BEND PHOTOGRAPHER TAKES PART IN HISTORIC STATEWIDE PROJECT

July 8, 2013 – On July 15, 2013, Bend photographer Diane Kulpinski will participate in the Oregon Project Dayshoot 30th Anniversary event by documenting life in central Oregon. Kulpinski took part in the first Project Dayshoot by driving a large rural loop with Bend as the start and end point and taking photos all along the way. This year, she plans to come full circle by retracing that loop.

Kulpinski is taking part in a historic statewide project that will take place from midnight to midnight on July 15. More than 100 photographers and videographers will collect images that show a “day in the life” of Oregon which will be displayed online and in a physical exhibit, and will become part of the permanent collection of the Oregon Historical Society.

The public is also encouraged to participate on July 15 by posting photos to Flickr, Instagram, or Facebook using the tag #dayshoot30.
