SURF'S UP!

JOHN HOOMES' ORIGINAL STAGING TAKES ROSSINI'S CINDERELLA TO THE BEACH

A number of years ago, while directing a show at a summer festival, I was asked to stage scenes from a variety of operas using the company's resident young artists. One of my assignments was the grand finale of Act 1 from Rossini's La Cenerentola (Cinderella)—a fantastic, extended scene with madcap music, chases, and mistaken identities. As it was summer, we decided to stage the scene in a manner more fitting to the season. So, instead of the traditional setting with ballgowns and castles and, since Rossini intentionally downplayed the magic in his version of Cinderella, we shifted the entire scene to the beach, incorporating swimsuits, beachballs, and inflatable pool rafts. We also cranked up the slapstick comedy of the piece, ending up with a cross between an operatic version of a Bugs Bunny cartoon, Gilligan's Island, and those colorful Beach Party movies of the early 1960s.

The scene was such a huge hit with the audience, I was invited to recreate it again the next summer with a different group of artists. As we were rehearsing the scene and one character was being pelted with beachballs, I remember thinking, "I wonder if it would be possible to do the entire opera like this?" And thus, was spawned the idea for what I like to call *Beach Party Cinderella*.

The pandemic has played havoc with arts groups all over the country. When it comes to programming and scheduling over the past year, I am proud of the way Nashville Opera has worked to stay alive during this challenging time. But at the heart of every opera company is live performance. With that in mind, the staff of Nashville Opera set forth a few months ago trying to figure out how best to make that happen. Just how does one create a live performance while mitigating as much risk as possible for our staff, our singers,

and, of course, our audience! (Who we're finding is hungry to experience a live evening of music and theater!)

Saturday, June 12, after much thought and planning, Nashville Opera will once again offer live performance with a zany, beach-themed production of Rossini's comic opera *Cinderella*. And in yet another surprising pivot, we'll be performing outdoors on the open-air stage at the Ascend Amphitheater in downtown Nashville.

Though already planned to close our 40th Anniversary Season, Rossini's *Cinderella* seems the perfect opera with which to return to live performance. It is hands down one of the most famous fairy tales in the world and, since it's summer and we'll be outdoors, the beach-blanket overlay is even more spot on!

ROSSINI'S VERSION

Innocent Cinderella, neglected and mistreated by her unappreciative family, is the good-hearted girl who winds up marrying the handsome prince in the end. The story we all know today originated with French writer Charles Perrault, who published "Cinderella or The Little Glass Slipper" in 1697. The Brothers Grimm wrote their version in 1812 and Disney gave us its iconic Hollywood animation in 1950. Even though its plot is full of innocent fairy-tale charm, *Cinderella* has a healthy dose of adult longing and many poignant moments.

What better composer than Rossini to write an operatic version? A master of bubbly fast-paced comedies, Rossini was also known for placing touching scenes between the laughs. He called his opera *Cinderella* a *dramma giocoso*—truly a masterful blend of drama and comedy. Despite its serious side, *Cinderella* is still one of Rossini's funniest operas.

When the show premiered in Rome in 1817, Rossini's *Cinderella* was met with indifference by both the critics and the audience. However, like many other operas that suffered early lukewarm receptions, *Cinderella* quickly caught on throughout Italy and soon after began to be produced all over the world. Its first U.S. production was in New York City in 1826, and for most of the 19th century, Rossini's *Cinderella* was more popular than his *Barber of Seville*. Today *Cinderella* is considered one of the top operatic comedies ever written.

Rossini was only 25 years old when he composed Cinderella. The previous year, he had a huge success with The Barber of Seville. Always a fast worker, Rossini is said to have written Cinderella in three weeks, adding a few plot twists and new comic characters that did not appear in the original fairy tale. One big change Rossini made was to downplay the magical elements of the story, creating a non-magical resolution at the end of the show. In Rossini's opera, Cinderella doesn't depend on a magic pumpkin carriage or cute dancing mice to overcome her troubled situation. In fact, a major theme of the opera is overcoming adversity by drawing on strength and goodness from within.

In our beach-party staging of the opera, that is exactly what happens! Cinderella makes her way from her stepfather's broken-down surf shop to the Prince's tony yacht club, overcoming all obstacles with courage and determination—ever gentle and kind of spirit. To help fill out the missing magic moments, we'll be adding beachballs, a surf-and-sand party, inflatable flamingos, simulated synchronized swimming, and a comic encounter with a shark. We're so glad you're joining us at Ascend Amphitheater for this family-friendly comic adventure!



SYNOPSIS

THIS SYNOPSIS HAS BEEN UPDATED TO REFLECT JOHN HOOMES'S BEACH-PARTY STAGING

It's morning in the broken-down surf shop owned by Don Magnifico. Cinderella, known as Angelina, is doing the household chores, as her vain stepsisters Clorinda and Tisbe dance and primp. A knock at the door introduces Alidoro, advisor of Prince Ramiro, disguise as a poor beach bum. Cinderella's stepsisters try to throw him out, but Cinderella sneaks Alidoro some food. Word arrives that on this very evening the prince is holding a fantastic beach party at his exclusive yacht club And at this beach party, the prince will choose his bride.

The ensuing commotion awakens the girl's father, Don Magnifico. He is angry from being pulled from a splendid dream about a donkey. Clorinda and Tisbe relate the news of the beach party to their father.

Soon thereafter, the prince enters in disguise as his own boat mechanic, Dandini. When the prince and Cinderella see each other, it's love at first sight. But when her father bellows, Cinderella rushes out to attend to his needs.

The boat mechanic Dandini arrives (disguised as Prince Ramiro). He is there to escort Don Magnifico's daughters to the beach party. Cinderella asks permission to attend the party too, but Don Magnifico tells her no. Everyone heads to the beach resort, leaving Cinderella behind. Alidoro returns and tells Cinderella that he will help her get to the beach party, but she must go in disguise.

On the private beach of the yacht club, Dandini, continuing his masquerade as the prince, tells Clorinda and Tisbe that he can marry only one young woman, but the other can marry his boat mechanic. The sisters angrily reject this idea.

Alidoro suddenly announces the arrival of a mystery lady to the beach party. Cinderella enters in disguise. When she reveals herself, the sisters feel that this new girl looks too much like their stepsister to be considered any serious competition. Everyone jumps into the surf to swim and frolic.

Near the end of the beach party, Cinderella gives Prince one of her crystal flip flops and tells him to search for the young woman wearing the other flip flop. She tells him that if he can find out who she really is, and still wants to her, she will gladly marry him. Cinderella leaves. Ramiro demotes Dandini and assumes his rightful role as prince, vowing to find his unknown love.

Dandini confesses to Don Magnifico that he is actually the prince's boat mechanic. Dandini then throws the enraged Don Magnifico out of the yacht club.

Don Magnifico, Clorinda, and Tisbe return home and take their anger out on Cinderella. A huge storm blows through, and after it passes, Dandini appears with news that the prince's sports car has broken down outside the surf shop.

Prince Ramiro finds Cinderella, and she suddenly realizes that he is actually the prince! The two go off together, leaving everyone else attempting to make sense of what has just happened.

In the joyous final scene at the prince's yacht club, Cinderella proclaims her happiness. She pardons her stepfather and stepsisters for their treatment of her. Everyone hails Cinderella's beauty and wisdom as goodness is triumphant.



Need a Beach Party brush-up?

In 1963, American International Pictures released Beach Party starring Frankie Avalon and Annette Funicello, and with it a genre was born. Seven more Beach Party movies followed from the studio, as it quickly became one of the most successful cinematic trends of all time. Low-budget and easily produced, beach-party films were profitable and developed their own cult fandom. Their appeal lay in their fantastic escapism, simple themes, and the idea of good clean fun.

Dancing, surfing, teen rebellion, motorcycles, and summer love were de rigueur in movies like Beach Party, Beach Blankef Bingo (1965), Where the Boys Are (1960), and Bikini Beach (1964). Music was another key element, and beach-party films featured major artists such as Stevie Wonder, the Animals, the Beach Boys, Little Richard, and the Supremes. During the 60s, beach-party films fueled the popularity of surfing and exploded U.S. bikini sales by 3000%. (Ironically many were filmed during the winter with actors in full body makeup!)

One of the genre's most beloved stars was Annette Funicello, who appeared in at least five Beach Party films. Her show-business career began as a Mouseketeer on The Mickey Mouse Club and grew immensely throughout the 1950s and 60s. Annette's mentor, Walt Disney, insisted she wear a one-piece bathing suit in Beach Party films in order to maintain a modest public image. (No bikinis?!) Other actors known for their roles in Beach Party films included Linda Evans, Don Rickles, and Elizabeth Montgomery.

Years later, audiences would demand a more realistic portrayal of the young-adult experience. In 1987, genre royalty Frankie Avalon and Annette Funicello were featured in Back to the Beach which parodied their previous wholesome films.
