

# Louisiana Breast and Cervical Health Program (LBCHP) Overview

FY 2014 (7/1/2013 – 6/30/2014)

## The Program

In October 2002 the Louisiana Breast and Cervical Health Program (LBCHP) was established at the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center's (LSUHSC) School of Public Health. The program operates in the following regions: Greater New Orleans, Greater Baton Rouge, River Region, Southwest Louisiana, Northwest Louisiana and Northeast Louisiana. The LBCHP relies on the partnership of local screening and outreach providers to implement the program.

## The Mission

Our mission is to prevent unnecessary disease, disability, and premature death by providing quality breast and cervical cancer screenings at no cost to uninsured and underinsured, lower income women in Louisiana. Special emphasis is given to reaching women who rarely or never receive screening services.

## Eligibility Requirements

- 21 to 64 years of age
- Income at or below 200% of the FPL
- Uninsured or underinsured
