Community Outreach

The Community Outreach Committee has been busy this fall. After collecting over 200 children's books at our October and November luncheons, we distributed 90 books to the library at Belle Haven School, 100 books to St. Elizabeth Seton School, and 30 picture books to the child care room at the Rosalie Rendu Center. All three organizations were delighted to receive a windfall of beautiful books. The variety was terrific, reflecting the understanding among our members of the literacy needs of children.

Then on Friday evening, November 13, we held the second Be the Change event, this time featuring the Support Network for Battered Women. Paula Keane, their outreach director, and Vici Kelley, a woman who used their program, spoke about what they offer and how important their program is in our community. In commenting to our co-presidents, Pat Davis said, "The two speakers were truly inspirational, moving and believable."

The club was generous to the Support Network, donating \$550 in cash, \$350 in gift cards, and purchases of pins and cards totaling over \$800. In addition, members and friends brought diapers, blankets, sheets, towels, games, toys, baby clothes and many other items. The table overflowed!

The Committee will meet in December to evaluate and then plan for spring. If you have input please get in touch with Vicki Sullivan or Eileen Brooks, co-chairs. We look forward to bringing you more outreach programs in 2010.

"Domestic Arts." Castilleja's early catalogs affirmed that each student's course of study would help to "develop systematic and scholarly habits of thought" and would also give "particular attention...to training in social customs, grace of manner, and refinement of speech."

In 1907, 68 girls enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade, to be taught by 20 teachers and administrators, all with college degrees. They attended classes at 1121 Bryant Street before Miss Lockey purchased the present site (1310 Bryant) in 1910. As the school's prestige grew, Castilleja added a boarding department. Miss Lockey's passion and strategies were successful in that in that Castilleja graduates, for several years, were admitted "without examination to Stanford." Today, into its 2nd century, Castilleja educates 400+ young women in grades 6-12. Many of them still aspire, successfully, to Stanford as their first choice, but they must take all of the requisite exams.
