This fall, we kick off the 2012-2013 season with political intrigue in "Born Yesterday," written by Garson Kanin, and directed by Thiry Olbrich. The winter months find us presenting a classic American farce, "Who's In Bed With the Butler?," written by Michael Parker, and directed by Phyllis Johnson. We conclude our season in the spring with the wartime comedy "Suite Surrender," written by Michael McKeever, and directed by Alan Peoples.

The vulgar, egotistic junkman Harry Brock has come to a swanky hotel in Washington to make crooked deals with government big-wigs. With him is the charming, but dumb, ex-chorus girl, Billie, whose lack of social graces embarrasses even Harry. Billie must be taught some amenities, and a few basic bits of information. The young, idealistic magazine reporter Paul Verrall, who has been investigating political skullduggery and is interested in Brock's activities, agrees to educate Billie.

As she learns about history, politics, and what Harry really is and what he wants, Billie rebels against being a tool in Harry's crooked schemes. She has fallen in love with Paul and plans to leave Harry. Billie helps Paul get hold of incriminating documents, which will result in scandal and disaster, as they turn their backs on the anti-social and anti-democratic Brock, and strike out on their own.
