You missed a pleasant outing if you did not attend the CLD Club Tour of the Currier & Ives Exhibit at the Abraham Lincoln Library on Friday, July 16th. Armed with her Currier and Ives books, Rita Bass led us through two hours of good conversation and learning about the trotting horse world of the most popular print making company the U.S. has ever seen. Your newsletter editor, Kelley Clausing, joined us from her day job at the Library and added much history about 19th century America to our walk through the Gallery. Also attending were Deb Porter, Anne Scrivner, and Deanna Mayberry who enjoyed a Dutch treat lunch at Bennigan's.

I am closing with some comments from participants of the Melanie Michalak subsidized CLD youth clinic held at Pratense Farm on July 11th:

From Jayme Geisler and Knight Hawk:

I learned to open my fingers to make the horse go forward. I like how Melanie Michalak relates to you and the horse. I also learned to half halt to go around corners, and to hold my core and ribcage up when I ride. I would drop Knight Hawk's head to ask him to canter, Melanie taught me to hold the reins and push him into the canter and forward and down into the walk.

From Hailey Phillips and Banditaa:

I learned that the reason why I always get tense in the ring is because I get nervous. Melanie Michalak taught me to take deep breaths. When I take deep breaths I become more relaxed and so does my horse. Her ears will go forward which means she is listening to me. Before Melanie taught me to relax and take deep breaths I would tense up in my core and thighs and her ears would go straight back which means she would get nervous with me. I learned how to feel that I can get my canters right away with out pushing and getting tense. Melanie told me that I can do a breathing technique. First you hold your index finger to your mouth and breathe in for 3 seconds then blow out for 10 seconds. You can then increase the amount of seconds once you get better breath. Melanie has taught me a lot because before I would get nervous and tighten up then my horse would get angry with me and then I would totally loose my ability to trot.

Fnd from Marilyn Weber, their instructor who filled a last minute opening, and Shenanigans Too:

I learned to ride Shenanigans a bit more forward at the walk. She also had me 2 point on my trot circles to increase his stretch. We did some small diagonal lengthening having me open my fingers more often. He also needs more half halts when he gets too low in the poll. We also challenged him a bit by riding 1st one and two being generous on the circle sizes and not worrying much about the lengthening.

And from Mary Godart, mother of participants Megan and Madison:

Both of the girls had an enjoyable time at the clinic yesterday.

Megan said that she worked on training test 2 and picking up the canter with Beau. She also learned about breathing exercises from watching and listening to Melanie coach a rider before her.

Madison said that her very first clinic was fun. She worked on Intro A and her form during walking and trotting. She thought the best part waslunch!

Jordan Meadows, Auburn

Jordan Meadows of Auburn is a long-time member of CenterLine Dressage. The daughter of Bill and Marie Meadows, Jordan began her dressage training at StarWest in the summer of 2000 when she was thirteen years old, and continues as a student currently. She graduated with a BS in Biology Exercise Science from Illinois College in 2009, and is currently enrolled at St. John's School of Nursing in Springfield.

Jordan has earned both her USDF bronze and silver medals. She and Lucero earned the first-alternate position on Region 2's medal-winning NAYRC teams in 2006 and 2007, and won several Regional championships and reserve championships as well.



Jordan's current horse is Avenger JP, a five-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding. In 2009, Jordan and "Alfie" finished third at Training Level (AA) at the Region 4 Championships, and also placed third in the KWPN All-Breeds Training Level AA division, in which Alfie was the only 4-year-old to place. USDF ANNOUNCES NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM PROGRAM

The United States Dressage Federation is pleased to welcome featured presenters Gary Rockwell and Lilo Fore to the 2010 Adequan/USDF National Symposium. The symposium will take place December 4-5, 2010 at the Jacksonville Equestrian Center in Jacksonville, FL. The theme for this year's symposium will be "Cross the Bridge from Training to Showing" and will focus on learning to ride the new 2011 USEF Dressage tests with the featured presenters.

Lilo Fore is an FEI "I" Judge and began her judging career in 1974. In addition to judging, she owns a successful dressage training facility located in Santa Rosa, CA, and helped to develop the USDF Instructor Certification Program. Lilo's students have gone on to become successful professionals and horses bred by her have earned Grand Champion and Champion awards in breed shows in both the US and Canada. Throughout her career, Lilo has remained involved in many educational projects including hosting clinics all over the US and South America.

As a member of the United States Equestrian Team, Gary Rockwell represented the US in

competition throughout Europe. He and his Danish mare "Suna" won a Team Silver medal at CHIO Rotterdam in 1993 and a Team Bronze at the 1994 World Championships at The Hague, Netherlands. As a USEF judge for more than 25 years, he officiated at many regional finals and national championships. As an FEI judge, he officiated at North American Young Rider Championships, FEI Challenge Tours, World Cup Finals, European Championships, and the 2008 Olympic Games. Gary currently lives in Wellington, FL and travels to teach, train and judge.

"USDF is excited to have Lilo and Gary on board for our Symposium. Together, they will bring a wealth of knowledge, both from the judges' and instructors' perspective, as they help our members understand the new tests," stated Katherine Robertson, Senior Coordinator of Education Programs.

MINUTES OF THE CLD BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING, JULY 18, 2010

CenterLine Dressage Board Meeting
July 18, 2010
StarWest

Members present:

Alice Martin, Paula Briney, Brigitte Franzen, Marie Meadows, Janet Fitch, Pinky Noll, Marilyn Weber, Anne Scrivner, John Simpson, and Nancy Simpson. Brenda Coss attended. Elena Voigt joined via telephone for a portion of the meeting.

Meeting was called to order at 2:05 pm by President Alice Martin.

Reports of Officers:

Treasurer: Marie Meadows reported that the Audit is finished and that the bill of \$650.00 is due. The balance in the checkbook is currently low due to expenses related to the Classic I & II shows. IceBreaker and FireCracker shows made money. The subsidized Michalak clinics did not. FireCracker drew entries from Bloomington, Peoria, Quincy, and Belleville. The Col. Carde clinic basically broke even. Show secretaries should forward checks to Marie as they come in rather than wait until the show occurs. Marie has been going back through several years of bank statements to learn if an error occurred. She may have the answer by the next meeting. The complete Treasurer's Report is reported in the CLD Newsletter.

Membership: Pinky Noll reported on new members, for a total count of 104. Two people planned to pay their membership dues at FireCracker but due to illness could not attend. When they send in their CLD membership, CLD will refund the non-member show fee they paid when sending in their entries.

Newsletter Editor: Kelley Clausing was absent. Statistics on the electronic newsletter were submitted via email.

Webmaster: Martin Kuhn was not present.

Awards: Marilyn Weber asked if it is possible to sign up for year-end club awards online. Discussion followed about the online information, and whether the form could be posted so that it can be actually filled in online, rather than printed first and then completed. Marilyn is working on matching her list of registrants with Martin's list. Marilyn suggested that the list of Lifetime-registered horses be put in the newsletter, with a request for members to let her know if a horse is deceased or no longer owned by the CLD member. We agreed.

Scholarship: Janet Fitch reported that one application had been received for the Cheryl Finke scholarship. She will send an article on the Academic Scholarship to the Newsletter editor.

Symposium: Alice reported for Kate Fleming-Kuhn who was not present. Kate asked the Board to set the audit fee for the sessions at Education Day. The Board agreed to keep them the same as at the Col. Carde clinic: \$10/day or three days for \$25. There will be a lunch on Friday and Sunday. A location for the Education Day clinic has not yet been finalized. We discussed various stables but no agreement was reached at the meeting. After the meeting, discussion continued via email. The consensus is that the location should be in the Springfield area because the Annual Awards Banquet, the Saturday evening dinner, is in Springfield. It would not make sense to have a long drive between the two locations. Cindy Ishoy is the speaker and clinician. She will give a talk on the WEG for the keynote speech at the Awards Banquet.

Grassroots: Kelly Griffith was not present but submitted an electronic report. The David Blake Clinic will be Nov. 27, 2010. Kelly received a request from Andrea Blake asking CLD to pay one half (\$250.00) of David's airfare. After discussion, Paula Briney moved, and Janet Fitch seconded, a motion to decline paying for one half of David Blake's airfare. The motion passed unanimously.

Jr/YR: Jordan Meadows was not present.

Classic: John Simpson reported that all necessary details are in place except for the janitorial service. Paula Briney will deliver the ring to the fairgrounds on Thursday Aug. 26. Brigitte Franzen asked if she could distribute pamphlets related to her business. The Board agreed. Brigitte will try to find her own table.

Inter-Club Liaison: Leslie Burket reported electronically prior to the meeting. She has sent a second round of letters to Indiana Dressage Society, Lincoln Trails Dressage Inc., Michiana Dressage Club, The Dressage Company, and Wisconsin D & CT. She has received one reply, from Ken Levy, Region 2 Director.

Youth Events: Marilyn and Paula reported on the success of the Melanie Michalak clinic. Discussion followed on the best way to keep young people involved. There is some feeling that the club may not be able to continue to subsidize such events as much as during 2011. We will consider less-costly clinicians, asking our 'older' YR riders to volunteer to do a clinic, sponsor a group outing such as the Secretariat movie. No final decisions were made.

Charities: nothing new to report. Marie reported and passed around a thank you note from Emily Wagner (for our donation of \$2,000 to the Developing Young Horse Championships in Germany). A thank you was also received from Ken Levy, thanking us for the \$200.00 donation to the Region 2 Jr/YR Team. The discussion and motion and vote to send the \$200.00 was conducted via email July 6, 2010.

Sponsorships: Nancy Simpson reported she had received an additional \$70.00 in sponsorships, and would shortly receive \$500.00 from Susan Edwards. An anonymous donor contacted Alice Martin about adding \$100.00 (which would bring the award to \$200.00) to the high point horse from each level. Riders must show BOTH days to be eligible for this award. The same donor would also like to give an award to high scoring horse of a non-traditional dressage breed, ie. not a warmblood. We discussed what our definition of "Non-Warmblood" would mean. It was suggested that each rider wishing to participate in the Non Warmblood award must declare at the beginning

of the show, to the show secretary, the breed their horse is to be considered for purposes of the CLD Classic Show I & II. We also discussed the best way to acknowledge the donated items from companies. Most likely we will display banners or signage.

Anniversary: Nothing new to report.

Librarian: Brigitte Franzen has completed her work on the video to DVD conversion. Any of us who own tapes and wish them converted to be shared with other club members are encouraged to bring them to her.

Banquet: Paula Briney, nothing new to report.

Alice commented that the visit to the Abraham Presidential Library to see the Harness Racing/ Currier & Ives Exhibit was informative and congenial. The group of six was led by Rita Bass and enjoyed lunch together afterwards at Bennigan's.

New Business:

Alice asked if we wanted to bring back the Bridle Number Fee as a way to raise some extra money. Money might be used to offset the cost of youth events. The fee would be \$2.00. Paula moved and Janet seconded a motion to do so. Motion passed unanimously. A second suggestion was to place a 'donation jar' in the horse show office, with a note about our youth programs.

Next Meeting: Sat. Aug. 14, 2:00 p.m. at StarWest.

Both IceBreaker and FireCracker made money!!

IceBreaker :

Income - \$877.00

Expenses - \$471.06

Profit - \$405.94

FireCracker:

Income - \$700.00

Expenses - \$480.11

Profit - \$219.89

We have received \$300 for ring rentals; Arabian Show in June \$100 and ABU coming up in September

Both Melanie Michalak clinics lost money. The cost for the April clinic was \$596; income was \$270. July clinic cost was \$596; income was \$300.

Col. Christian Carde clinic broke even costing a little over \$4505. Next clinic CLD will have a better tracking system for meals and auditing for the money trail. Needless to say we did refund the \$750.00 back to USDF but with all the folks coming and going it was difficult to determine if we collected from everyone all the fees for meals and auditing.

CLD made two generous donations to two worthy causes; \$2000 to Emily Wagner and Wakeup to help allay cost for their trip to Germany for the 2010 FEI World Breeding Championships which will be held in Verden, Germany and \$200 to Region 2 JR/YR program.

Classic expenses and income have slowly trickled in. Both judges airfares have been reimbursed (\$998.59). I just received the first batch of checks for entries (\$3195) which will be deposited on Tuesday, August 3rd. I am currently awaiting \$14,888 (per Jeanne Craver). She has noted that a lot of entries she has received are riders from MO and KS; hopefully there will be a few more straggler checks to enter.

Taxes were done by KEB and cost \$650 with assets a little of \$33,000 (checking account and three money markets). Currently we have \$24,881.07 in our money markets and the checking account has \$1915.43 plus the \$3195 that will be deposited tomorrow which will bring it to \$5110.43. When our accountant and I met we reviewed bank statements and there was a discrepancy. I have been monitoring the checking account and have found an error in our favor. I want a couple of more statements to review and will then add to our bottom line in the checking account. I hope by the time we have the September statement the discrepancy will continue and then I will report the amount to the club.

Other than a few payments to our insurance company for CLD functions and USDF (membership fees) we are looking pretty healthy. For a while a lot of money was going out and very little coming in so with Classic around the corner and the size of the show we anticipate making a little money. Time will tell!!

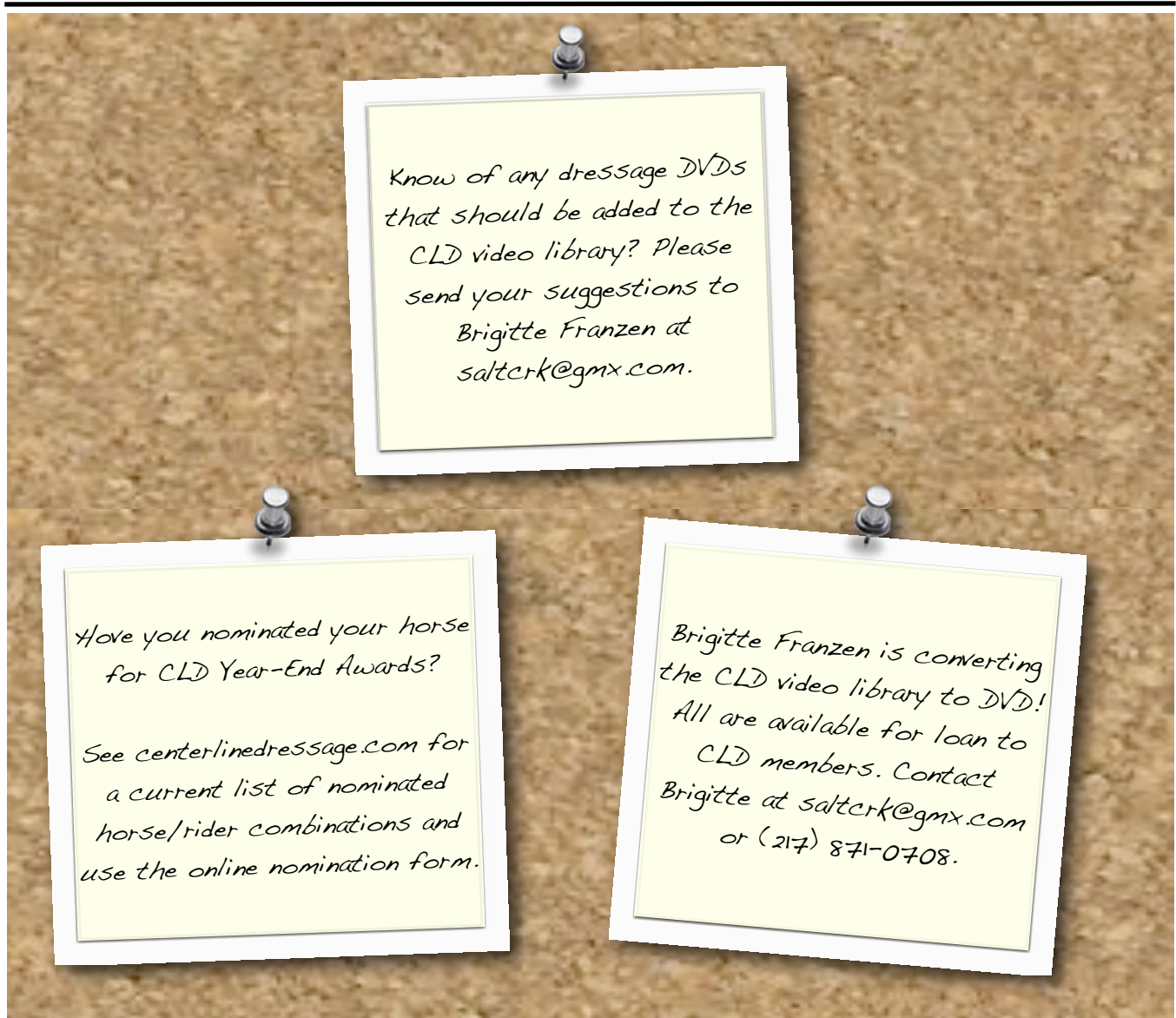
