Hello fellow ASV members:

I would like to use this President's newsletter to update you on various ASV activities and fill you in on our plans for the 2015 meeting at Western University in London, Ontario, Canada. This meeting will be our third visit to this spirited university town, and I think the exciting agenda will complement the opportunity to enjoy the natural beauty of London, Ontario. More information about the meeting is provided below, and will be posted on the conference website ([www.asv2015.com](http://www.asv2015.com)), but be sure to reserve **July 11-15<sup>th</sup>** on your calendar and plan to attend.

The 2015 meeting will follow our traditional schedule, beginning on Saturday afternoon with the Welcome Reception followed by the keynote address. On Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, we will have four outstanding plenary sessions. Beginning with Saturday evening, the evenings and afternoons will be packed with an assortment of workshops, state-of-the-art (SOA) lectures, and poster sessions. There will be plenty of time at meals and during breaks to renew and establish friendships and collaborations.

As many of you know, the primary purpose of our 33 year old Society is to hold an annual meeting to bring the Virology community together to hear a wide range of research presentations and to exchange ideas. Our commitment to training future virologists is reflected in the numerous presentation opportunities for graduate students and postdoctoral fellows. The "ASV Ann Palmenberg Junior Investigator" program showcases the accomplishments of young faculty members, and our State-of-the-Art and plenary lectures provide the opportunity to hear from more established investigators. I am looking forward to seeing all of you at Western University to help us continue this tradition of immersing ourselves in virology and sustaining an interactive and supportive community of scholars.

## **Membership Dues**

Membership in the ASV is very reasonable (full: \$100, associate: \$30, associate student: \$15) and I strongly encourage each of you to keep your membership active so that you and your lab members can take full advantage of all that the ASV has to offer. Membership renewal statements for the period January 1 through December 31, 2015 were mailed to all members in mid-October. It is critical for you to pay your dues **before the January 1, 2015** due date. You may pay your dues by mail, fax or online on the ASV website by credit card (Visa, MasterCard or American Express).

ASV members who are paying delinquent dues online should select the "Other Amount" category and enter the total amount they are paying. Delinquent dues for 2014 and even 2013 can be paid in this fashion, resulting in restoration of your membership in good standing.

Please note that only full members who have paid their 2015 dues may sponsor abstracts and travel award applications submitted for the upcoming meeting, and that only graduate student, undergraduate student, and postdoctoral fellow members who have paid their 2015 dues may submit travel award applications. ### **2015 Call for Abstracts & Registration Booklet**

The 2015 Call for Abstracts and registration information booklet is being mailed to the ASV membership mid-November, as this newsletter is being written. The abstract deadline is **11:59 pm EST, Monday, February 2, 2015**. All abstracts must be submitted *electronically* to the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology (FASEB) through the conference website at [www.asv2015.com](http://www.asv2015.com).

Complete details are available on the meeting website. **As always, each meeting participant may make only one workshop presentation.** Oral presentations will be limited to 12 minutes with an additional 3 minutes for discussion. We will have two afternoon poster sessions that provide excellent opportunities for informal and in-depth discussion. Please be sure to read the "session/topic categories" carefully during the abstract submission process, because we have made some changes to what is available.

### **2014 ASV meeting**

The 33rd annual meeting, attended by 1383 participants, was hosted by Colorado State University and held on their campus in Fort Collins, from June 21-25, 2014. Jeff Wilusz and the members of his local organizing committee did a superb job of organizing this meeting and our ASV past President, Paula Traktman, assembled an excellent lineup of plenary speakers. I would like to thank Richard Kuhn, Chair of the ASV Program Planning Committee, for organizing the State-of-the-Art lectures and to ensure that the 56 workshops ran smoothly; in this regard, I would also like to thank Katherine Spindler, Vice-Chair and all the members of the Program Planning Committee for their hard work and invaluable assistance.

### **ASV Meeting Update - We're electronic!**

Last year the ASV Council voted to discontinue printing the program for the annual meeting and take our proceedings electronic. An interactive mobile app for iOS, Google, and Android devices was custom designed for ASV that provides access to the entire meeting program as well as sub-programs (plenaries, concurrent workshops by time slot), allows last minute updates to the schedule, links to speaker's web pages, maps of key locations on the campus, and much more. Abstract submission will continue as usual. Once the program is established, a fully searchable and printable program will be available on the meeting website. A much improved personal itinerary planner will also be available on the website. Launch of the ASV app went smoothly last year, and we have done our best to address the few problems that arose. I am confident that our membership will appreciate the new capabilities, flexibility, and accuracy of the electronic program and app.

### **2015 ASV meeting**

The 34th Annual Meeting will take place on the campus of Western University, London, Ontario, Canada, from **July 11-15th**. Our local hosts for ASV 2015 are Drs. C. Yong Kang, Stephen Barr and Jimmy Dikeakos, Professors of Virology, Department of Microbiology and Immunology, Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry at Western University. You should have already received a brochure on the ASV 2015 meeting which was included with the 2015 membership renewal statement mailing. Complete information regarding the scientific program, travel, lodging and registration will be available, as it develops, on the conference website at [www.asv2015.com](http://www.asv2015.com). Remember that the abstract deadline is 11:59 pm on **Monday, February 2, 2015** and abstracts

must be submitted to FASEB electronically on the conference website link. Please remember that each participant may make only one workshop oral presentation. Western University is an easily accessible and scenic venue ideally situated for pre- or post-meeting sightseeing. I strongly recommend taking a few extra days to explore the history, architecture, entertainment, cuisine and beautiful scenery of London.

International visitors from countries other than the United States must have a valid passport. Online application visas can be found at: <http://travel.state.gov/visa/>. **It is recommended that you apply for your visa at least 4 to 5 months prior to your departure date.** Individuals requiring an official letter of invitation in order to obtain a visa or permission to attend the meeting may request one from Western University by email at [asv2015@uwo.ca](mailto:asv2015@uwo.ca). **However, to obtain this letter, applicants must first register and pay meeting registration fees** for the conference, per Western University regulations. The letter does not imply that any conference fees or other expenses will be assumed by the meeting organizers or the American Society for Virology.

The Education and Career Development Committee, chaired by Stacey Schultz-Cherry, will hold a virology education workshop on Sunday, July 12<sup>th</sup>, from noon to 1:30 pm, entitled “Designing Virology Labs for Undergrads?” The workshop will be hosted by Drs. Troy Cline and Lauren O’Donnell. There will be a “Communication Workshop” scheduled on Monday, July 13<sup>th</sup>; updates on the topic and the presenters will be forthcoming on the conference website. ASV will also be hosting another live podcast of TWiV (This Week in Virology) on Tuesday July 14<sup>th</sup>. The popular “lunch discussion tables” that provide an opportunity for students and postdoctoral fellows to interact with the plenary speakers and others will be held during the lunch breaks on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday. No cost is involved but due to limited space, **reservations are required** to attend. **Advance signup is required on the meeting registration form.** Registrants will be chosen by a lottery system drawing prior to the meeting. Selected attendees will be notified by email of the one (1) lunch table event to which you have been assigned prior to start of the conference to allow you to **confirm your acceptance.**

### **ASV Travel Awards**

All ASV 2015 travel grant applications must be submitted electronically online through the ASV website at [www.asv.org](http://www.asv.org) or through the link provided on the ASV 2015 conference website at [www.asv2015.uwo.ca](http://www.asv2015.uwo.ca). You must first complete the online submission of an abstract for presentation and receive a Confirmation Number. When you apply for the appropriate travel grant, you will be required to “paste” an exact copy of the electronically submitted abstract (title, authors, text) into the travel grant application form and provide the assigned Confirmation Number. Only students and postdoctoral fellows who are current (dues paid for 2015) members of ASV or have applied for membership by February 2, 2015, are eligible to apply for the respective travel grant. ASV will also give a small number of travel awards to undergraduate students. Applicants are also required to obtain permission from a current (dues paid for 2015) full member of ASV who agrees to be listed as the sponsor for your travel grant application. Once permission has been obtained, you may then list the full member’s name, email address, institution affiliation, and address on the application. (Note: Teachers of Undergraduate Students submitting travel grant applications are excluded from the abstract submission and full member nomination requirements.) Please review your application carefully before submitting. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed or considered for funding by the ASV Graduate Student and Postdoctoral Fellow Travel Award Committee. **Applications are not accepted by mail.** The deadline for online submission of all travel grant applications is **Monday, February 2, 2015.**
