### Delfs, Weyn Win Unit Trophies

History had its eyes on Bryan Delfs this year — Seattle bridge history, that is. Bryan took a relatively early lead in the unit's Microsoft Trophy race and he was not throwing away his shot (yes, Bryan is a fan of the musical *Hamilton*), consolidating his lead decisively in the last two sectionals.

Bryan's masterpoint total this year included the remarkable feat of winning all four final-day Swiss Team events (also achieved by Harry Steiner and Ken Scholes in 2012). Together with his Swiss Teams record in local regionals, including two wins at the recent Leavenworth regional and winning the Sunday Swiss in Lynnwood in

both 2017 and 2018, Bryan has a strong case to be considered the area's King of Swiss Teams!

Jonathan Weyn won the Jabon Trophy, for most masterpoints won in the unit's sectionals by a player starting the year with fewer than 20 masterpoints. Congratulations, Bryan and Jonathan!

If you want to be in "the room where it happens," grab a partner ("that's your second/Your lieutenant when there's reckoning to be reckoned") and come on down to play in one of the sectionals next year! The next tournament will be February 15-17 at Vasa Park in Bellevue.

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### Solution to Plan the Play

You have four diamonds and two heart tricks. What is the safest way to add three tricks in the black suits?

You need to knock out the black aces and, as noted above, you don't care if you lose the lead to LHO — he has to exit "safely" rather than continue hearts, giving you time to knock out the other ace. The danger is that RHO has both aces — or that each opponent has one black ace and you play on the "wrong" suit (where RHO has the ace) first. Is there a better play than simply hoping LHO that has both aces, or that you guess which black suit to lead first?

Yes! Since you don't want to lose the first trick to RHO, you can exploit "second hand low" by leading *through* him, making it expensive for him to take his ace(s). The correct play is to cross to dummy in diamonds and lead a low spade. If RHO flies in with the  $\triangle$ A you have nine tricks, so he must play low and you play the  $\triangle$ K.

Assuming this wins, you cross to dummy in diamonds again and lead a low club towards the AQ! Again, if RHO flies in with the A you have nine tricks, while if LHO wins he can do nothing to hurt you (if he plays a club you go up with the AK), so suppose the AQ also wins. Now you can establish your ninth trick with the AQJ — at this point, you no longer need to worry about losing a trick to RHO!

Do you see why you have to play the black suits in this order? Since you need three black suit tricks, you first play the suit where RHO will give you *three* tricks ( $\bigstar$ KQJ) if he flies with the ace. (If you play clubs first, you cannot guarantee three tricks even if RHO flies with the  $\bigstar$ A — he might have  $\bigstar$ AJ9x.) After winning one spade, you play the suit where RHO will give you *two* tricks ( $\bigstar$ KQ) if he flies with the ace. Once you have a trick in each black suit, you simply go back to the suit where you can establish the ninth trick by force.


