	Be It Resolved by the Township Trustees of Blendon Township,
that	··
0111	REAS, the Board of Township Trustees of Blendon Township, Franklin County, o, has determined the public safety and welfare would be served by the following ulation of the parking of vehicles; and,
WHE	REAS, the State of Ohio has granted townships the authority to pass resolutions parking of vehicles on township roads (O.R.C. 505.17); and,
WHE	REAS, the regulation does not conflict with the uniform traffic act, and is licable only to unincorporated areas of the township;
THE Fra	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Township Trustees of Blendon Township, nklin County, Ohio, that:
1.	No person shall park any truck with a hauling capacity of more than one (1) ton, tractor, trailer, semitrailer, bus, camper or watercraft, upon the streets or right of ways of the Township.
2.	The exception to the above is that of delivery to or for the receiving of goods or other articles from a residence in such district or in connection with the construction, repair or other services being performed at a residence in such district. This shall not be construed to authorize the conduct of any business from residential premises.
3.	Traffic control devices conforming to Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.09 shall be prominently posted throughout the Township giving notice of this regulation.
4.	Whoever violates this regulation shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor.
5.	In addition, any vehicle parked in violation of this regulation may be ordered into storage by any Blendon Township police officer as the designated agent of the Blendon Township Board of Trustees. The owner or any lienholder of a vehicle ordered into storage may claim the vehicle upon presentation of proof of ownership, which may be evidenced by a certificate of title to the vehicle and payment of all expenses, charges and fines incurred as a result of the parking violation and removal and storage of the vehicle.
6.	This regulation is subject to the limitations, restrictions and exceptions in Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4511 and Sections 4513.02 and 4513.37.
7.	The Township Clerk is directed to post these regulations in five conspicuous public places in the Township for thirty (30) days and publish the same in a newspaper of general circulation in the Township for three (3) consecutive weeks, after which such posting and publication of this regulation shall become effective;
