## Project WET Teacher Training June 14 at Valley Branch ELC at Belwin

This summer we are partnering with Minnesota DNR's Project WET program and the Valley Branch Environmental Learning Center at Belwin Nature Conservancy in Afton to provide a full-day training workshop for K-5 teachers in Washington County.

This one-day workshop will train educators to incorporate Project WET activities into their curriculum and will engage participants in fun, hands-on indoor and out-door learning activities appropriate for K-5 students. It will also give teachers and opportunity to connect with their local watershed organizations and learn about resources and information available through EMWREP

program partners for watershed lessons in the classroom and water quality projects at local schools.

## Save the walleye...and then eat 'em!

This July is the 100 year anniversary of the St. Croix River Association, and we're using the occasion as an opportunity to get people involved in projects to clean up lakes, rivers and streams in the St. Croix Valley. We'll be partnering with SCRA, Lift Bridge Brewery and Minnesota beer distributors to get drink coasters out into bars and restaurants throughout the basin. The goal is to reach people that live, work or recreate in the St. Croix Basin but are not currently involved in our programs. The website and social media connected with the coasters will also provide a low-cost, easy way to provide information and advertise future events. During July, SCRA will also be leading a two-week paddle from the headwaters of the St. Croix River in Solon Springs, WI to the confluence with the Mississippi River in Prescott.



## Artful Raingardens in the St. Croix Valley

The Phipps Center for the Arts received a grant from the Velhurst Foundation for a project to inspire collaboration among artists, residents, organization, schools, businesses and communities to learn about, design, install and maintain raingardens throughout the St. Croix Valley. EMWREP has been part of the planning committee for this effort and we are hopeful that the events and activities planned will inspire more people to plant beautiful and functional landscapes that help to keep our water clean.

The project defines an “Artful Raingarden” as one that has both structural integrity and aesthetic appeal. The Phipps Center will have an Artful Raingardens exhibit on display from June 16 until July 17, with a kick-off event in Hudson’s Lakefront Park. The kickoff will include *Voices on the River* - a launch of handmade paper boats from the beach, *Are You Thirsty?* - a performance by Heart of the Beast Puppet Theater in the bandshell, and other activities. There will also be a Raingarden Festival on Sunday, June 26 that will include a variety of hands-on learning activities spread throughout the exhibit.

In addition to these and other community events planned, the project will include a raingarden design contest in which people will compete for seed money to

install their Artful Raingarden design concepts. Entries will be judged on their function, benefit to local waters, and aesthetic appeal. Design concepts from the finalist will be displayed on a website, with the final winner chosen by popular vote.

## Three Cool Activities You Should Know About

### Env. Center Open House

#### **Tuesday, April 26 5-6:30pm - Open House & MS4 Public Meeting Washington County Environmental Center**

In addition to household waste drop-off and the free product reuse room, we will be handing out free soil test kits and will have information for people about assistance for raingardens and habitat projects. Visitors will also be able to order rain barrels to pick up on April 29 and 30 at the County Fairgrounds.

Washington County, South Washington Watershed District and Cottage Grove will be using this open house as their Annual MS4 Public Meeting. During the event, there will be a slide show looping photos from clean water projects around the county and copies of the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans will be available.

### North Market Place

#### **Brown's Creek Watershed District North Market Place Outreach**

Last year, BCWD worked with EOR to identify high priority locations for raingardens in the North Market Place neighborhoods of Stillwater, which drain to Long Lake. BCWD would like to install 134 raingardens in these neighborhoods to help reduce nutrient loading to the lake.

Over the next two weeks, we will be knocking on doors and doing an informal survey of people in the area to determine how interested they are in installing raingardens and what incentives might be needed to get enough people on board for the project.

### Clean Water Challenge

#### **WaterShed Partners - Clean Water Minnesota Media Campaign Clean Water Challenge**

The Metro WaterShed Partners are working to develop a new media campaign approach, modeled after the Minnesota Energy Challenge, that can better measure the impact of education and outreach. The project will include a website with specific actions that people can take to protect water and computer kiosks that can be used at community events.

Citizens will be encouraged to take the Clean Water Challenge and pledge which steps they will take to protect water. Communities will also be able to compete against one another. WSP will use mass marketing strategies to promote the campaign.
