
Presidents' Message

History Corner Credit Where Credit is Due

At a joint conference of the California Historical Society and the California Council for the Promotion of History in San Diego in 1994, Suzanne Hutton Beaver and I presented papers at a session we titled *A Many-Sided Affair: Preservation and Interpretation as a Process.* My talk, *Remains to be Seen*, referred to the Juana Briones house, a project still unresolved. Sue's, *American Heritage Is a Woman's Heritage*, related to her work at the Museum of American Heritage soon after its opening in 1990. Her extensive research revealed many examples of women's contributions to the topics of exhibits at the Museum about tools, patents, and cars.

One of Sue's insights for the tool exhibit related to cooperage, the art of barrel-making, which derived from women's long history as basket makers. Sue designed a wall display on Martha Coston, who in 1871 patented a system that used different colored fireworks, coded for communication between distant points, eventually adopted by navies worldwide, one patent of many by women. For the subject of cars, Sue included the information that Joan Neton Cuneo won numerous car races between 1905 and 1909, at which time the American Automobile Association banned women drivers and passengers in races they sponsored.

In my talk, I said that one endearing feature of the Juana Briones house at 4155 Old Adobe Rd. was residents attachment to it. Only three families had lived in it over its 150 years, and all had treasured it. (True, at the time, but now the owners prefer to demolish, a situation that continues to be contested.) I pointed out that our difficulties in preserving this gem, uniquely revealing of cultural history, were exacerbated because the history of women and of Hispanics has been trivialized. A book about California Historical Landmarks claimed that in San Francisco, of the very few that honored women there, all but one were performers. Statistics support the conclusion that a site associated with a male of stature equal to that of Juana Briones would long ago have been preserved for public education.

Thanks to Cathy Dolton the Palo Alto First United Methodist Church Outreach Committee included the Support Network as a recipient of their *Joy of Giving Fund*. Liz Lillard made a connection between Support Network and Adolescent Counseling Services, as the battering of teens can be a problem with dating. Eileen Brooks had a friend who wanted to buy additional pins from Support Network, and she made a large purchase which directly benefits the organization.
