Treasurer Report

A \$5.00 plate will include either a hot dog or pulled pork sandwich, chips, coleslaw.

Catherine Chamberlain Awarded Fiona Baan “Pursuit of Excellence” Memorial Trophy

Lexington, KY (July 24, 2014) - The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is pleased to announce that Region 7 Young Rider Catherine Chamberlain, of Murietta, CA, and her twelve-year-old, Dutch Warmblood gelding, Verdicci, were awarded this year's Fiona Baan “Pursuit of Excellence” Memorial Trophy. This trophy, which is on permanent display in the Roemer Foundation/USDF Hall of Fame, is awarded to the young rider who earns the highest combined average score in the three dressage tests; FEI Young Rider Team, Individual, and Freestyle. Catherine was the highest scoring competitor in the team test, individual test, and the freestyle test at this year's USDF/Platinum Performance North American Junior & Young Rider Dressage Championships at the Adequan/FEI North American Junior & Young Rider Championships presented by Gotham North. Chamberlain secured the win of the Fiona Baan “Pursuit of Excellence” Memorial Trophy in the FEI Young Rider Division with an overall combined average of 72.1480%. Ayden earned a 72.132% in the Team Test, 71.789% in the Individual Test, and 72.525% in the Freestyle Test.

The “Pursuit of Excellence” is the legacy Fiona Baan left to all the FEI Young Riders, and indeed to everyone who ever knew or worked with her. For nearly 30 years, Ms. Baan worked tirelessly with great dedication to the United States Equestrian Team (USET). She was U.S. Dressage Team leader for the 1976 Olympics, in which the U.S. won the Bronze Medal, the 1987 Pan Am Games, and for the Bronze Medal dressage team at the 1992 Olympics, in Barcelona.

New CLD member of Dressage Foundation's Century Club

On July 12, 2014, at CenterLine Dressage's FireCracker schooling show, Sally (Lockwood) Briney, of Pratensé Farms, became a proud member of The Dressage Foundation's Century Club.

Sally's journey to her Century Club ride began at the age of 11. At that time her interest was primarily focused on American Saddlebreds. In 1964, she married Paul Briney and Pratensé Farms was born. It started as a small operation that included Saddlebred horses to ride or drive and colts for showing. Later the same year, Sally won her first Amateur 5-Gaited World Championship on the four-year-old Sensational Princess, the youngest mare to win the stake. Over the next many years, Pratensé Farms continued to produce and show numerous American Saddlebreds. In 1981, Sally won her second World Championship on Bubbling Brown Sugar, who remained undefeated during that entire year of competition.

With the births of Sally's two children, Paula and Robert, the next generation of equestrians began. Under her tutelage, both children enjoyed numerous successes in the American Saddlebred show ring. It was when they became involved in Pony Club that Sally's interest in dressage was born. While she enjoyed learning more about dressage, she continued to focus most of her time and energy on showing her Saddlebreds.

More recently, Sally learned that a neighbor, CLD member and honoree Charles Chapin, had completed several Century Club rides. She started thinking that it was something very special and that she might want to add it to her list of equestrian accomplishments. So the search began for a horse that would meet the requirements necessary to complete her ride. After ruling out several prospective mounts, it was finally determined that the Saddlebred mare Champagne's Angelic, or "Tigger" as she is known around the barn, would be the perfect match. Sally and Tigger began their training for the big event by taking several dressage lessons from her daughter, Paula.

Prior to her Century Club ride, Sally had never shown a horse in a dressage show. On the big day, with many supporters to cheer her on, she and Tigger successfully completed the USDF Introductory Test B with an impressive score of 67.812%. While she has no immediate plans to continue showing dressage, she still enjoys driving her Saddlebreds in various shows throughout the Midwest.

Albers Award Presented to Region 1 Chef d'Equipe Debbie DelGiorno

Lexington, KY (July 25, 2014) - The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is pleased to announce that the Albers Award perpetual trophy was awarded to Region 1 Chef d'Equipe Debbie DelGiorno, at this year's USDF/Platinum Performance North American Junior & Young Rider Dressage Championships at the Adequan/FEI North American Junior & Young Rider Championships presented by Gotham North (NAJYRC).

"I can think of no better person to win this award. Debbie works tirelessly on behalf of the Region 1 Team, both before and during the event. The fact that Debbie stepped into the Region 1 Chef d'Equipe position to fill Patsy's shoes after her untimely passing makes this even more special" stated Roberta Williams, USDF FEI Jr/YR Committee Chair.

The Albers Award is named in honor of long time USDF Region 1 Chef d'Equipe, supporter, and good friend, Patsy Albers. The award is presented annually at the USDF/Platinum Performance North American Junior & Young Rider Dressage Championships to the dressage chef d'equipe who best demonstrates the same level of dedication, enthusiasm, and team spirit shown by Patsy throughout the years. The award is open to all of the dressage chefs d'equipe and any competitor or chef d'equipe can nominate a candidate by submitting a written explanation as to why that chef deserves to win the Albers Award.

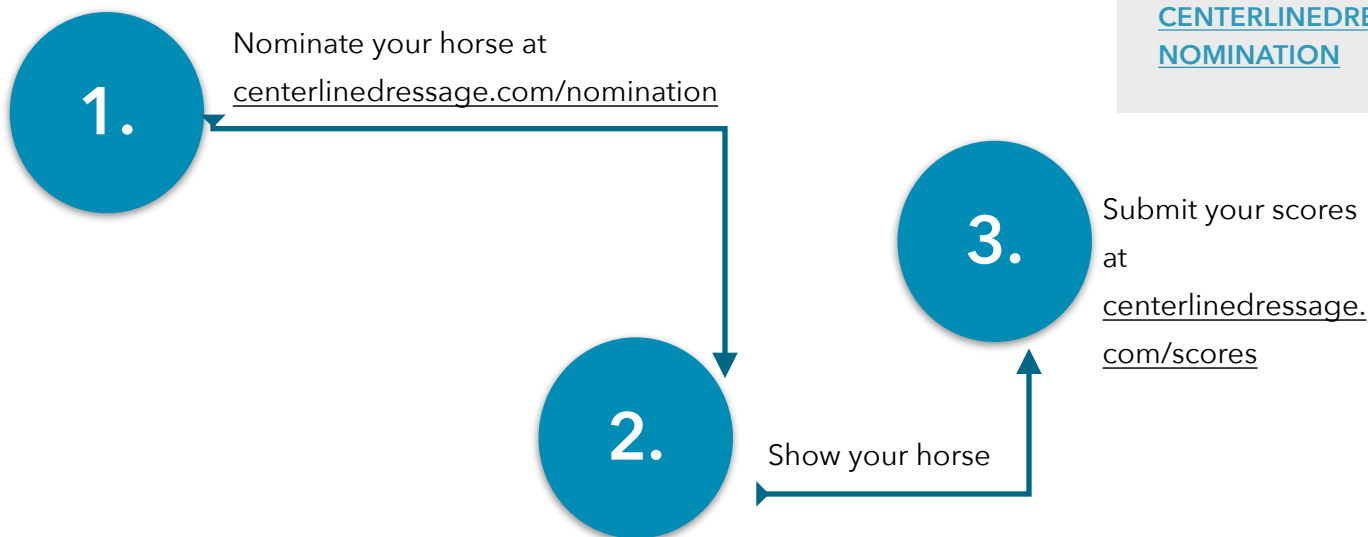
The NAJYRC is the premier equestrian competition in North America for junior and young riders, age 14-21. Young equestrians come from the United States, Bermuda, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico, and the Caribbean Islands to vie for team and individual FEI medals in the three Olympic equestrian disciplines of show jumping, dressage, and eventing, as well as the FEI World Equestrian Games disciplines of reining and endurance.
