

Jewelry Pouch

- 2 - 11" circles (one of primary fabric, one for lining)
- 2 - 7" circles (one of primary fabric, one for lining)
- 2 - 12" x 1" pieces of primary fabric on bias
- 2 - 45" (2 1/2 yards) pieces of narrow cording or 1/4" ribbon

NOTE: If you alternate the use of fabric for primary and lining, you can get 4 pouches from two fat quarters

With 11" circles wrong sides together, stitch around edge with over-lock machine.
With 7" circles wrong sides together, stitch around edge with over-lock machine
Lay the 7" finished piece right side up in the center of the 11" finished piece wrong side up.

Stitch across the 7" piece from side to side 4 times, forming 8 pie shaped pockets.

Turn under one end of each 12" x 1" piece 1/2" and press.

Then fold the pieces in half lengthwise and press.

Unfold the pieces and fold the sides in to touch the pressed line. Press.

Top stitch each piece close to the folded 1/2" edge.

Pin one of these pieces to the right side of the 11" circle just outside of the pocket area starting at one of the pocket separating seams.

Fold under and trim the end of the piece at the pocket separating seam after the 4th pocket. (half way around) Top stitch the end.

Repeat with the second piece.

Stitch these pieces in place along both long sides.

Thread cord or ribbon through both pieces. One cord or ribbon from each side. Knot the ends so that they will not put out.

Pull on both knotted ends to close jewelry pouch.

Good job!

These directions can be altered, if an over-lock machine is not available. Cut the circles all 1/2" larger. Put the right sides of 11 1/2" circles together and stitch around leaving 2" unstitched for turning. Turn right side out and stitch opening closed. Repeat for 7 1/2" circles. Follow directions from step 3.
