DIRECT SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS

- Rolled out a full-scale Kindergarten through fifth grade summer camp and school year program serving 120 low-income immigrant and bilingual children (an expanded Welcome Program)
- Conducted a **Summer of Service Day Camp** for 45 middle school students, decreasing summer learning loss
- Mentored 35 teenaged summer youth employees, improving their work readiness and youth leadership skills
- Served 120 middle school students daily at two sites throughout the school year, increasing their cognitive and non-cognitive skills so that they make healthy decisions and succeed in school

ORGANIZATIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Received two new government grants to support programming for 100 high school students
- Designed a blueprint for FYI's community-wide College Access and Persistence Program addressing an unmet need in the Washington Heights community
- Strengthened infrastructure through strategic hires, and service grants from Taproot and Youth I.N.C.
- Received a Four Star rating from **Charity Navigator** recognizing our commitment to fiscal responsibility

THE BIG PICTURE

- Implemented a literacy-driven program model to improve FYI'ers fluency and reading skills, a significant need in the school district
- Forged relationships with school personnel and parents to meet the needs of the whole child
- Established the **Panel for Immigrant and Bi-cultural Children** led by Dr. Jennifer Collett to identify best practices for achieving excellent reading outcomes
- Introduced new activities, e.g., drumming, self-defense, STEM and art to cultivate children's multiple intelligences
- Exposed youth to new experiences – college tours, camping, baseball games, museums – to nurture healthy independence and fun
- Opened FYI doors for Saturday programming making maximum use of our beautiful building, six days a week
