WCD TREE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Washington Conservation District (WCD) has helped planted over one million trees in Washington County since 1978. The WCD Tree Program was started to promote conservation and help landowners create a more beautiful, healthy and ecologically balanced environment. The program is one of the most popular programs the District offers. Many of the county's shelterbelts, farmstead and field windbreaks, wildlife habitat, and re-forestation projects have been started as a result of this program. In more recent years, housing development, community beautification projects, and boulevard plantings have been added to the list of uses under the tree and shrub program.

Through the program, the WCD annually offers seedling trees and shrubs, acquired from wholesale nurseries here in our state, for purchase. A wide variety choice is available, sold in bundles of 25 per species. In addition, though we no longer offer planting services, staff is available to meet with landowners to evaluate your planting site and assist with a planting plan best suited to your soils, slopes, and purpose. We encourage all residents to utilize the WCD Tree Program to start or add to their own beautification plans. Order forms become available in the fall of each year either through the WCD newsletter, the WCD website, or available at the WCD office. Prices and varieties vary by year. Payment must accompany your order. Ordering early will ensure the varieties you need are available. Trees usually are ready for pick-up near the end of April.
