Austin sparks Harding over Franklin Academy

Like the old song says, there are certain things in life you just don't do.

You don't tug on Superman's cape. You don't spit into the wind. You don't pull the mask off the old Lone Ranger. And you definitely don't kick the ball anywhere near Calvin Austin.

The Harding Academy speedster was at it again Friday, returning a punt 97 yards for a score to spark the Lions to a 48-16 victory over visiting Franklin Road Academy in the first round of the Division 2-A playoffs. Austin — who also scored on a 52-yard run — has returned five punts and two kickoffs for touchdowns in 2016.

"He was electric again," said Lions coach Johnny Allen, whose team heads to Knoxville Webb for a quarterfinal game next week. "He caught it over the shoulder and then broke containment. Last week, we as coaches didn't do a good enough job of getting him the ball. This week, he was moving on every play."

The Lions also got a spark from their Renaissance man, running back Marquavious Moore, who ran for 185 yards and scored four times (64, 19, 1, 32).

"Marquavious has been our workhorse," said Allen. "Lately teams have been packing the box against us but he hit that long one to kind of open it up."

"He's probably the most talented athlete I've ever coached. He has a 4.7 (grade point average), he acts, he can play any instrument, he loves poetry. ... He's just a unique kid."

LONG DAY PAYS OFF

Going on the road in the postseason takes some doing. A good example is Collierville.

The Dragons left school at 10 a.m. Friday to make the three-and-a-half hour drive to Lebanon to take on Wilson Central in their 6A opener. Head coach Mike O'Neill said his team didn't get back to school until around 3 a.m. but the long day was worth it as the sixth-seeded Dragons (4-7) surprised the No. 3-seed Wildcats, 35-21.

The victory earns Collierville a second-round game at Cordova.

"It was worth it," said O'Neill after his team's first playoff victory since 2010. "We travel pretty well. ... We went to the Cool Springs Mall and hung out and ate (before the game). They were pretty charged up getting on the bus but they fell asleep pretty quick."

After a 60-14 victory over Millington on Sept. 9, the Dragons hit a rough patch, losing four of five games against Region 4 competition. Part of the reason was that quarterback Matt Connors was battling mono. But the senior looked healthy Friday, throwing for 254 yards with touchdowns of 52 yards to Marcus Bersozza and 39 to Alex Smith while running for another score.

"During the middle of the season we're like 'what is going on?' " said O'Neill of Connors' illness. "He actually missed a couple of games ... but with our spread offense, he's such a big part of what we do."

Cole Johnson highlighted a strong defensive effort with a 45-yard interception return while Dylan Scott kicked field goals of 44, 45 and 24 yards.

"We wanted to take away their RPO (run-pass option)," said O'Neill. "And we knew they mostly threw to one side and Cole Johnson with the pick-six was able to take advantage of that. And Dylan was a big part. ... The (second) field goal was into the wind, punted well and he hit almost every kickoff for a touchdown. It's so big when the offense has to go 80 yards."

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT

It took some time for Central to warm up Friday night.

Once the Warriors got going, they looked every bit like a 10-1 team as they opened play with a 47-24 victory over Rossvie. Penalties and a struggling offense contributed to the Warriors being down 24-14 in the third quarter before they scored the game's last 33 points.

"At halftime the players said, 'Coach, we've been here before,' " said Lynnord Crutchfield. "It was the kids' mindset. ... But in the second half we showed what we are capable of."

Central got a big spark from freshman receiver Darin Turner, who did his best Lynn Swann imitation on a catch that set up Cameron Cooper's 19-yard pass to LeRik Shelton that made it 24-21. The catch came after Turner — who already holds offers from Memphis, Ole Miss and Tennessee — had fumbled on the previous possession and was visibly frustrated on the sidelines.

Cooper gave the Warriors a 28-24 lead after the Hawks fumbled the ensuing kickoff before Dontavon Davis

(25-yard run), Anthony Taylor (85-yard interception return) and Dylan Ingram (3-yard run) salted it away as Central scored 26 fourth-quarter points.

"I told him (Turner) after that catch that — for me — that was the biggest play he had made all season," Crutchfield said. "He's a competitor and we were down 10. ... I think he felt like he had let the team down. But that play really sparked us and got the crowd involved."

6A

Whitehaven's ground-and-pound worked to perfection as the top-seeded Tigers (11-0) defeated Lebanon, 49-3. Kylan Watkins and Chris Witherspoon combined for 257 yards on just 14 carries and totaled five touchdowns while Watkins added another score through the air. The Tigers' defense held the visitors to 125 total yards. Whitehaven hosts Nashville Overton, which beat Arlington, 45-17.

Cordova bounced back from its Week 11 loss to Whitehaven with a 56-18 win over Nashville McGavock. Christian Arrambide threw four touchdown passes and the Wolves' defense allowed just 129 yards. ... John Lyons ran for three touchdowns and threw a 17-yard score to Mickale Massey as White Station topped Antioch, 30-12. The Spartans (7-4) travel to Franklin, which eliminated Germantown, 38-7.

5A

Aside from Central, it was a rough night for area teams. Brentwood defeated Kirby (4-7), 55-28 while Centennial handled Bolton (5-6), 35-12. ... Brighton (7-4) finished with a heart-breaker, losing 41-40 in overtime to Henry County. Malik Matthews' 10-yard run in the extra session pulled the Cardinals to within one but Malik Jackson was sacked on the two-point attempt. Brighton sent the game into overtime with 26 seconds left as freshman Nick Johnson hit Andre Golden from 37 yards out on a trick play. That was set up when Cameron John recovered a fumble on an attempted kneel-down that would have run out the clock.

4A

East and Ridgeway opened with easy victories. The Mustangs (9-2) blanked Jackson North Side, 49-0 while Ridgeway (8-3) handled Hardin County, 30-3. ... Millington's season ended at 2-9 with a 60-7 loss to Brownsville Haywood while Craigmont (2-9) fell to Lexington, 37-12.

3A

Raleigh-Egypt (10-1) responded to last week's loss to Fayette-Ware with a 30-14 victory over South Fulton. Kalynn Grandberry scored on an 80-yard run and DaShawn Boyland had a pair of touchdowns for the Pharaohs. ... Fayette-Ware (8-3), making its first playoff appearance since 2007, lost to Jackson Liberty Magnet Tech, 35-0, while Covington (6-5) fell to Dyersburg, 55-23.

Mitchell (7-4) held Hillcrest to 71 yards (minus-35 on the ground) and scored three defensive touchdowns in a 32-0 victory. Clevon Doby opened the scoring with a 55-yard pick-six before Jayvion Coleman (40-yard fumbled return) and Emmitt Booker (45-yard interception return) got into the end zone in the fourth quarter.

Humboldt scored twice in the fourth quarter to rally past KIPP (6-4), 34-24. Dewayne Betts ran for two scores and threw touchdowns on 13 and 58 to Orreon Finley. ... Undefeated Dresden downed BTW (1-9), 48-8 while Trenton Peabody blanked Middle College (6-5), 49-0.

Third-seeded CBHS (8-3) earned a trip to Montgomery Bell Academy with a 43-18 victory over fourth-seed St. Benedict (3-8). Keegan Voss ran for 113 yards on just nine carries and scored three times while Dominic Garrett had 126 yards and a score.

Lausanne extended its school-best record to 11-0 with a 42-7 victory over Tipton-Rosemark (4-6). Eric Gray celebrated his birthday with 142 yards on just six carries and three touchdowns while Mario Nolan-Dillard threw scoring passes of 50 yards to Jesse Neloms, 48 to Kobi Jeffries and 10 to Gray Clark.
