ADMINISTRATIVE PASTOR REPORT

Overview

Putting together a budget is a combination of being pragmatic, having faith and understanding our current circumstances. Prayer and seeking God plays into the process; and the budget is presented to, edited, and voted on by the LSCC elders.

Money is a tool we use to resource the vision of LSCC. It's important, so we monitor it, account for it and invest it the most intelligent and effective ways we can to help move the vision forward. One way we strive to stay effective and above board is to have Miller Management do an Administrative Audit to review our financials and our processes every three to five years. We are in the process of completing one of these audits as we speak.

A Look Back: 2016-2017

This past year 2016/2017, the budget was cut by \$350,000 from the previous year in response to the very difficult necessity of asking for our previous Lead Pastor's resignation, the reality that we would go most the the year without a Teaching Pastor, and the impending road construction. This was a significant budget cut that forced us to be smarter and more creative and yet still able to deliver most of the ministry opportunities we deem important.

Our fiscal year runs from September 1 to August 31. Budget for this past Fiscal Year 2016/2017:

Budget = \$2,160,209 Giving as of July 31, 2017 = \$1,975,192 Expenses as of July 31, 2017 = \$1,936,316 Giving exceeds expenses = \$38,876

Projections

It looks like we could finish the year meeting our budget goal of \$2,160,209 or perhaps slightly below budget, either way our giving will exceed expenses for the year. Thank you church family for your faithfulness, obedience and love in giving. We are so thankful and grateful to God for His provision on our lives.

A Look Ahead: 2017-2018

Our budget this upcoming year 2017/2018 is set at \$2,280,165 and increase of \$119,956 or 5%. We feel LSCC is positioned and poised for growth this next year and are comfortable with this small increase.

It's always true that some of us would like to be more generous but due to our current financial situation are simply unable to do so. Because of this, we consistently offer a potential next step to help one another get to a healthier place financially thru participating in a *Financial Peace University* small group. That step will be available and offered starting Wednesday night, September 20 from 6:30 to 8 pm in Room 210 at LSCC. We also have Financial Advisors who can meet with you one on one to walk you through financial difficulties.

Another next step might be to prayerfully consider how God wants you and your family to be generous this upcoming year.

Some noteworthy things that have happened in this area include: moving our church office entrance and reception area from our courtyard entrance to the far east entrance of the building. We built a garage for storage and work space behind our building next to the Café. We hired a new Facilities Manager, Craig Brown, who has been on staff since February and doing a great job of making our grounds and facility look appealing.
