CONSENT TO PARTICIPATE AND LIABILITY RELEASE

I / We, the parent(s)/guardian(s)/conservator(s) listed on this form for the child listed on this form grant permission for my son/daughter to participate in all youth activities and functions noted above. I understand that as parent(s)/guardian(s)/conservator(s), I remain legally responsible for any personal actions taken by my son/daughter. We recognize the inherent risk associated with the various youth activities that my son/daughter will be participating in. I / We agree on behalf of myself, my son/daughter named herein, our heirs, successors, and assigns to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless **St Gabriel Catholic Community – McKinney, TX** and the Roman Catholic Diocese of Dallas, their employees and/or volunteers from any and all claims (unless due to the Sole or Gross NEGLIGENCE of the Parish) for illness, injury, death, and the cost of medical treatment therewith, arising from or in any way connected with my son/daughter participating and/or attending the various youth programs and activities during this formation year noted above. In the event any legal action is taken by either party against the other party to enforce any of the terms and conditions of this release, it is agreed that the unsuccessful party to such action shall pay to the prevailing party therein all reasonable court costs, reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses incurred by the prevailing party.

I have read this consent to participate and liability release, and I understand and voluntarily agree to its provisions.

AUTHORIZATION OF CONSENT TO TREAT MINOR

I/We, the parent(s) or guardians of the child listed on this form, a minor, and as such do hereby authorize **St Gabriel Catholic Community –McKinney, TX** their ministry leaders, employees, contractors and volunteers as agent(s) for the undersigned to consent to any x-ray examination, anesthetic, medical, dental, or surgical diagnosis or treatment, and hospital care which is deemed advisable by, and is to be rendered under the general or specific supervision of any physician or surgeon licensed under the laws of the jurisdiction where such diagnosis or treatment may be given, whether such diagnosis or treatment is rendered at the office of said physician, at a hospital, or at any other location. It is understood that this authorization is given in advance of any specific treatment or diagnosis, but is given to provide authority and power of treatment, or hospital care which the aforementioned physician in the exercise of best judgment may deem advisable. This authorization is given pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 32 of the Texas Family Code. This authorization shall remain effective for up to one year from the date of completion of this form, unless sooner revoked in writing delivered to said agent(s). In consideration of acceptance of this authorization, but without any time limitation and without any future right of revocation, I/we hereby release, defend and hold harmless the Parish and Roman Catholic Diocese of Dallas (Diocese), their officers, directors, agents, employees, volunteers, youth ministry leaders, and contractors from all claims, liabilities and loss in any way arising out of or in connection with or relating to such treatment and treatment decisions.

MEDIA RELEASE - AUDIO/VISUAL RECORDING AND PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

On occasion, video recordings, audio recordings, photographic slides, and photographs are taken of children and youth during church and diocesan sponsored activities. These are utilized in newsletters, websites, event promotion, advertisements and other printed media. As the State of Texas does not prevent audio or video recording or the photographing of children/youth (with the exception of Senate Bill 1, Section 26.009, which deals specifically with school districts), it does encourage parental consent. Additionally, current video recordings and photographs assist law enforcement agencies dealing with the Missing Children's Program. I / We consent to the use of such materials in which my child may appear, unless checked at the end of this paragraph. I release the staff and volunteers of **St Gabriel Catholic Community – McKinney, TX** and the Roman Catholic Diocese of Dallas from any liability connected with the use of my child's picture or audio/video recording as part of any of the above or similar activities.

Acknowledged Expectations of Code of Conduct for all registered participants

Expectations: Every youth and adult will treat each other with respect, and conduct themselves in a manner that positively represents St. Gabriel Catholic Community and the Catholic Church. Any drug, alcohol, tobacco, or illegal substance abuse will not be tolerated and will result in removal from the event and a possible ineligibility to participate in other youth ministry events. Adults and youth will abide by all laws (property damage, weapons, stealing, etc.) and will be held responsible for breaking them, and will be held responsible for any damages.

I have read this code of conduct, and I understand and voluntarily agree to its provisions.

Note about Medications:

The child listed on this form will bring all such medications necessary, and such medications will be clearly labeled. I understand that the child will be required to turn all medication(s) over to a supervising adult designated to keep medication(s). I further understand that it will be this child's responsibility to present himself/herself at a location designated for returning medication(s) to this child at the frequencies/times listed below. I understand that the adult to whom this child surrenders the medication has no medical training and this adult will not measure dosages. This child will return the medication(s) to the adult after he/she self-medicates. At the conclusion of any event it will be this child's responsibility to pick up remaining medication(s), if any, at the self-medication designated location. Names of medications and exact dosage and frequencies/times will be provided. All Medical Information will be maintained in a strictly confidential manner. Should your child have an Emergency Injection Device (Epi-Pen), Diabetic Condition, Asthmatics with a rescue inhaler, or other special medical conditions, a separate sheet will need to be attached with a clear description as to the nature of the medical condition and any medication. This is important for situations where the youth is not able to self-administer these treatments and to communicate with Emergency Response Personnel. Ministry leaders, volunteers, and other parish personnel are NOT trained to administer these types of emergency medications.

Parent Involvement

There are several ways you are called to be a part of this summer experience...

FIRST: BE THERE for the Sunday Parent Orientation, Sunday evening Mass and for the Thursday Evening Closing ceremony (and ICE CREAM!!). These bookend events bring us together as a community, help show the youth how important they are, and allows you to meet their new friends.

SECOND: OFFERING YOUR TIME. Show them this is a valuable experience by volunteering. Your help is crucial to the success of this program. We need adult leadership, drivers, set-up & clean-up, food preparation, and safety supervision. Your child will not mind you being there, they will be glad you're involved. Don't miss seeing these young disciples in action!

THIRD: TALK TO THEM, ask them about the counselors & campers and their activities. Find out what they liked or didn't like. and if they did something they had never done before.

HOW CAN YOU OFFER YOUR TIME?

- **Adult Guide:** *Every day, from 8am - 5pm we need adults to work with the counselors and campers to insure an awesome experience. In this role you will partner with HS counselors, offering some supervision and direction when needed. Ideally these adults would commit to come everyday, Sunday-Thursday, but we are happy to have adults come for a day or two.*

Other Adult Guide Duties:

Drive to Offsite Locations: *we need to have a few extra drivers to help get us to our destinations, especially if you have a vehicle that can hold 6+.*

Ride the Bus: *we will need several adults on each bus for safe environment and to be the adult guide for those particular patrols.*

- **Drop-off & Pick-up:** *Each morning and afternoon, we need to have people to man the sign-in/out procedures. This requires coming about 20 minutes early for drop-off or pick-up, monitoring the parking lot, and staying until the youth are accounted for.*
- **Organize food during camp:** *Including breakfast, lunch, and occasional snacks. Will be working with the CIT's to organize snacks, drinks, clean up, etc, and will possibly pick up food from stores.*
- **Organize Counselor Appreciation Lunch:** *Thursday, from 10 am - 1pm, the counselors are treated to lunch, we need adults to shop, prepare, set-up and clean-up.*
- **Organize the Food at the Closing Ceremony:** *Thursday, from 3 pm - 6pm, we will have a family celebration at the Closing Ceremonies. We need adults to set up tables, prepare and serve food, and help clean-up. Some adults will need to come by 3pm in the afternoon to set up the room.*

Summer Camp Dress Code

Summer camp is a fun Catholic summer camp. We should always be conscious and modest in our dress but especially so when representing Christ and His Church. These will be enforced. Here are a few basic guidelines to abide by

- No shirts that contain artwork or words contradictory to the teachings of the Church, are offensive or inappropriate in nature (ex. nudity or sexually explicit references, beer or drug references, anything anti-Christian including bands, movies, etc.)
- Shorts and skirts must reach at least the tip of the middle finger when standing with hands straight down to your sides
- No spaghetti strap, tube top, low cut, or mid-riff baring shirts. Guys should wear shirts at all times unless swimming.
- No 2 piece swimsuits (i.e. bikini). Chest and stomach should be covered (*spaghetti strap shirts may only be worn to cover a bikini top while swimming*).
