

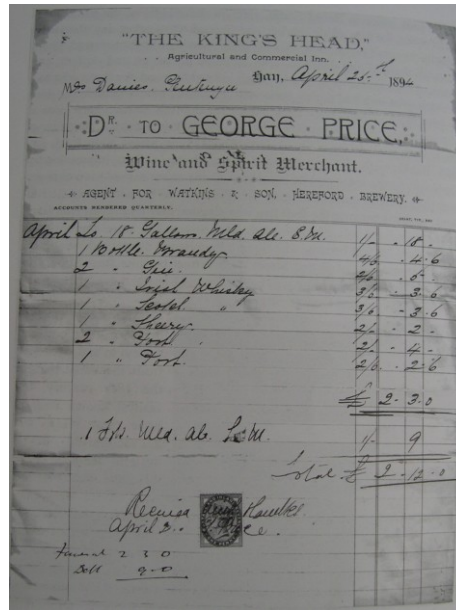
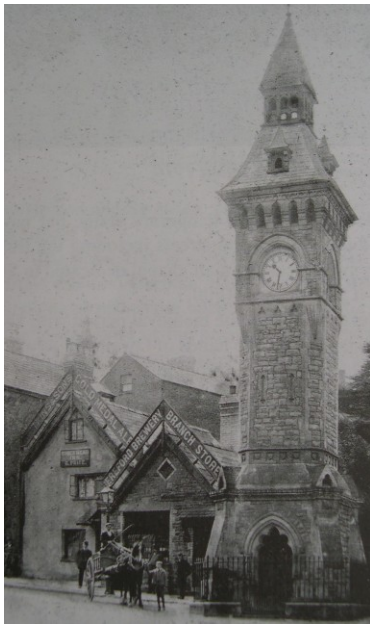

Listing gives: C17 with gable end to the street. 2-storey and attic rendered front with plinth to timber framed structure, the ground floor of which is now built over in stone. Slate roof; panelled bargeboards with pendant and finial. Triangular headed attic window with casement window; flush frame horned sashes to 1st floor and recessed 6-pane sash to ground floor centre. Half glazed double door entrance under lean-to hood which returns to right along side of Pin Up Shop. The single storey and attic shop is set forward

to right with gabled and painted bull nosed rubble front with plinth and brick dressings; slate roof, stock brick chimney stack and similar bargeboards. Panelled doors under corbelled lean-to hood. The timber box-frame is partly exposed in the interior of Tredegar House; simple roof construction without collar or tie.

The building is of 17th Century origin, and was certainly licensed in the 18th century. An engraving of the area published in 1814 shows the inn with a sign hanging outside. However the first directory entry, which was published in 1830, includes Thomas Jones as licensee of the King's Head, which was then described as being in Coal Market. In 1835 it is given as being in Red Lion Street. It was almost certainly the un-named beer house run by Susannah Jones which appears in Directories between 1835 and 1868, variously described as being in Broad Street and Red Lion Street. She was probably the widow of Thomas Jones recorded in 1835. By 1861 the inn was held by James Williams and a directory of 1868 positions it in The Square. He was at the King's Head in 1871 but by 1874 the licensee was named as David James although James Williams still owned the premises. By 1891 the premises had been sold to Hereford Imperial Brewery. In 1898 it was sold as part of Hereford Brewery being described as "a stone and slate house situate in the centre of town". George Price was licensee and he held it until 1926. The Hereford Brewery was merged to become the Hereford and **Tredegar** Brewery and they owned the property until 1938 when it was closed under licensee and tenant David James Lewis.
