Dear Carolinas District,

Hello everyone! I hope you all are excited for this holiday season! My name is Gracen Barsanti and I am the UNICEF Champion for the Carolinas District. As the UNICEF Champion, it is my job to act as a liaison between the Carolinas and UNICEF. I provide our District with information on UNICEF, fundraiser ideas, events, and much more! This is the first year of the UNICEF Champions Program and I couldn't be more thrilled to be a part of it!

UNICEF's current project is Start Strong: Zambia. This project strives to benefit early childhood development (newborns – 8-year-olds) in Southeastern Africa. Early childhood development encompasses healthcare, nutrition, security, opportunities for learning, and responsive caregiving. To supply these needs, community centers, which are called Insakas, are built. Insakas include a classroom, a baby stimulation room, a playground, a borehole with a hand pump, a latrine, a garden, solar panels, and a kitchen. I know that you're probably thinking that there's no way that a small amount of money can change anything in Southeastern Africa. What if I told you that a few dollars can change a child's life for the better? Just \$5.00 can provide one child with locally produced, low cost materials for early stimulation and early learning, nineteen dollars can provide a child and caregiver with quality, home-based early childhood development services, two hundred and nine dollars can provide an early childhood development kit which includes a range of activities to encourage development and social interaction, three thousand dollars can construct a borehole with a hand pump, and thirty-five thousand dollars can build one insaka. A little goes a long way. You can change an unbelievable number of lives after donating to UNICEF.

I don't know about you, but I love Halloween! To raise money for UNICEF, a fundraiser called Trick or Treat for UNICEF is used throughout the whole month of October. This year, gathering donations is easier than ever! All you have to do is scan a QR code! There are so many fundraisers your club can do, such as a costume party, a Halloween movie night, a pumpkin carving contest, wrappers with the QR code around candy, trunk or treat, a haunted house, a halloween festival, trick or treat for donations, and so much more! Your club should receive some resources from the Lieutenant Governor of your Division — if you have not, don't be afraid to reach out! Please be sure to let your Lieutenant Governor know how much you raise by the end of October. With that being said, let's get to trick or treating!
