2018 SPRING SHOWER OF QUILTS GUIDELINES FOR QUILT SHOW ENTRIES

You must be a member of the Connecticut Piecemakers Guild as of October 15, 2015 to enter an item in this show. Junior entrants do not need to be members.

The registration deadline is February 12, 2016. Each entry must include a registration form, fee and color photo of the item being entered. Make checks out to CT Piecemakers Quilt Guild.

If your item is to be judged, it must be dropped by a date and at a location to be determined. Listen at meetings and watch the newsletter for information regarding judged quilts.

Quilts that are to be hung but not judged are to be handed in at the Wyndham Hotel on Friday, April 13 between 3:30pm and 6:00pm ONLY.

If you are dropping off your item but someone else will be picking it up, you have to sign a permission form when you drop it off. Those forms will be available at drop off.

All Quilts MUST have a 3-4 inch HANGING SLEEVE SEWN on. If you bring your quilt for judging or to the hotel without a sleeve, it will not be accepted. For detailed information on how to make a sleeve, ask one of our friendly committee members or do a Google search and watch a YouTube video.

You can pick up your items at the Wyndham Hotel on Sunday, April 15 between 5-6 pm only. Identification will be required and you must sign a card to say that you received your item(s). If you are picking up for someone else, that person must have already signed a permission form for you to do so. Any items not picked up by 6:30pm will be stored at owner's expense and risk.

Your items are insured once they are in the possession of the guild. The value of a quilt is determined using the measurement of its longest edge. If the longest edge is:

Less than 40" the quilt will be insured for \$300

40" - 59" the quilt will be insured for \$400

60" - 69" the quilt will be insured for \$500

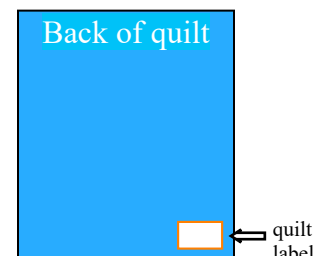
Equal to or greater than 70" the quilt will be insured for \$600

If your quilt has been appraised for a higher dollar amount, the guild will insure it for the appraised value. However, you must include a copy of the appraisal with this registration form.

All items (quilts and others) MUST have this identification label FIRMLY SEWN on. For a quilt, sew it to the back in the bottom right corner (as you look at the back of the quilt). For other items, you choose the place but make sure it is obvious to the committee.

DEFINITIONS OF CATEGORIES

Large quilts are generally bed-sized quilts. Perimeters (the sum of all 4 sides) are equal to or greater than 250 inches (62.5” per side).

Small quilts have perimeters less than 250 inches. This might include wall hangings, bed runners and table runners.

Pieced quilts are predominantly (at least 50%) pieced or patchwork. May be an original design or use a commercial pattern.

Applique quilts are predominantly (at least 50%) applique. This may include needle turn, raw edge or fusible. May be an original design or use a commercial pattern.

Mixed Technique quilts use both piecing and applique in about the same proportion. May be an original design or use a commercial pattern.

Embroidered quilts may be done by hand or machine and include red (or any other color) work as well as computer assisted embroidery. All sizes.

Pictorial quilts illustrate recognizable images such as people, wildlife, landscapes or cityscapes. May be an original design or use a commercial pattern. Includes all techniques and all sizes.

Abstract quilts are original designs and use materials in a non-traditional way. Published patterns should not be used. All sizes.

Wearables and Accessories are intended to be worn or used for personal use. Includes all techniques and must be quilted. May include (but are not limited to) jackets, tote bags, hats, shawls, capes, dresses, scarves, vests, tops and pants.

Miniature quilts have a perimeter less than 96 inches. A miniature quilt represents a full-sized quilt but is scaled down. In a photo, a mini will be indistinguishable from the large quilt it represents.

Challenge Quilts are made for CPQG 2017 challenge and must comply with the rules of the challenge.

Potpourri is for any entry that does not fit the above categories. These might include (but are not limited to) crazy quilts, cathedral windows, cross stitch, yo-yo’s, crayon art, stenciling or whole cloth quilts. All sizes.

Junior Quilt is made by entrant 17 years of age or younger, sponsored by a CPQG member. Must be primarily the work of the entrant but adult assistance is acceptable. Any technique and all sizes.

Kit Quilts are those made when a pattern and fabric is pre-selected and packaged as a unit for sale, when the design and fabric choices are made by other than the maker. Includes BOM patterns from local or online shops, when fabric is supplied with the pattern. Includes individually packaged blocks that are later combined into one quilt. Includes panels. All techniques and any size.

Disclaimers:

- The registration committee reserves the right to change the category of your entry to meet the needs of the show.
- The hanging committee has the right to edit your description to fit the placard.
- Judges are not obligated to award any or all ribbons in any category.
- Any quilt larger than 96" square will be hung at the discretion of the hanging committee.
- If you submit more than one entry, they may not all be accepted. The committees will do their best to communicate with you as to which items are your priority. If we have more than we need, a waiting list will be started. Items are accepted on a first come, first served system.
