

## Chalk Cloth

To prepare chalk cloth for use, rub the side of a piece of chalk over entire area. Erase and repeat at least one more time. If done before making quilt, the chalk will not spread all over the fabric border.



**To make a chalk cloth quilt**, cut chalk cloth about 18" x 16". This way you can get three from a half-yard cut of fabric.

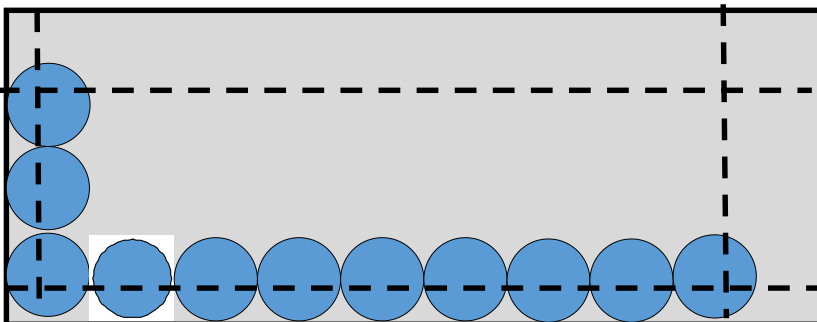
Cut borders about 4½". Sew to all four sides. Layer with batting and backing. Topstitch about ¼" to ½" from seam on the fabric border. More quilting or topstitching is optional. Cut binding and bind around quilt. All done!

If desired you can sew a sleeve to the back, or make loops at the top that are inserted into the binding seam.

## Scalloped Table Runner

Use chalk cloth about 18" x 48" or size of choice.

To make a table runner, select a round object to use as a template, something about 5 or so inches. If all four sides of chalk cloth are square, draw a line about 1 ¼" or so from the edge on two sides. Using the round object, place in corner with object touching both edges. Continue so that object touches previous round line and outer edge, drawing round line to the 1 ¼" line. Continue this on both sides. The other two sides will be determined by the round object and its placement. Finish other two sides. With scissors, cut the curves carefully so they are smoothly cut, no jagged edges. All done!
