

Prairie Point's Curvy Log Cabin Quilt

To make our curvy log cabin quilt with Kansas Troubles fabrics, we used a 16 Pack Bundle of fat quarters, plus 6 one-half yard cuts of lights, or the equivalent of 3 yards. There was almost 7" left over on the fat quarters and 6" left over on the light backgrounds. This would enable you to make the quilt larger, or you could get by with fewer cuts of fabric than listed here.

The quilt is 48" x 64" before adding borders. We added a 5 1/2" border, making the quilt, 58" x 74". You will need 1 1/4 yard for the outer border and 5/8 yard for a binding or make it scrappy from leftovers on the fat quarters. You may lay out your blocks any way you wish; we placed them so that they look like circles on the quilt with the darks of 4 blocks meeting at the center.

The directions on the Curvy Log Cabin Trim Tool will give you your cutting requirements and piecing instructions.

The chart on the other side shows how we cut the fat quarters, but feel free to do whatever you want.

Lights (6) $\frac{1}{2}$ yds
 cut (7) $1\frac{1}{2}$ x WOF and (1) $1\frac{3}{4}$ x WOF

subcut (8) per fabric
 of the following units:

$1\frac{1}{2}$ x $3\frac{1}{2}$

$1\frac{1}{2}$ x $4\frac{1}{2}$

$1\frac{1}{2}$ x $5\frac{3}{4}$

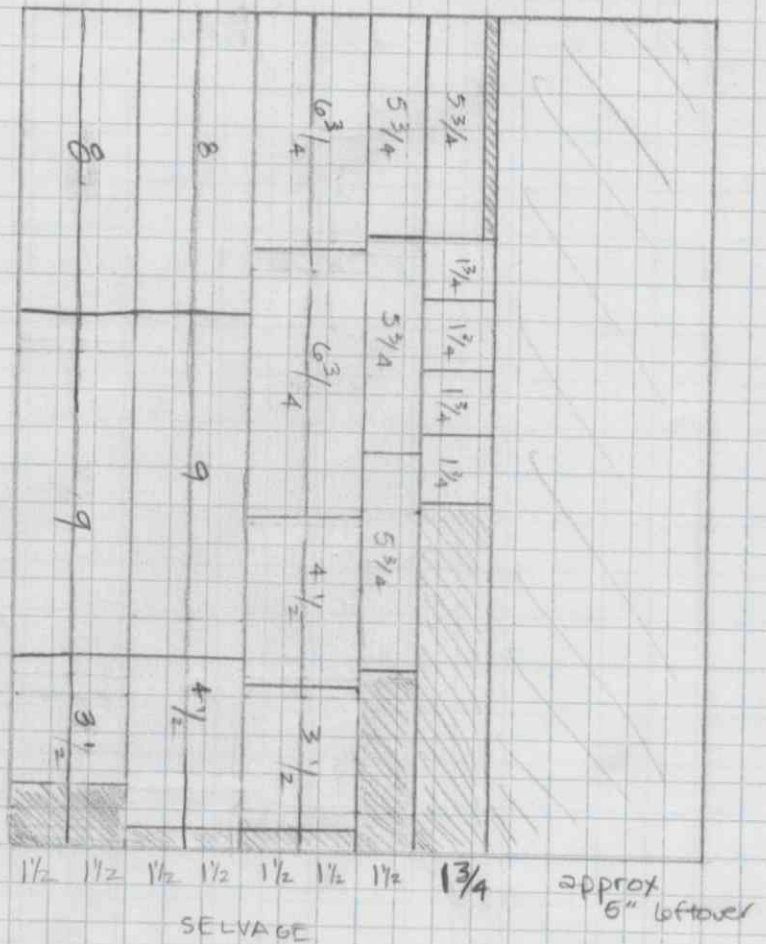
$1\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{3}{4}$

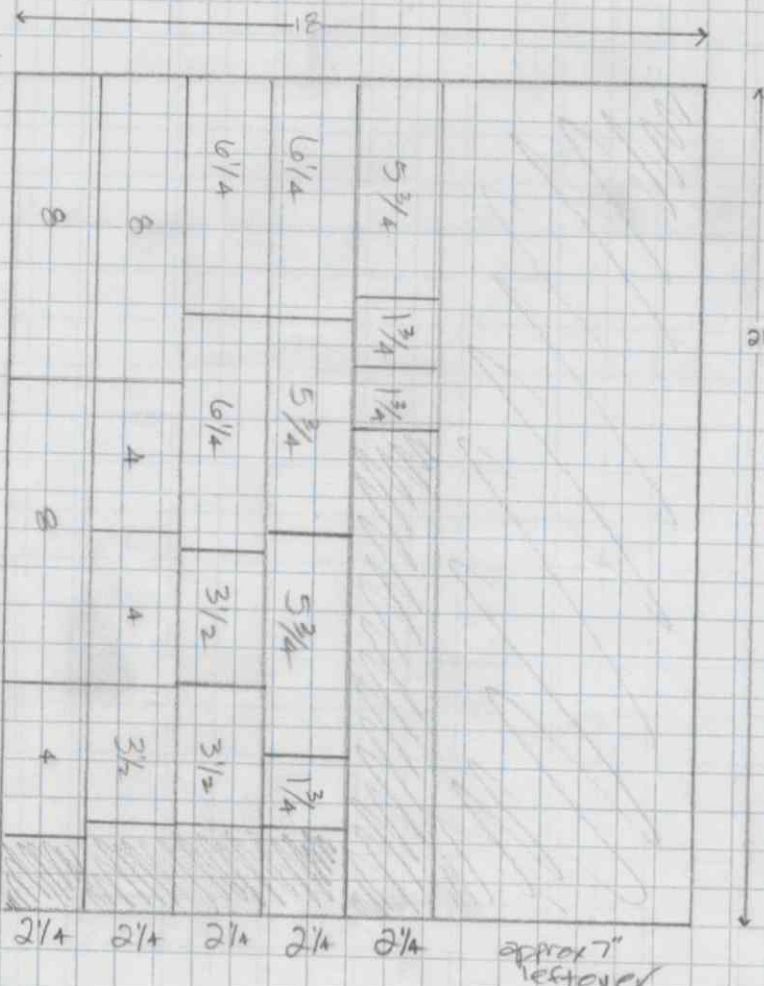
$1\frac{1}{2}$ x 9

$2\frac{1}{4}$ x 4

$2\frac{1}{4}$ x $3\frac{1}{2}$
