ABSENTEE DEACON NOMINATIONS

Deacon elections will take place at the conclusion of worship on Sunday, October 8. For members unable to be present in the designated church conference, absentee nominations may be submitted through the church office during the week prior to October 8 (October 1-6 at noon). Absentee nomination forms may be picked up in the church office and delivered to our shut-ins by a church member. The completed form will be placed in an envelope supplied by the church. The envelope will be sealed and signed by the person making the nominations for voting. The form will then be submitted to the church office. The Church Administrator will secure all nomination forms, unopened, and deliver them to the Deacon Nomination Committee. The committee will verify that each signed envelope is from a church member. The envelopes will be opened, and the nomination forms removed and placed in the nomination box without revealing the nominations. The absentee nomination forms will then be counted in the final tally, with no identification of the person.

Eligibility Requirements: Members eligible for nomination include those persons who are 21 years of age and have been resident members of Edenton Baptist Church for at least two years. Members who are ineligible for nomination include active deacons, the spouse of a deacon who will be active during 2018, an adult child or parent of a deacon who will be active in 2018, and current staff members.

From the Pastor

Twenty years ago, I picked up a copy of *At Home in Mitford*—Jan Karon's first novel in the Mitford series of books that have now totaled twelve books. As a young pastor, I enjoyed reading about the daily joys and challenges that Father Tim Kavanagh experienced as the rector of Lord's Chapel Episcopal Church in the fictional North Carolina mountain village of Mitford. After finishing the book, I put it on my shelf and haven't thought much about it until last week when somebody mentioned to me that he was reading the book. I pulled the book off of my shelf and have been rereading it, enjoying the story and appreciating the wit and wisdom of Jan Karon as she helps us to see life through the eyes of a caring pastor.

On one occasion, Father Tim went to the sanctuary of the Lord's Chapel by himself to enjoy the solitude and pray. But as he entered the sanctuary, he heard a strange sound and saw a man kneeling in a pew near the front. The man, dressed in a suit and tie, cried out in a voice that was a combination of anger, despair, and odd hope, "If you're up there, prove it! Show me! If you're God, you can prove it!" The man was obviously troubled as he yelled out, "I'll never ask this again: Are...you...up...there?"

Father Tim slid into a nearby pew and said very gently, "You may be asking the wrong question." After a pause, he continued, "I believe the question you may want to ask is not, 'Are you up there?' but 'Are you down here?'" The skeptical man replied, "What kind of a joke is that?" And Father Tim said to him with great care, "It isn't a joke. God wouldn't be God if he were only up there. He's with us right now, in this room."¹

We all need a simple, yet profound reminder every day that we need not wonder if God is real. We need not wonder if God is up in heaven. We need not wonder if God really cares. As Father Tim observed, God is not only "up there," but "down here," among us, closer than we can imagine, constantly revealing himself to us. And our calling is to seek God, to pay attention, to recognize God in the people around us, in the circumstances of life, in the highs and the lows that we face every day.

How will you discover God anew today?
