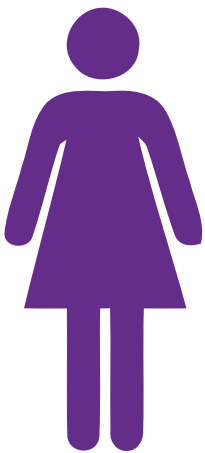




# NEW YORK

## WHO THE ALZHEIMER'S ASSOCIATION SERVES

*In its 2012 Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures report, the Alzheimer's Association estimates that 320,000 people in New York State have Alzheimer's disease. An additional 994,540 New Yorkers provide care to a person with Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia. Using demographic information provided to the seven chapters of the Alzheimer's Association, we can provide a better picture of who seeks our services.*



### Gender

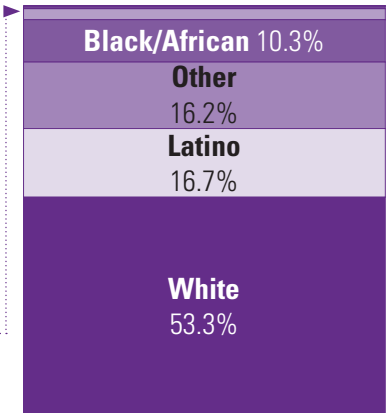
**79.1 percent of contacts were female.**

According to surveys conducted by the Alzheimer's Association, the National Alliance on Caregiving and AARP, 70.3 percent of dementia caregivers are women.

### Ethnicity

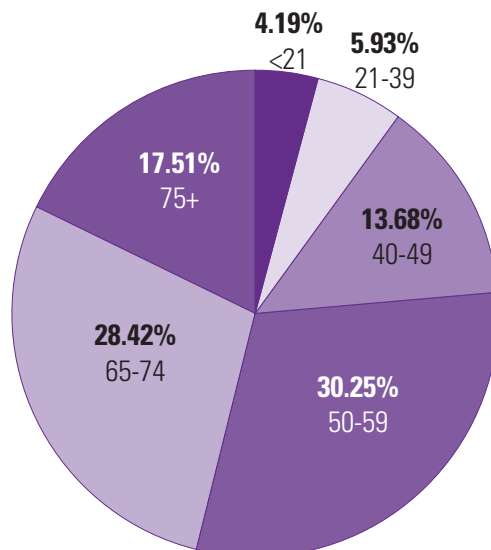
Alzheimer's is not a disease specific to one ethnic group. 46 percent of contacts identified themselves as non-white or other.

### Age

The majority of individuals seeking information from the Alzheimer's Association are age 50-74.



### Education

56.5 percent of contacts had at least a bachelor's degree.

High school graduate: 29.07%  
Some college: 11.4%  
Bachelor's degree: 33.5%  
Post/Professional degree: 23.06%
