



Media Alert - 56th Annual Head of the Yarra - Saturday November 29th 2014 Yarra River spectacle with armada of Rowing 8's.

On Saturday 29th November, the largest ever contingent of rowers in an Australian regatta - 1,980 competitors will complete over the Yarra's gruelling 8.6 km course from Birrarung Marr to Hawthorn for fastest times in the annual "Head of The Yarra".

This year's event marks the 56th running of this rowing classic that is the undisputed favorite on Australia's rowing calendar. For 4 hours from 11.45 am – 3.45 pm, the flotilla of racing eights stretching the length of the Yarra to Hawthorn will provide a wonderful showcase and spectacle for the 10,000 spectators & supporters who follow it from the city along the 8.6km course to the finish and post race carnival at the Hawthorn Rowing Club.

This year's event is set to showcase some of Australia's best male & female rowing talent with a record field of 220 rowing eights. Competitors include school students, Olympians, Club and Masters rowers of both sexes from all around Australia and NZ.

Some Highlight contests to watch include:

- **Elite athlete eights.** The fastest club crews packed with Olympic and world championship medalists race off in the Open Male & Female sections between 2pm – 3pm. Last year's winners Mercantile Rowing Club, will have to fend off strong challenges from Melbourne University and a Sydney University / Qld composite crew who are keen to take the silverware north of the border.
- **Club Eights.** 133 crews of Male and Females from the clubs all around Australia & NZ will compete for fastest time in their sections. Racing runs from late morning till around 2.00pm
- **The H+ Masters (Crews Aged 70 plus).** 5 crews of Septuagenarians and 1 crew of Octogenarians, from Qld, NSW, Vic and SA, some ex Olympians and World medalists, race off at 11.00am.
- **The Mixed 8's (4Male + 4Female).** 34 club crews from all over Australia and NZ will vie for honors in this hotly contested mixed category around Noon.
- **School Boy Eights.** 22 crews including a large contingent from last years winners Scotch College, plus Melbourne & Brighton Grammars, Melbourne & Sydney High Schools, around 2 pm
- **School Girl Eights.** 19 crews including last years winners MLC, Loreto (Melbourne & Sydney), Pymble (Sydney) Strathcona, Korowa, Melbourne Girls, and Karinda International School on the water from around 1pm.

		<p>All crews muster at boat staging area: Rowing sheds in Melbourne – Jefferies Parade (Melways Map 2F, Ref K7).</p> <p>Course is 8.6km upstream to the Finish at Bridge Rd, Hawthorn. Bicycle tracks to the north and south of the river carry 1000's spectators and on-lookers.</p> <p>Fastest crews start: Men's Open at approximately 2.32 pm.</p> <p>Photo Opportunities from Swan St Bridge, Anderson St Bridge and Alexander Ave (1 km west of Grange Rd Bridge – "Big Bend") as crews make way up the Yarra to Hawthorn.
