Newark School of the Arts (NSA) provides high-level training in the performing and visual arts. Since 1968, the school has offered instruction for everyone with an interest in the arts regardless of age, talent, and financial resources. NSA is a family and community oriented school that has served 43,000 individuals since its inception, and provides education for 600 students each week.

Specialized instruction is offered in Music (all instruments and voice); Dance (ballet, tap, jazz, modern, hip-hop); Drama and Visual Arts. Special programs are available for talented students and children of pre-school age. Individuals with special needs and senior citizens are integrated into NSA programs. In addition to onsite training, the school also serves area pre-schools, public, charter and private schools as well as other organizations through special arrangement.

The school serves children from age three to adults through long-term sequential training that often contributes to lifelong learning and professional careers in the arts. Many additional students have benefitted from individualized instruction and became successful in other fields of endeavor. Through the emphasis of comprehensive arts education, all students are given opportunities to perform and exhibit in formal and informal settings.

The international faculty with degrees and advanced degrees from leading conservatories is chosen with a view toward professional competence and ability to work effectively with children and adults. Teachers strongly identify with the missions of the school. Some have remained with NSA for many years.

NSA is supported in-part by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, Department of State, a partner agency of the National Endowment for the Arts and by the National Endowment for the Arts

DESCRIPTION

For The 5th year, the Newark School of the Arts (NSA) is providing an exclusive arts program for Newark Public and Private School students.

Funding from several sources allow introductory discount rates for first-time students residing in Newark to enroll in private lessons in music, or group lessons in drama, dance, and visual arts.

School principals, administrators and/or classroom teachers are encouraged to identify students who love the arts to apply for the I.C.A.N. Program. Students must commit to a 17-week semester. Parents/Guardians are required to complete the application form, obtain school signature from principal, teacher or administrator and provide proof of income (2012 W-2 Form)

The I.C.A.N. Program provides a 40% discount off of regular rates for one semester for:

- Private lessons in music, including theory class at no additional charge at \$342.00 for 17 weeks.
- Group lessons in visual arts, dance and drama at \$169.20 for 17 weeks.
- Annual Family Registration fee of \$65.00

Fees must be paid in full at time of registration. No refunds.

Please call NSA and speak to the Registrar, Vitalina Lopez, to schedule an appointment. The Registrar's Office is open Tuesday –Saturday, 9:00 am – 5:00 pm.
