Citizen award for years of giving back to society

OVER 32 years of humanitarian service through Lions Clubs International by a Blackwood resident has been recognised in this year's City of Mitcham Australia Day Awards.

Rhys Roberts, together with Mitcham resident Rosemary Fisher, was jointly presented with an Australia Day Citizen of the Year Award at the ceremony held at Carrick Hill last

Rhys, 72, says he was born on the Adelaide Plains but 'escaped to the Hills' in 1947 when he was a 3-year-old. "Except for a 20 year holiday in Canberra where I was a political lobbyist, I've always lived in the Hills," he says.

Rhys' background is in engineering and economics, and in between voluntary activities, he and his wife Helen (who is a member of Blackwood Rotary) ran the family printing and publishing business for many years.

Many people will know Rhys in his role as Manager for the Lions Club Bargain Centre at Eden Hills, and under his 9-year leadership, the weekly proceeds grew from \$800 to \$3,000 per week. Currently heavily involved in the Lions Medical Research Foundation, Rhys' many roles in Lions have included Zone Chairman, Region Chairman and elected as District Governor [Chief Executive] of the Lions District 201C2 in 2013/2014.

His main work for the Lions Medical Research Foundation has been with the Mobile Skin Cancer Screening Unit (see article in last months edition on page 8). This truck and 10m trailer will provide free skin cancer screenings

for the general public throughout South Australia and Northern Territory, and Rhys say everyone is invited to the official launch by the Governor of South Australia at the Torrens Parade Ground, 11.30am-2.30pm on Saturday February 4. "We've had huge support from Lions and Lions International for this service," he says.


In other areas of the community, Rhys was the inaugural Chairman of the Adelaide Hills Combined Community Clubs, Chairman of the Mitcham Hills Lions Christmas Pageant, and he currently is Vice President of the Blackwood Community Recreation Centre and Chairman of the Blackwood & District Memorial Hall Inc.

Rhys is very humble about his award, and says it's always a team that achieves it. "It's definitely teamwork with my wife Helen," he says, adding he works with 50 or 60 people in his various roles, all worthy of an award.

"It's such a privilege to live in this safe corner of the world and I get a lot of satisfaction from doing voluntary work," he says. "It's almost our duty and responsibility because we are so fortunate to give back to the society for looking after us."

In his spare time, Rhys says he enjoys painting, but reckons his wife is the better artist!

Council working behind the scenes to develop activity centre

IT'S been nearly two years since a damning review that was presented to City of Mitcham Strategic Planning and Development Policy Committee noted there has been little to no change in the Blackwood district centre for over 35 years.

In March 2015, the report stated there needs to be a long-term plan for the rejuvenation of Blackwood which requires vision, the commitment and leadership of at least four future Mitcham Councils and the active support of local residents and traders. Without these elements, Blackwood Centre will atrophy.

Since then Council has commenced negotiations with key stakeholders in the area with a view to rejuvenating Blackwood's central dis-

Mayor Glenn Spear confirmed negotiations had involved some 38 different stakeholders and options are still been discussed in confidence. Options include achieving a north south pedestrian linkage through to Waite Street Reserve.

"These are detailed discussions which involve commercial sensitivities," he says. "However, we have a desire for a pedestrianised thoroughfare and connections between precincts in the area, and the preferred site for the activity centre."

At the end of last year Council agreed, once it was confident of the future key connectivity in the district centre, to develop a concept plan for the Blackwood Activity Centre building located at Young Street and a Landscape Masterplan for the Waite Reserve Precinct.

"There are a lot of things to consider such as parking and access," confirms Glenn.

In its discussions at the end of last year, Council also agreed once the Blackwood Activity Centre Building Concept Plan and Waite Reserve Landscape Masterplan have been endorsed by Council, community consultation would occur. It also endorsed up to \$45,000 for the development of a Blackwood Activity Centre Building Concept Plan (\$30,000) and Waite Reserve Landscape Masterplan (\$15,000) to be included at Budget Review 2.

At this stage, Council did not commit to implement or fund these projects, however Glenn says with the state elections just 15 months or less away, a smart Council will be calling on candidates to identify Blackwood as a commercial precinct and commit to funding for Blackwood.

The potential redevelopment of Blackwood is also attracting interest from other areas, with the University of Adelaide School of Architecture and Built Environment expressing interest in senior students working with Council on suitable projects.

While some may feel the development of Blackwood isn't progressing, Glenn says in his view, what this Council has done is not just more reports, but has started negotiations. "There are around 35 reports done on the area, but we are paving the way for further economic develop-

AS we enter the hotter months, the Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) has written to several local community groups to advise the steps it is taking in the Adelaide Hills regarding vegetation management and bushfire preparation.

As well as paying extra attention to clearing vegetation and vehicle inspections before departure, there are also roll-by or standing inspections during the train's journey, so whenever a train passes another train, crews inspect the adjacent train for any faults.

In early 2014, following the fire in Belair National Park which was believed to have been started by a passing goods train, ARTC implemented some additional procedures. These included:

- When a catastrophic fire risk day is forecast, ARTC will issue a formal train notice advising all operators of the forecast
- Remind train crews to be vigilant on those days, and to minimise risk as far as possible, such as ensuring the use of the dynamic brake system rather than the direct braking system
- Advise crews to be observant of any unusual activity during the journey, and immediately report any suspicions.


relates to evacuation out of a bushfire area being restricted by activated level crossings.

ARTC highlights it has a good working relationship with local emergency services teams, and these teams have a direct line into its Network Control Centre. Direction is taken from the emergency services team to cease or continue train operations in the event of a bushfire, which may include operation of level crossings.

ARTC will continue to work closely with emergency services and take direction to provide fast and safe access to the rail corridor should emergency service vehicles and personnel require

Also maintaining regular contact with both emergency services and the rail operators in the event of fire risk, and working closely to ensure CFS requirements and directions are under-

If you have concerns about fire prevention or vegetation maintenance, along the rail track, you can report them to ARTC's Enviroline, email Enviroline@ARTC.com.au or telephone message 1300 550 402. Include specific localities, ideally using Google maps information and photographs so the specific location can be accurately identified and quickly addressed.



Emergency Alert warning system

IN the event of a bushfire in the area, Emergency Alert, the national telephone warning system used by emergency services will send voice messages to landlines and text messages to mobile phones within a defined area about likely or actual emergencies.

Emergency Alert will send voice messages to landlines and a text to mobile telephones based on the last known location of the handset. You do not need to register your phone. but there may be reasons why you won't receive a text message such as no reception in the area.

Do not rely on receiving a warning message on your phone. You still need to prepare for an emergency and you should not wait to receive a warning before you act.

IF you're wondering where to go in the event of a Catastrophic fire day, the Blackwood Belair District Community Association (BBDCA) in co-operation with the Mitcham Council provides and staffs a Fire Safety Refuge during the CFS Fire Season.

On Catastrophic fire days (as designated by BOM and CFS) all residents are welcome to stay in the Mitcham Community Centre (opposite the Mitcham Council Chamber) Belair Road, Torrens Park. It will be open from 8am-8pm (unless otherwise notified) and will have refreshments, magazines, books, board games and cards.



Strong local support for third Everest attempt

EXCRUCIATING sinus problems on her first attempt to climb the world's highest mountain in 2010, and an unpredicted storm combined with having a bad cold, meant Everest's summit eluded Coromandel Valley mountain climber Lynette Trott a second time in 2011.

So, she's going for third time lucky in 2018! And at the same time, hopes to be the third person in South Australia to summit the mountain.

Lynette says the 'Everest bug bit' when she was walking New Zealand's Milford Track in 2013. "I went above the tree line and fell in love with the mountains," she says.

When she was planning her next adventure, she came across a company that taught people to climb, and asked the leader what would it take for a women in her 30s, who has never even rock climbed, to climb Everest.

"As far as I remember, Adrian didn't fall off his chair laughing," says Lynette. "He told me if you do this, this and this, you can climb Everest. And that's what I spent the next 6 years doing, accumulating the skills I needed to climb Everest."

At the time, although friends, family and workmates knew about her dream, it was still a private goal. However, after reading an article while waiting for an appointment, she decided to go public, and climb Everest to increase awareness of the 'Because I am a Girl' (BIAAG) campaign; the charity Plan's campaign is to fight gender inequality, promote girls' rights and lift millions of girls out of poverty.

India to work in the sex industry, so I rang Plan first thing the next morning, offering my climb to raise awareness of BIAAG and Plan," says Lynette. "They said yes. I got off the phone and thought "what have I done?"

Since her second attempt, Lynette has had a few more challenges to overcome, including a tooth abscess (which involved bone grafts), laser treatment for glaucoma and intensive physio for a ripped hamstring and to correct her pronation (walking on the inner border of the foot).

Now going for her third attempt, 'Team Trotti', made up of Jessica Kemp and Carlie Altmann from SportsMed Blackwood, endurance coach Nick Muxlow and strength and conditioning coach Alexander Brackstone, is helping Lynette reach her goal. Her weekly training consists of hours of step-ups and short hikes in the week and 8-11 hour hikes at the weekend.

She's also got help from Blackwood businesses such as Jacob's Tyres, Blackwood Lingerie and Supreme Beauty, who have donated services and items to help with her training.

Lynette will be travelling to Nepal in March 2018 with Everest expedition specialists Adventure Consultants. Hoping to summit in

Blackwood Park traffic review

I note with concern that in the course of Council's recent review of traffic measures in Blackwood South, that it has overturned and directly contravened the specific provision in the original Craigburn development agreement, that no traffic access was ever to be permitted from the northern boundary of the development into the already settled Blackwood South residential area, and has bowed to pressure to open the Hayman Retreat emergency exit to public access.

This move will inevitably increase traffic flow in Trevor Terrace and Johnson Parade to unacceptable levels - an estimated additional 680 vehicles/day on top of the already 900 plus vehicles/day. There is no way that Craigburn residents using Hayman Retreat as an exit are going to use the alternative options of Brighton Parade or the T-junction at Coromandel

Having created the problem, Council can expect to receive renewed demands for traffic control and calming measures in Trevor Terrace and Johnson Pde (as previously requested by residents on several occasions) similar to those now approved for Brighton Parade after years of delay.

In the meantime until that happens affected residents are going to have to endure disruptions to the residential lifestyle they have become accustomed to and come to expect over the past fifty years - not acceptable! (Copy of letter sent to Mitcham Council)

Residents kept in the dark over additional transponders One resident raised concerns over the digging,

highlighting that residents have restrictions on pruning and digging in the area, because of the nature of the trees. Council confirmed it had not been advised of

any cabling works in Adey Road, in relation to the Telstra Tower, and at time of writing, Council assured it will, as a priority, undertake an assessment of the trees on Adey Road, once current

assessments in relation to last month's high winds are completed.

The lease agreement with Telstra does have rights to offer co-location to other providers and Council passed a resolution on 24 May 2011 to encourage co-location opportunities. Co-location is encouraged under the Telecommunications Act as an efficient way to increase service levels while limiting the profusion of new towers and other infrastructure.

The Blackwood Times understands Vodafone submitted, in association with Optus, to co-locate some mobile phone

aerials and equipment at Telstra's mobile base station at Craigburn Farm and this installation is currently occurring. The co-locating service providers advertised this in the Mitcham and Hills Messenger Press, July 2016.

"Telstra is not responsible nor has control on the type equipment being installed or the process or timeframe in which it occurs. This is the responsibility of the new carrier to the site," a Telstra spokesman says.

A Vodafone spokesperson says there are strict legislative requirements and health stanobserve in relation to the design, siting and operation of mobile facilities, and we are complying with all our obligations.

Regarding the aesthetics, Telstra has undertaken some planting of young trees which when more mature, will provide a screening effect at the site. "Telstra will continue to monitor their growth in coming months and plant additional trees if required," the spokesman confirms.

For other residents in the area, the tower is well received; they can now can make phone calls in their houses instead of walking down the garden. "It is reassuring to know, in the event of a (seemingly increasingly likely) power outage, we can still make an emergency call when our NBN home phone does not work," one resident notes. And they can also receive emergency service text alerts in the event of a bushfire.

Some residents point out there are other structures in our streetscapes. "I suppose that some people once got narky about stobie poles before they got used to light bulbs and electrical appliances!" they highlight.



'Meet the Millers' is a series of articles based on information in the magazine about the lives of an imaginary Blackwood family in September 1914. The Miller family consists of parents, Mary and Alan, 17 year old twins Julia and Jamie, and 12 year old Charlie. This first article focuses on Mary.

MARY has lived in Blackwood all her life. She attended Coromandel Valley Primary School and returned as a teacher, before her marriage. Now home duties for the family of five - cooking, washing, ironing, cleaning - consume much of her

She enjoys her flower garden, particularly the roses which she intends to enter in the local Flower and Industrial Show in October, despite the current severe drought. The tanks which provide the only water for the household's needs are low.

After reading the articles in the Blackwood Magazine about gardening without irrigation, she wonders if the scant amount of water left should be channelled into the vegetable garden rather than the flower garden.

Saturday is for sport. While Mary herself plays tennis at the Blackwood Tennis Club every Friday, her and the children play football, cricket, hockey or tennis, and providing

which sport is in season if the weekly washing involves mud or grass


Saturday sport is often followed by a social or dance at the Boys Club Hall attended by all the family, and again requires the provision of food for the sumptuous suppers.

AFTER seeing the Southern Fleurieu homegrown produce sharing initiative 'Grow Free' group on Facebook, one local resident decided to bring the Grow Free carts to Blackwood!

Blackwood resident Kay Moss, who has lived in the district for 17 years, was talking to a friend that commented on the group, so

she clicked onto their website to learn more about it.

She told her sister Margaret Cuthbertson, Manager at Blackwood Community Recreation Centre about it, who loved the idea and suggested introducing it to the community here - starting

The idea is really simple as Kay explains: "If you have an abundance of produce from the garden, seeds or seedling, or have

made for instance, an abundance of apricot chutney, you can put them on the Grow Free cart for other

She says the produce on the carts are for anyone or anybody in the community - and you don't have to contribute to the cart to take any of the produce. Their slogan is 'Take what you want, leave what you can'; all produce is free of charge and just a way for the community to share its excess.

"Instead of produce going to waste, let someone

else have it," she says, and she hopes people may start growing extra in their garden for the cart. "I love gardening and don't grow veggies very often as I often grow too many for me," she says.

However, now there is a Grow Free cart, she knows where she can donate her 15 or so excess zucchini!

Kay highlights the idea has 'taken off like a rocket' and in the Fleurieu, the Grow Free community has grown beyond people donating excess produce, to organising working bees to help tend older peoples' gardens and sharing gardening tips and recipes online. And she hopes the Grow Free community spirit will grow




