Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting on October 17, 2005

Joy Montgomery called the meeting to order at 5:40 pm

Approval of minutes from September 15, 2005 meeting.

Dr. Martin presented the financial report showing the actual revenues and expenditures from July through September with forecasted revenues and expenditures from October through June, 2006. The financial statements indicate a current status of positive cash flow for the school.

The current enrollment level is 300. Seven of the 11 students who have withdrawn from the beginning of the school year have moved out of the county.

Ms. Sanders has completed the planning phase of Red Ribbon Week (anti-drug awareness) scheduled from Oct. 24 through Oct. 28. The week's activities are posted on the Hapeville Charter Middle School website ([www.fultonschools.org/school/hapeville.ms](http://www.fultonschools.org/school/hapeville.ms).) A school dance is planned for Friday, October 28<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm.

Dr. Martin reminded the Board that the Thanksgiving Holidays for the faculty/staff begin Wednesday, Nov. 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Dr. Martin overviewed current plans for the 2006-2007 School Year which includes a close collaboration with the City of Hapeville to determine temporary and/or permanent classroom space for 160 to 180 students (either the 6<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> Grade classes) at another location within the city limits. This planning is being coordinated with the Mayor's Office and the Economic Development Office of the City of Hapeville, along with the submittal of a planning grant for Hapeville Charter High School. The 501(c)(3) for the Hapeville Charter High School Foundation, Corp. is nearing completion by the city's attorney, Mr. Murray Weed.

Ms. Montgomery reported that all Board members have been fingerprinted and background checked.

Dr. Martin has contacted the State of Georgia Charter Schools Office to research possibilities for Board members to participate in training. There are no training sessions planned for the immediate future.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm.
