## MINUTES OF THE APRIL 22, 2007 MEETING OF CLD

Attending: Tracey Walker, Paula Briney, Alice Martin, Kate Fleming-Kuhn, Pinky Noll, Janet Fitch, and Elena Voigt by telephone.

The meeting was called to order by President Tracey Walker at 4:30 p.m.

The minutes of the last meeting were waived in the interest of saving time. Secretary Janet Fitch will email them to board members and recommendations can be made as necessary.

### Old Business

#### *Horse Fair*

Pinky Noll reported that she wrote to Horse Fair to the effect that people are interested in dressage at Horse Fair as shown by the numbers of signatures we collected from people at the Fair. Paula said that the letter and petition was presented at the retreat for the Illinois Horse Council, but we don't know how the board will come down on the issue.

One of the things CLD suggested was that we have ½ day clinics instead of our traditional full day and that Horse Fair pay the clinician's fees. Horse Fair wants the use of the building that we have used for our clinics for the past few years. However, CLD has always paid for the clinician's fees through rider fees from those taking part in the clinics, something that wouldn't be possible with half-day clinics.

Lilo Fore has committed to the weekend of Horse Fair in 2008, and a clinic will be held either at Horse Fair or another local venue. It was suggested that we might talk with Arab Inc. to see if they would be willing to partner with us for the clinic. Another idea was to run the Lilo Fore clinic at another venue with an auditor's fee (member's getting a discount).

#### *2007 Ice Breaker*

It was reported that the show was coming together and that as of 4/22/07, Marie had 54 rides reserved with no tests over Fourth Level Test 3. Ribbons and tests are in and ready to go.

Paula announced that the fee schedule for rental of the CLD portable dressage arena would keep the current fee schedule.

**New Business***Classic Sponsorships and Advertising Rates*

Pinky Noll reported that she wrote to Horse Fair to the effect that people are interested in dressage at Horse Fair as shown by the numbers of signatures we collected from people at the Fair. Paula said that the letter and petition was presented at the retreat for the Illinois Horse Council, but we don't know how the board will come down on the issue. Tracey announced that we had already received two offers of corporate sponsorship, four business card ads, and 9 class sponsorships for this year's classic plus a \$100 donation.

This led to a discussion of rates for sponsorships and advertising for the classic along with ideas for getting more sponsorships.

We also discussed special anniversary awards for this year's Classic. Up to nine \$100 prizes will be awarded to the horse and rider combination entered in both shows who has the highest average of the best two tests at the level. At least one of the tests below FEI must be from the highest two tests of the level.

Kate Fleming-Kuhn moved that the rates for class sponsor be lowered from the current \$35 to \$20, that business card ads be \$35. She also suggested a championship sponsorship that would include advertising. Paula Briney seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Kate Fleming-Kuhn reported that memberships are down and that she hoped that Ice Breaker would bring in some more memberships. This led to a general discussion of membership issues. Another membership form will be included in the next Reader. The board agreed that giving an actual membership card to members would be a start. Discussion also included possible new member incentives for joining by a certain date and incentives for renewals as well, perhaps for the awards banquet. It was also discussed that we needed some reason for people to join including possible non-member fee for CLD events.

As one such event, Alice mentioned that Janice Dulack had said that she would be willing to present a Pilates clinic on and off the horse with a dressage clinician. All of these issues will be considered in future meetings.

Pinky raised the issue of the price structure for advertisements in the Reader. As both Pinky and Martin Kuhn had to leave the meeting early, discussion was tabled until the next board meeting.

The next meeting will be June 17 at StarWest.

Kate Fleming-Kuhn moved the adjournment of the meeting at around 5:30.

## EQUINE PROMOTION BOARD ANNOUNCES \$48,000 IN GRANTS

Springfield, IL – Awarding of more than \$48,000 in grants has been announced by the Illinois Equine Industry Research and Promotion Board, according to Lois A. Guyon, chair. Awards were presented earlier this month at the Illinois Horse Fair.

Grants are funded by the Illinois equine checkoff program which provides for the voluntary assessment of a nickel per 50-pound bag of horse feed sold at retail.

Coon Creek Ridge Riders, Cisne, IL, received \$12,500 for new metal stalls for their Summer Horse Camp as well as construction of handicapped accessible bathrooms. The majority of construction will be done by volunteers from the CCRR club and 4-H youth. The improvements will serve 1,100 youth and adults participating in equine events at the club each year. Between 250 and 300 horses will benefit from the stall improvements annually. The club currently provides volunteer programs to 180 developmentally disabled individuals from 11 group homes at their facility.

Southern Illinois University's Department of Animal Science received \$8,600 to study how Omega-3 fatty acids may reduce stress in horses. The project is under the direction of Sheryl S. King, Ph.D, PAS (director of SIU's four-year equine science program) and Karen L. Jones, Ph.D. The hypothesis is that supplementation of omega 3 fatty acids, specifically EPA and DHA, will blunt or eliminate the stress reaction in horses. The research objective is to measure physiological indicators of stress in horses on a typical diet and compare it to their reaction to the same stressor following a period of omega 3 fatty acid supplementation.

Rock Island Country Fairgrounds received \$8,484 for renovations and drainage improvements to its 190' x 90' arena. The facility is home to 4-H and other riding clubs for practice and shows throughout the season.



Several major shows had to be postponed in 2006 because of unsafe ring conditions.

Menard County Fairgrounds received \$7,750 toward creation of a lighted and fenced 300' x 150' show arena. The fairgrounds board has agreed to donate all labor and equipment required to prepare the site and build the arena.

Fox Valley Saddle Association, Hampshire, IL, received \$3,598 to help fund audiovisual and public address equipment to accommodate media used by today's expert lecture circuit, enhancing educational experiences at the facility. The association is an equestrian club with more than 300 members active year 'round. The group hosts more than 80 events a year and opens its grounds to 35 other events.

California Polytechnic University received \$5,250 to research the concentration of sperm surface proteins and their effects of oocyte binding as it relates to fertility estimation. As a result, stallion fertility may be predictable by quantitative measurements of HSP-7 concentration on the spermatozoa plasma membrane. Breeding records of each of the stallions in the study will be used to develop a fertility quotient in conjunction with the molecular data developed.

Kane County Mounted Rangers received \$2,844 for communication and emergency equipment. The group serves as a volunteer arm of the Kane County Forest Preserve Police, assisting in security and liaison activities, patrolling otherwise inaccessible areas. The equipment will assist in providing first responder care to individuals until health/emergency care arrives.

Mounted Angels Therapeutic Horsemanship, Pittsfield, IL, received \$2,105 for certified instructor training for disabled riders. The Angels provide free horsemanship lessons to disabled children.

By law, EPB funds must go to support equine research, education and promotion in keeping with the enabling legislation's core purpose: "Enhancement of the Illinois equine industry through self-funded programs, projects and activities. Grants to institutions and individuals will be related to equine research, education and industry enhancements and promotion."

Illinois has more than 77,000 horse owners and 213,000 horses, constituting a \$3.8 billion industry and providing more than 15,000 fulltime jobs.

Any group, individual, company or institution may apply for funding. Preference will be given to projects benefiting the largest number of people/horses.
