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



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From the Music Director

T HAS BEEN MORE THAN 25 YEARS since the chorus has performed excerpts from Handel's *Messiah*. As I began to plan for this season a year ago, I chose to program Part I of the oratorio for a couple of reasons. The first is that over the past three years, I have found that people find comfort in revisiting works that are familiar. To those people, I hope this performance brings moments of joy and sparks warm memories of past performances. At the same time, I've been surprised to hear from so many people who have never heard nor performed the piece. To those, I say welcome to Handel's *Messiah*, a piece that has been performed continuously since it was premiered in 1742!

The second reason is connected to the Chorale's May 2018 performance of Rex Isenberg's *Messiahs: False and True.* The work explored the idea that in times of crisis, people naturally seek out charismatic individuals within their communities and elevate them to prominence in the hopes that they will lead them out of darkness. *Messiahs: False and True* examined this particular cultural phenomenon by tracing the trajectory of heroic and horrific leaders throughout history. The libretto combines texts in English of various authors (Isaiah, Barack Obama, Ronald Reagan, Jim Jones, Sabbatai Zevi, Søren Kierkegaard, and others), recited by a narrator. These texts are juxtaposed with passages from the Old and New Testaments. Much of the biblical text is borrowed from Handel's *Messiah*, but presented in the Latin Vulgate translation.

While Part I of Handel's oratorio is directly linked to the birth of Christ, it celebrates ancient, universal themes such as peace, goodwill, hope and redemption.

Messiah, composed in just 24 days in 1741 by George Frideric Handel, is a true classic oratorio; it premiered in Dublin, Ireland as a charitable performance for prisoners' debt relief. With lyrics in English that librettist Charles Jennens pulled from the King James Bible, *Messiah* tells the story of Christ's birth, death, and resurrection.

As fitting for the holiday season, Grace Chorale of Brooklyn will perform Part 1 of *Messiah*, which tells the Christmas story. The concert will conclude with the *Hallelujah* Chorus. — Jason Asbury 123 Atlantic Avenue,Brooklyn NY 11201 718.330.0963 l 718.330.0969 www.HeightsChateau.com



About the Artists

JASON ASBURY, MUSIC DIRECTOR

Jason Asbury is currently serving as the Associate Head of School at Saint Ann's School where he has taught music for twenty-five years. He has been active as an organist and conductor in the New York City metropolitan area since 1997 and served 17 years as Director of Music at Prospect Presbyterian Church in Maplewood, New Jersey. He has served as assistant conductor of the Summit Chorale at Drew University in Madison, New Jersey, accompanist for the Brooklyn Youth Chorus, conducted the Prospect Presbyterian Chancel Choir's concert tours in Scotland and Montreal, and has led the Saint Ann's High School Chorus on tours to Germany, Czech Republic, Spain and Iceland. In August 2017, he led a choir trip of 150 choristers to Scotland in honor of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation.

In 2017, Jason launched Communitiesinharmony.com, a blog that celebrates the power of community choruses to create change. The blog features a story about a choir from each of the 50 states.

CHRIS URQUIAGA, ASSISTANT MUSIC DIRECTOR

Singer-songwriter, pianist, and producer Chris Urquiaga is lauded for his exciting performance energy and smooth voice. Hailed as "...the next big thing" by *Metro Weekly* magazine, this Latin pop virtuoso is internationally recognized for his pop compositions laced with Latin, Afro, and Brazilian influences. His music is influenced by his Brazilian and Peruvian heritage and explores themes of gender fluidity and queer culture.

Performance highlights include appearing at the White House for President Barack Obama and the First Lady and as a headliner for Latin Music Night at 54 Below, as well as the 2022 ¡Presente! Latino Heritage Festival Concert at the new Smithsonian National Museum of the American Latino.

His music as urban Latin artist *JChris* has achieved over 2 million views on YouTube, over 500,000 streams on Spotify, international concert touring, and music video productions. His single "Caliente" featured chart-topping Latin music superstar Naldo Benny and was filmed in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Chris is proud to be the new assistant director of Grace Chorale of Brooklyn. Before his appointment, Chris worked with Grace Chorale as a featured vocalist, commissioned composer, and accompanist. Chris was artistic director of Congressional Chorus in Washington, D.C. 2020-2021 and has been a music teacher at Saint Ann's School in Brooklyn Heights since 2021.

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Megan Pachecano, soprano


Praised for her "lucid soprano" (NY Times), Megan Pachecano has performed roles in six Handel oratorios, including her Lincoln Center debut. She has sung solos in Mozart's *Great Mass in C minor, Coronation Mass, Requiem*, and *Exsultate, jubilate*, Haydn's *Lord Nelson Mass* and *Little Organ Mass*, Ravel's *Shéhérazade*, Beethoven's *Die Ruinen von Athen*, and Villa-Lobos' *Bachianas Brasileiras No. 5* with orchestras across the country.

Ms. Pachecano brings a "shimmering lyric soprano" (*Opera News*) to roles such as Beatriz in Catán's *La hija de Rappaccini* with Chicago Opera Theater and the title role in the World Premiere performance of Rosner's *The Chronicle of Nine: The Tragedy of Queen Jane* with Odyssey Opera / Boston Modern Orchestra Project. Other engagements include a live broadcast performance on Radio Television Hong Kong as Valencienne in *The Merry Widow*, many productions with the Metropolitan Opera Chorus, and performances of Adina (*L'elisir d'amore*), Norina (*Don Pasquale*), Susanna (*Le nozze di Figaro*), Fiordiligi (*Così fan tutte*), and Cunegonde (*Candide*).

Ms. Pachecano holds a Master of Classical Voice (Manhattan School of Music) and a Bachelor of Voice Performance (University of Texas at Austin).

CATHERINE HEDBERG, MEZZO-SOPRANO

A versatile performer, mezzo-soprano Catherine Hedberg has a particular passion for early repertoire and new music. Recent performances include a recital of works by Nadia Boulanger and Irving Fine, a South Korean tour with the American Soloists Ensemble of National Chorus of Korea, Tyshawn Sorey's *Monochromatic Light (Afterlife)* at the Park Avenue Armory, Dana Lyn's *A Point on a Slow Curve* at Joe's Pub, and Lewis Nielson's *Cilice* with Wavefield Ensemble. She has been a frequent collaborator with the chamber ensemble Musicians of the Old Post Road, appearing on the ensemble's recording of Christmas music from 18th century Central and South America, and regularly performs as both a soloist and ensemble musician. She has appeared as a soloist with the Handel and Haydn Society, True Concord, Boston Camerata, Central City Chorus, Exsultemus Period Ensemble, Newport Baroque Orchestra, and Victoria Bach Festival, among others.



Edward Washington II, tenor


American Tenor Edward Washington II was born in England, raised in Saudi Arabia and currently lives in New York City. He's celebrated for his soaring high notes, fast melismas, engaging interpretations and generous stage presence. Armed with a BM from Stetson University and a Master's from Morgan State University, Edward has honed his craft through rigorous training and academic excellence in the United States and abroad.

Throughout his career, Edward has performed with prestigious opera companies including Opera Omaha, Detroit Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, and the Metropolitan Opera. He's also performed with Wheeling Symphony, Orlando Philharmonic, Jacksonville Symphony, Ocala Symphony, Orchestra Amadeus and US Air Force String Ensemble. He's also performed in major concert Halls and music festivals showcasing his versatility as a vocal artist. His repertoire includes opera, oratorio, cantatas, art songs, musical theater, spirituals, and hymns.

Edward is a passionate advocate for music education and physical health. He actively engages in advancing music in America with his fraternity: Phi Mu Alpha, Sinfonia. He has premiered the works of five American composers including that of Robert Troeger, Mark Butler, Scott Joiner, Lester Green and Timothy Amukele.

PETER KENDALL CLARK, BARITONE

Peter Kendall Clark sang in the world premieres of Ricky Ian Gordon's *The Garden Of The Finzi-Continis* and Ted Rosenthal's *Dear Erich* (NYCO), and the NYC premiere of Tom Cipullo's *The Parting* (Chelsea Opera). Cast by Harold Prince in his valedictory production of *Candide*, he sang with NYCO last season in the US premiere of Lera Auerbach's "Vessels of Light" at Carnegie Hall. Regionally: Ashlawn Opera (*Annie Get Your Gun, Camelot*), Hawaii Opera Theatre (*Sweeney Todd*), Virginia Opera (*Street Scene, Camelot*), St. Petersburg Opera (*Putting It Together, The Music Man*), Anchorage Opera (*Candide*), Syracuse Opera (*Die Fledermaus, The Threepenny Opera*), Union Avenue Opera (*Glory Denied, Don Pasquale, A Little Night Music*). This season he debuted at Opera Roanoke and Opera Company of Middlebury as Older Thompson in *Glory Denied*. Beginning in May of 2020, his nightly stoop concerts in Brooklyn garnered global media attention ("the hottest ticket in town"- New York Post). As the "Brownstone Baritone" he continues to give Cabaret Concerts in Brooklyn Heights and around the country.






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
