

Dear Friends in Christ,

Two years ago, I began a journey toward a Doctor of Ministry in Congregational Mission and Leadership at Luther Seminary. The topic for my research over the past several months has been how we, a bilingual-multicultural congregation, reflect the image of the Trinity in unity and diversity. Most of the activities involved in the research were ministries we have been doing for years, like our Christmas Pageant and Three Kings Celebration. Also relevant for the research were some new activities, like the series of town hall meetings with round table discussions and our 2018 church council retreat.

In the Fall of 2017, many of you participated in a survey to help to establish a baseline so that we might learn if and how the activities had an impact on our understanding of God's Trinitarian nature and our reflection of that nature. Now that we have come to the end of the research, I would very much appreciate your participation once again, whether or not you completed a questionnaire in the fall. There will be hardcopies available at St. Mark's but it is typically easier to complete the online version. It should take you between 10 and 15 minutes to complete.

Please note, I ask for your birthdate at the beginning of the questionnaire. This is not to identify individual members. Rather, it simultaneously tells me the age demographic and allows endline and baseline questionnaires completed by the same person to be paired. While the whole population of St. Mark's is being studied, it is also helpful to see if and how individual participants were shaped by their experiences.
