EXPLORE WHAT THE DRESSAGE FOUNDATION HAS TO OFFER

The mission of The Dressage Foundation (TDF) is to “cultivate and provide financial support for the advancement of dressage.” In other words, they give away money! Because they have a lower profile than USDF, followers of, and participants in, the sport of dressage can easily forget about investigating the Foundation's services. (www.dressagefoundation.org)

As you scan through this newsletter you may notice a theme, The Dressage Foundation. I am relatively new to CLD, I have only been a member for a few years now, and even more recently have I been active in the club, so this month when Alice Martin submitted an invitation for the newsletter to apply for educational funding and to enter the drawing for the County Perfection Saddle, I realized I don't even know what The Dressage Foundation (TDF) is, and if I don't, there are probably others that don't either. So after a visit to their website www.dressagefoundation.org, and many emails to Alice Martin, our IL rep for TDF, I now know a little more about this organization, and I am impressed. Our club and its members have benefited from TDF grants on many levels.

According to Alice Martin, CLD first applied for a Vi Hopkins grant to host Col. Christian Carde of the Samur for the first time. His plane ticket and five day clinic was a big financial risk and TDF gave us the backup to take it on. They did the same \$2000 grant when we turned another clinic into a USDF University Symposium. (Happily we were able to return their money to them, but it gave us courage to get the wheels rolling.) Then we had them handle the money for the Cheryl Finke Developing Rider Fund.

Don't forget about The Dressage Foundation when you are looking for scholarship or grant funding, and don't forget about them when you are considering a worthy organization to which you may donate funding.

Having TDF manage the account was a win/win solution. They rec'd interest on our money. Our donors' gifts were tax deductible and TDF did all the record keeping and thank you's. Grantees were Paula Briney(x2), Brenda Zeitler, Nancy Spear, Chrissie Simpson, and David Blake.

There are so many opportunities for clubs and club members to take advantage of, whether you are an adult amateur, young rider, instructor, breeder, or show/clinic management. Page 5 is full listing just some of the opportunities available. Each program heading is a link that will take you directly to the page on the Foundation's website.

Did You Know?

- Since being formed in 1989, TDF has given away more than \$1 million in grants and scholarships
- 23 different funds are available for instructors, judges, breeders, young riders, adult amateurs, professionals, clinics on a variety of topics, and two \$25,000.00 grants
- The foundation has the Century Club for riders and horses whose combined ages total 100 or more years. [CLD's own (and the only one from Illinois) Chick Chapin is in the Club on six different mounts! see page 6]
- You can sign up for their free online newsletter
- The representative for Illinois is Alice Martin.
- Our show, Classic, sponsors a class each year for the benefit of The Foundation. (We have done so each year since the program began in 1999).
- Two CLD members are currently on their website: Martin Kuhn and Brenda Zeitler.
- There are three different Memory Books - - to honor both people and favorite mounts.

- **The Carol Lavell Gifted Memorial Fund (AA)**
Seeded with donations received in special remembrance of Carol's great Dressage horse, Gifted. Many other friends of The Dressage Foundation have added donations and the Scholarship Fund has grown steadily over the years. This Scholarship enables Adult Amateurs to set aside quality-time, in concentrated training away from the daily pressures of job and family, with a horse the recipient owns or formally leases.
- **The Heldenberg Training Center Fund in Memory of E.L. Dreitzler (AA,YR)**
This fund provides financial assistance to North American, non-professional riders to attend the Spanish Riding School's Training Center in Heldenberg.
- **The Michael Poulin Dressage Fund (AA, YR, Clubs and Clinic management)**
Established at The Dressage Foundation by friends and supporters of Olympian Michael Poulin, the purpose of this Fund is to provide funding support for programs and projects that enhance the quality of dressage in the United States, through any and all of its component disciplines - riding, competing, training, instructing, and judging. Grant applications should contain bold, creative, innovative ideas for the improvement and strengthening of dressage.
- **Young Rider International Dream Program (YR)**
The Young Rider International Dream Program, started in 2000, takes four top young American dressage riders to Europe for a two week introduction to European dressage. Applications can be accepted from USDF Young Riders, 16-21 years of age, and 22 year old graduates of the Advanced Young Rider Program, who are riding at Fourth Level or Above.
- **USDF Junior/Young Rider Clinic Series (YR)**
Young Dressage Riders, between the ages of 14 and 21, riding at any level, participate in clinics that are located throughout the country. Instructors are highly respected international high-performance athletes. This year, The Dressage Foundation will help make these clinics possible with a grant to USDF.
- **USDF/USEF Young Rider Graduate Program (YR)**
A weekend classroom educational seminar, this Program helps Young Rider graduates learn how to make a successful career in the adult equestrian world. The Dressage Foundation provides a \$15,000 grant for the Program through the general operating budget and through the Captain John H. "Jack" Fritz Young Professionals Grants within the Carol Lavell Gifted Memorial Fund.
- **Captain John H. "Jack" Fritz Young Professionals Grants (YR)**
With funding provided through the Carol Lavell Gifted Memorial Fund, support for young professionals, The Dressage Foundation is pleased to offer grants of up to \$500 each to individual participants to attend the USDF Young Rider Graduate Program.
- **Renee Isler Dressage Support Fund (YR, Open)**
Established by Renee Isler, this fund was originally created to help applicants to the "USDF Junior/Young Rider Clinic Series," who are in need of financial assistance in order to attend, if qualified and accepted by USDF. Renee's Fund has authorized up to nine annual grants of up to \$800 each, one for each Clinic held.

While the Renee Isler Dressage Support Fund continues to meet this need, it has also grown in scope and funding available. Funding is now available for a variety of uses for Young Riders and professionals.
- **The Trip Harting Fund (YR *attention Pony Clubbers)**
Provides funding assistance for a Pony Club rider to attend the United States Dressage Federation 'L' Education Program or Instructor Certification Program. Applicants must be current or graduate Pony Club members with a B or A rating. Applications are due no later than March 25th of each year, for that year's award.
- **Violet M. Hopkins Fund (Clinics and Seminars)**
Provides financial assistance to USDF GMOs, to conduct educational clinics and seminars for Dressage Riders at all levels. The Dressage Foundation administers and funds this program, making it possible for twenty to thirty GMO clinics each year, at an approximate total cost of \$35,000 annually.
- **The Dancing Horse Fund (Clubs)**
Administered and funded by The Dressage Foundation. Grants are awarded to "promote participation in, and improve the quality of Musical Freestyle at all levels of Dressage." Any **non-profit equestrian group** may apply for a grant from this Fund.
- **The Sally Swift Memorial Fund (Clubs)**
Provides grants up to \$1,000 to **non-profit equestrian groups** hosting a Centered Riding® Clinic. This Fund was created with donations to The Dressage Foundation from Sally's friends and supporters.
- **Elysium Farm Fund for U.S. Breeder Excellence (Breeders)**
This fund was established in 2011 and provides financial assistance to U.S. breeders. Funding should be used to pursue educational opportunities related to breeding that will advance their careers, promote sound breeding practices, and further enhance the quality of U.S-bred dressage horses.

THE CENTURY CLUB

The Century Club recognizes Dressage riders and horses whose combined age totals 100 years or more. Horse and rider perform a Dressage test of any level, at a Dressage show or event, and are scored by a Dressage judge or professional.

An application (found under "How to Join") must be completed and sent to the Foundation prior to the ride. The Dressage Foundation will send a beautiful black and gold ribbon to be presented to the team at the show. Following the test, the score sheet and papers verifying the ages of the horse and rider are sent to The Dressage Foundation. A handsome Century Club Award bearing the names of the rider and horse, the year of their ride, and team number, is presented to the Century Club Team.

The Century Club was formed at The Dressage Foundation in 1996, at the suggestion of Max Gahwyler (CT), who with his horse Prinz Eugen, became team # 2 in the Century Club.

The first "Centurion Class" ride, held in 1996, featured Lazelle

Knocke and her teammate Don Perignon. Lazelle's ride came after her extensive 'three year vacation' away from riding due to surgery and rehab time. As she said, "hopefully the Centurion class will be in the forefront of a very

interesting opportunity for Seniors and Dressage as Recreational and Therapeutic riding. It really is challenging and has long-term goals and benefits."

The Century Club ride has evolved into a serious endeavor that encourages and rewards our older senior riders. The rider need not show everything at their level of ride, but it is important to show that rider and horse work well together.

And while we stress the serious nature of riding a test, we want all senior riders for the Century Club to have fun! While this club has no dues, no meetings and no agenda, except to enjoy the occasion, many do keep in contact with the Foundation and with each other by email and phone. This is a wonderful group, not only experienced in horsemanship, but in various and unique life experiences.

In order "to do good, we must do well," and we will welcome your financial support to help with expenses of the Century Club News, and the personal plaque and ribbon that we present to each Century Club member.

Our club has a six-time member of the Century Club! Mr. Charles Chapin of Chatham, IL. In 1997 he had two century rides one on Piroshka and one on Chicaro Cocoa, in 1999 he rode Touchè, in 2000 he rode Zeus, and in 2002 he rode Beezie, and in 2003 he rode Ask Mikey.

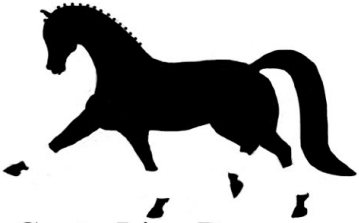

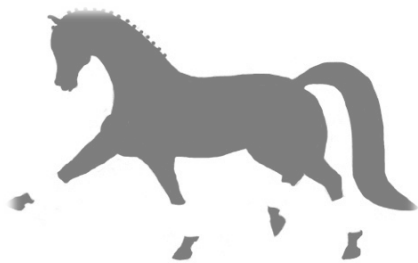
