## **COURSE OUTLINE**

The Competition Authority of Kenya (CAK) and the University of Johannesburg's Centre for Competition, Regulation and Economic Development (CCRED) are honoured to host the 8th Annual Capacity Building Workshop and Symposium on Competition Law and Policy during the 6th Annual Competition and Economic Regulation (ACER) Week (ACER VI).

## Approach

This course addresses the core areas of competition economics, through a practitioneroriented approach, with carefully selected case examples and exercises. It will cover recent cases in Kenya, other African countries and internationally, to demonstrate the application of competition tests in practice. Hypothetical exercises will be undertaken to enhance learning and apply concepts, run in facilitated online breakout groups. Key topics will include merger control, digital platforms, regional competition enforcement, and barriers to entry and inclusive development.


