With driving season here, some recommendations provided by the Vintage Triumph Register:

Simple Mechanical Checks

Here are a few generic tests. Some you can do yourself and the rest a mechanic should be able to do at a reasonable cost in about 30 to 45 minutes.

Run a compression test. Indicates ring and valve seal.

Have the oil pressure tested by a separate gauge. Indicates engine and oil pump wear.

Have the water in the radiator tested for exhaust gasses. Indicates head gasket leaks.

Drive the car and see if the transmission shifts smoothly with no grinding or knocks. Listen and feel for bad synchromesh and/or chipped teeth.

Let off and on the clutch slowly, feeling for a full positive engagement with no slipping. Indicates a bad clutch.

Try braking hard in an open parking lot. Indicates brake problems.

Check the oil for clouding and look for gray slime on the dip stick. Indicates a head gasket leak.

When checking for rust, take a small magnet to feel for thick areas of bondo.

Welding may indicate serious rust problems or a major impact.

Syn·chro·mesh 'siNGkrō, meSH/

noun: synchromesh

A system of gear changing, especially in motor vehicles, in which the driving and driven gearwheels are made to revolve at the same speed during engagement by means of a set of friction clutches, thereby easing the change.

BISHOP'S CASTLE, YOU AND YOUR TR- PLAN NOW!



Overnighter to Bishops Castle, July 16-17, 2016

The destination for this drive is Bishops Castle, one of the most unique structures in Colorado, which has been built by Mr. Jim Bishop over the last 45 years (www.roadsideamerica.com/story/2047).

This club event may be done as a two day trip with a Saturday overnight in Salida or as a longer one day drive down and back on Sunday.

For those making it a two day trip we will leave from highway 285 at the parking lot in Conifer at 2:00 pm on Saturday, July 16th. Then through Bailey, Kenosha pass and Fairplay to Johnson Village where we go south on 285/24 to 291 going east into Salida arriving about 4:30 (total about 140 miles from Denver).

Overnight at a motel in Salida of your choice (*make your own reservation) and leaving Sunday about 8:30 am after breakfast and going 30 miles east on highway 50 to Texas Creek and south on highway 69 25 miles to Westcliffe.

Then east on highway 96 for 15 miles to the junction with highway 165 where we go south about 8 miles to Bishops castle, arriving about 10:30 to 11:00 am.

For those doing the event as a one day trip on Sunday the most direct route is through Colorado Springs, south on 115 through Penrose to Florence. Then south on highway 67 past SuperMax (no hitch-hiker pickup!), through Wetmore and continuing about 10 miles south and west to the junction with highway 165. Then 8 miles south to Bishops Castle. Plan to arrive between 10:30 and 11:00; it's about a 140 mile drive from Denver.

After exploring the castle for about an hour (park on the shoulder, no entry fee) the combined group will leave about 11:30 – 12:00 and go back through Wetmore then east on 96 through Pueblo for lunch at the Aviators Bar and Grill at the Pueblo airport east of town.

Afterward we can come back on a rural-scenic route via Boone, Yoder, Calhan, Peyton, and Kiowa or you can head up I-25 for a quicker trip.

*Motels in Salida are filling up quickly for weekend visits (local music concert crowds) and some require a two night stay. Shirley & I have made reservations at the Hampton Inn @ 719-539-0800 for July 16th but there are many other motels. Make reservations very early (like now) – most have no-cost cancellation clauses so make a reservations now if there is any chance you will be making the trip.)
