As a church family, we wish Dave well as he transitions to his new position as the band teacher at Conway Middle School and in all of his other future endeavors.

As we look ahead, Jackie Copeland, Christopher Bunch, and I are working diligently to provide worship and music leadership in the absence of a music director. We are actively looking for an interim music director, and we will keep you informed throughout the process. In the meantime, I know that you will be flexible and understanding with adjustments that may need to occur in our worship services. The adult choir may sing an anthem as they typically do, but on some Sundays we may instead hear a soloist or an ensemble or a children's choir. We may also have to make some adjustments to our Advent and Christmas music schedule, specifically our Christmas Cantata that is scheduled for the morning of Sunday, December 14. If a full cantata is not presented, we will still hear some beautiful Christmas music that morning and in each of the various worship services that occur in December.

Finally, I want you to know that our personnel committee will be working as soon as possible with our music and pastoral staff in a process to discover our next Director of Music whom God will call to Edenton Baptist Church. We will value the input of the congregation concerning the responsibilities and qualifications of this person, and we will keep you well informed along the way. If you have suggestions or thoughts about our music program, please let me know. I think God has a wonderful future in store for our church, and I want our music program to be an integral part of that future.
