humanity is now united together in Christ. God has connected us in a way that is beyond our comprehension. To help us better understand this concept Paul created the term, "the body of Christ."

God is telling us that maybe it is time for us to let go of our small individual selves. Our personal preferences, our likes, and the "way" we've always done things. Instead we should prayerfully consider opening ourselves up to our larger identity, as Christ's body in the world.

A body that God has made with many diverse parts; parts that may look different than us, think different than us, or even live different than us.

Surrendering to our small selves and living into who God has truly created Calvary to be as a community is no easy task. Like anything good it takes work and time. It requires a change in our way of thinking, a sacrifice of our personal preferences for the sake of others, and a choice to love those who look and act differently.

This is who we are called to be as Christ's body in the world. This is who Calvary is called to be as Christ's body in Lombard.

I pray that we remember this in the days to come as we discern how God is calling us to serve as His merciful, loving, and inclusive body in the world.

## THE CEPLECHA FAMILY BY: HANNAH DAKIS

### • *What brought you to Calvary?*

Tom and Jennifer moved to Lombard in 1997. They both knew that not going to church every Sunday was not an option. As they got comfortable in the town of Lombard they started to search for the most local Episcopal church to be a part of. Calvary at the time was the only Episcopal church in the area and they decided to give it a try. They discovered that Sunday was not the only time to meet new people and get comfortable with a new environment. At the time, Calvary provided new-comers dinners on Saturday nights, which they attended a couple of times, leading them to meet so many new faces with welcoming arms. They loved the feeling of being welcomed right away into a place that was unfamiliar. This October will be rounding up to the 20<sup>th</sup> year they've been attending Calvary.

### • *Why have you continued to come to Calvary?*

The Ceplecha family continues to come to Calvary for a number of reasons. Over the years they have met so many new people that they look forward to seeing every Sunday and on events that we all go as a congregation. They also love the community feeling about the church itself and what it provides. Some the activities that they have been able to be a part of are Feed My Starving Children, our youth groups, Cookie Walk, Northern Illinois Food Bank, Ashes To-Go, and so many more. It brings everyone so much closer together helping the community and to them it's a great feeling. Also, at the church they attended before Calvary they were both youth leaders for the children of the church. When they entered Calvary they both got the opportunity to once again help out the youth in our church community. Lastly, one of the biggest reasons they continued to come to Calvary was the love from Father Castle. They said when they started coming he was the most welcoming man and always made every Sunday something to look forward to, whether it was during the service or just in the Parish Hall drinking coffee after mass.

- *What behaviors do you always notice throughout the congregation?*

Tom and Jennifer said they notice many behaviors throughout the congregation. Not on an average Sunday but over the years. As a congregation, we are always there for someone in need. The minute someone asks for help, solutions and prayers are what Calvary does to give help to the person in need. They also notice how we are a community based congregation. We all do a lot of out-of-church projects as a community, and almost everyone is always willing to attend or give their share to the project. Our congregation also loves their food activities. Whether it is a dinner in the Parish Hall, or we all go out to eat after a good day helping the community. And I mean hey, everyone likes food so it's a great bonus after helping as a community!

- *What does excellent worship mean to you?*

When one thinks of the word "excellent worship" it may take some time to come up with a well thought out answer. When I asked the Ceplecha family what this meant to them, they had some definite answers. Excellent worship to them was this: to have an **engaging service** with people laughing, crying and even making a small comment here and there. Having a youth Sunday every month is a huge part of

excellent worship as are the readings, Prayers of the People and the ushers. The really enjoy **the beautiful music** that is played every Sunday and the wonderful feeling of **comfortable energy** during the service. The message from the sermon also is a huge take away from every service that they attend.

- *What makes the worship service worth going for you?*

For the Ceplecha family, Sunday service is described as a "re-charge for the long week ahead." It also brings relief from the week before. They also talked about how through each service there is always something talked about that gives them something to think about even long after the service is over. The best part of the service to them is giving back as a family in the church anyway they can.

- *When you think of the word "worship" what comes to mind?*

When the Ceplecha's took the time to think about this great word, their answer could not have been more perfect. When they think of worship, they see someone who is praising God on a Sunday with their Church family. They know that worship means passion for God and sharing that with others is very important.

- *Is there anything you would like to change at Calvary?*

Both Tom, Jennifer and their three kids (Pheobe, Mason and Luke) all love attending a Sunday service at Calvary every week. They did have some suggestions about changes that they would be on board with. What they suggested was that instead of just once a month that maybe we combine the 8 o'clock service and the 10:15 o'clock to one big service, maybe at 9:30am. They described that they love seeing people they haven't seen in such a long time, and maybe that would bring them back to Calvary on a more regular basis. Another suggestion was maybe we have some services on either Saturday nights or maybe a Sunday night mass here and there. Just a couple of different suggestions for those who can't make it all the time on Sunday at one of the two services. Above all else though, they love Calvary. This is where they live their spiritual lives and nothing can change that.

The Rev. Jackie Lynn is a close friend of Mother Mo and she is looking forward to serving at Calvary various Sundays. Jackie is passionate about the teachings of Jesus and the baptismal covenant 'to strive for peace and justice among all people'. ## VESTRY

### **Vestry Meeting Minutes April 19<sup>th</sup> 2017**

**Present:** Hester Bury (Warden), Maureen O'Connor (Priest-in-charge), Don Bradley, Joe Augustine, Carla Castle, Emily Prasad, John Jaska, Greg Armstrong (Guest)

**Absent:** Audrey Schuurmann (Warden), Lisa Pardue (Treasurer), Ken Pardue, Tom Cepelcha, Schuyler Roberts

1. Opening Prayer with reflections on "Just As I Am" and how we are all acceptable in God's eyes despite our faults. Discussion on how we can make everyone welcome and see everyone as God does.
2. The meeting was called to order at 6:50 p.m.
3. The minutes from March 15<sup>th</sup> 2017 were approved.

4. Greg Armstrong from Renew was introduced and gave an introduction to his ministry and mission to be in relationship with other churches. He currently leads a team of 20 – 25 people who are looking to start a church plant somewhere in the DuPage area. They gather at a variety of locations such as coffee shops, houses, parks, to worship and plan for their ministry. They are considering a more permanent location to meet weekly on Fridays so that people who are interested know where to find them, and they may be interested in using our fellowship hall. We asked Greg to keep us updated on their plans and let us know when they might want to start using the space regularly.

After Greg left the Vestry had some discussion about how we could welcome them. Some people were concerned about giving access to the building to new groups and not always knowing who is using the space; others felt we should be more hospitable to a variety of groups that would be interested in using our space. Mo reported that she is exploring other ways of working with First Church and First United Methodist. With regard to Renew, Hester will follow up to thank Greg for coming, invite him and any of his team to our June 4<sup>th</sup> picnic and ask him to come back with a proposal for using our space or other suggestions of ways we can work together.

5. Hester presented the Treasurer's report on behalf of Ken which was accepted. Revenue is still showing as above budget because some members have already paid their annual pledge in full.
6. Hester presented the Search Committee report on behalf of Lisa. The Search committee met again with Andrea Mysen on April 10<sup>th</sup>, to go over some communication techniques and dive into summarizing the CAT Survey so that they can effectively present the results to the congregation on Sunday April 30<sup>th</sup>. They are

meeting again on Wednesday, 4/19 to finish their work with the CAT survey.

## 7. Ministry Reports

- a. **Buildings and Grounds:** Roof repair: The roof will be repaired April 20/21. Joe put gas in the riding mower and commented that it is aging. Ron replaced the security light by the garage. Mo is having someone clean the paint off the carpet at no cost to church.
- b. **Events:** We had some discussion about hospitality which ranked low on our CAT survey and how we can improve. For the June 4<sup>th</sup> Mass in the Grass and picnic John Jaska will coordinate food. We will make sure notices are put in the bulletin and people can contact Don if they want to help.
- c. **Finance: Hester presented the Finance report on behalf of Ken.** We changed signers for the various accounts on 4/15/17. Signers for the Operating Account are Lisa Pardue, Audrey Schuurmann and Grant Iannelli. Signers for the Discretionary Account are Audrey Schuurmann and John Jaska.
- d. **Formation:** Emily asked for feedback on the Lent in a Bag kits. If the feedback is positive she suggested we could do something similar for children to take home on summer Sundays. She also suggested as we do not have enough children for a VBS that we make sure children know about other VBS opportunities in the area. She also suggested we could open Tot Town for an hour occasionally during the summer. The Book Group reading Anne LaMott's "Hallelujah Anyway" will start meeting in April on the last Thursday of the month at 7:30 pm. We will

meet at The Corner House for the first meeting and other downtown locations for following meetings. We may also look at other formation opportunities at non-traditional times. The last day of Church School will be May 7<sup>th</sup>. Emily mentioned that we will need more volunteers for Tot Town when it re-opens in the Fall.

- e. **Outreach:** We have raised \$7,067 for the Lenten Project. John reported that we will do PADS in April and May but will then be closed June, July and August. Helping Hands volunteers have helped Eileen Elliott and Nancy Magurno in the past month. We will ask Jennifer to make sure volunteers are thanked in bulletin and announcements. Four Calvary members have volunteered to help at the Lombard/Villa Park Food Pantry and are being trained.
- f. **Stewardship:** Carla reported that they will be using impact statements to tell people how their gifts make a difference. In the summer the committee will write "Your Pledge Impacts" statements.
- g. **Welcome:** No report.
- h. **Youth:** No report
- i. **Worship:** Mo reminded everyone of the "All-in" service on April 30<sup>th</sup>, which will be followed by the Search Committee update on the CAT survey. It was suggested that we hand out comment cards for people to give their feedback on the "All-in" services. John and Mo will organize. We will discuss comments at the May 6<sup>th</sup> summer planning session. It was also suggested that we have a "suggested donation of \$5" for the breakfast. This coming Sunday April 23<sup>rd</sup> we will have two Baptisms and four children presented for

Communion. Hannah Dakis will add a question to her interviews: “What Makes Great Worship?”

8. Other Business: Hester said that she and Audrey and Mo had drafted a rental agreement for outside groups wishing to use the Fellowship Hall. In the interest of time it will be emailed to Vestry for review and discussed at next meeting. Prairie Food Coop will be using the space on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. Mo asked about the need for a liability/indemnity waiver for parents to sign at Tot Town. We will re-visit this before the Fall session. We will discuss Event planning at the May 6<sup>th</sup> summer planning meeting. Emily suggested we should give better explanations of upcoming meetings that we are opening to the congregation, so they really know what to expect and what will be discussed.

Mo reported that Jackie Lynn will start as our Guest Deacon this Sunday April 23<sup>rd</sup>. We asked Mo to invite her to the next Vestry meeting.

There was a comment that we needed better communication of who is responsible for different tasks at the church for Lily in the office.

9. Thank yous: Thank you to Ron Seger for fixing the light, Audrey for planting flowers, Marianna Holm for the Easter flowers, Jan Bruesch for the Easter balloons, Mike O’Connor for helping move the font and Mo for all she does.

The meeting was adjourned at 9 p.m. with the closing prayer.
