CHICAGO POLICE DEPARTMENT'S EMERGENCY IDENTIFICATION BRACELET PROGRAM

Chicago citizens, 60 years of age and older, and disabled persons of any age are encouraged to complete the form on the reverse side and bring or mail it to the Community Policing office at the local district police station.

The emergency information provided on the form will be filed with the City of Chicago's Office of Emergency Management Communications and at the local police station of the district in which the senior/disabled person resides, under a confidential code number. This number will be inscribed inside the emergency identification bracelet along with the 24 hour telephone number of the station. If the wearer is subsequently injured or incapacitated, the confidential information on file will be available to authorities through one telephone call. This will ensure prompt and appropriate care and, in the case of an emergency, proper notification will be made to whomever is designated.

The Speidel stainless steel expansion identification bracelet is being offered for the nominal fee of \$7.91 payable by check or money order to the City of Chicago.
