What happened to the time when we had three or more nominees for each board position? Why is it that the same 10 people are on the board year after year with some serv-



Trivia Answer

Triumph Motorcycles claims to be the oldest continuous-production motorcycle company in the world. Triumph has survived two world wars and their factory being razed by German bombs during World War II. The Triumph company began producing cars in 1923.

Triumph motorcycles built for the British Army during World War I exceeded 30,000. The Model 'H' Roadster, a 550cc, side-valve, four-stroke with a three-speed gearbox became known as the 'Trusty Triumph.' It is considered by some to be the first "modern" motorcycle.
