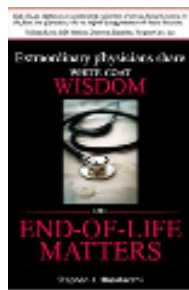

Yesterday’s Program...

Fighting Poverty: Rotaract Goes Beyond Theory

Out of the classroom and into the world. That’s what Rotaract—the Rotary service club for young people—can do for students like Matt Werner. The Edgewood College Sociology major returned a more enlightened person, after a 10-day trip to Cuernavaca, Mexico, in January. He was among eight students and two faculty members to explore what it means to be impoverished and what can be done about it.

Poverty is never a simple foe to vanquish, especially in Mexico, where corruption is rampant and there is little faith in government, says Werner.

While in Mexico, the students learned about social justice, Mexican values, the history of Mexico/US relations and economic policies that affect the poor. Some lessons aren’t so clear cut, either, suggests Werner.

For example, the Zapatistas have been fighting the Mexican government for two decades. And while some may consider the rebels a terrorist outfit, others see them as a group desperately defending poor, indigenous people. Much of the conflict is rooted in discrimination.

“There are racial disparities in Mexico, too,” says Werner.

After his experience, Werner seems convinced that social justice can be achieved by taking measures to strengthen the poor via community development and unions.

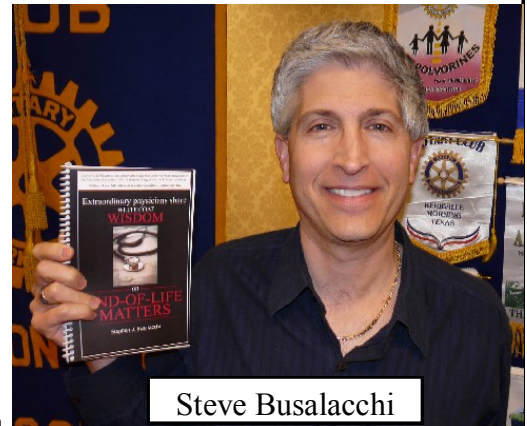
Steve's new 72-page booklet deals with end-of-life issues, including spirituality and remarkable recoveries. The booklet, *End-of-Life Matters*, is a much abbreviated version of Steve's hard cover *White Coat Wisdom*, which came out last year.

"*End of Life Matters* is an outstanding collection of stories from physicians on the front line of practice, who've helped dying patients with heavy decisions," say William Rock, MD, Medical Director, Emeritus, HospiceCare, Inc.

"When I heard Martha "Sunny" von Bulow spent twenty-eight years in an unconscious state before dying in late December, it reminded me how poorly and expensively we die in America," says Steve. "Focusing on end-of-life issues in this booklet, as discussed by these sensitive physicians, hopefully will help people make better decisions for themselves through living wills and clear instructions to family members."

I found Steve's first book to be very absorbing and revealing — The "can't put it down type." I eagerly anticipate plunging into his new revelations of life's end from a doctor's perspective. Editor.
