GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

DEFINITIONS:

Novice: A non-professional who has not yet won any one of the following: Five (5) or more 1st place ribbons, or an AOS/ODC trophy, or a Best of Class Award at any AOS-judged orchid show.

Hobbyist: A non-professional who has won at least one of the following: Five (5) or more 1st place ribbons, or an AOS/ODC trophy, or a Best of Class Award at any AOS-judged orchid show.

Commercial: A professional or business entrant who sells to the general public from an established place of business and whose primary source of income stems from the sale of plants and supplies.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1. Authority:** The decisions and rulings of the judges will be final with respect to all awards. The decisions of the Show Chair are final with respect to all other matters pertaining to the show.
- 2. Judging:** Only the judges and their assistants will be permitted in the area where judging is in progress. The Chair of Judges may establish additional classes if he/she deems it necessary.
- 3. Diseases and Pests:** For your protection and the protection of other growers, **NO plant with visible insects, pests, or disease will be accepted for entry.** The Show Chair and Chair of Judges reserve the right to pull any diseased plant or plant with pests. Plants shall be in good, presentable condition. This rule and its authority also applies to commercial vendors.
- 4. Plant Grooming:** Individual orchid plants, including foliage plants, should be groomed prior to display. Grooming includes the removal of all dried and dead plant parts, trimming of leaf tips due to browning, and the cleaning of leaves and/or pots. The Show Chair may ask an entrant to do additional grooming.
- 5. Use of Artificial Materials:** No flowers other than **natural orchids** may be used in exhibits or gardens or offered for sale, and there may be **no enhancement of natural flower or foliage color.** Cut flowers, including orchids, are not permitted in gardens, but may be used in exhibits and displays. Some exceptions are made for container gardens. See category rules for specifics.
- 6. Lighting:** Any special lighting is the responsibility of the exhibitor. All entrants should bring their own lighting devices, power strips and 25 foot extension cords.
- 7. Material Removal:** No plant shall be removed, or any display dismantled, prior to 4 pm Sunday without the prior approval of the Show Chair. All exhibitors are requested to be present by 3:30 pm Sunday to prevent potential misappropriation of plants and material by other than the rightful owner. Neither the Show Committee nor the Sacramento Orchid Society is responsible for lost or stolen plants.
- 8. Entries:** Additional rules are provided in the section applicable to each entry.
- 9. Personal or Property Damage:** The Show Committee will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of property entered for competition or display, but neither the Show Committee, the Sacramento Orchid Society, the Scottish Rite Center, nor persons controlling the show will be responsible for personal or property damage.
- 10. Water: NO WATER FEATURES ARE PERMITTED** (e.g., ponds, fountains, flumes, etc.). Plants may be misted carefully as necessary, but NOT watered. **WATER CANNOT TOUCH THE FLOOR AT ANY TIME.**
- 11. Tape: ONLY blue "painters tape" can be used on the flooring.** "Duct tape" removes the finish and incurs deductions from our cleaning deposit, which will be charged to the individual using the tape.
- 12. Theme Signs:** Exhibitors must furnish their **theme** signs. Signs must present a professional appearance. Theme sign size may not exceed 8.5" x 14". No individual(s), vendor(s), or sponsor(s) names shall be allowed in garden displays until after judging is completed.
- 13. Garden and Display Signs:** The Society will provide and place individual or sponsor **name** signs, to be placed on the displays after judging.
- 14. Ribbon Judging:** Novice and Hobbyist plants only are open for ribbon judging. First, Second and Third place ribbons may be awarded to the best plants in each entry class at the discretion of the judges.

15. American Orchid Society (AOS) Awards: This Show has been approved for AOS judging. All plants, whether entered for ribbon judging or not, may be considered for AOS awards unless marked by the entrant. If an inflorescence has previously been entered or judged at an AOS function it is considered to have been screened and therefore is not eligible for consideration at this Show. It should be marked "Not for AOS judging". This will not disqualify the flower from consideration in the proper ribbon or trophy class. Submission of plants for judging shall obligate the entrant to accept any award granted and to pay any fees connected with such an AOS award, except where it has been clearly indicated before the judging that the entry was not to be AOS judged.

16. Fees: The owner of any plant receiving an AOS award (e.g., HCC, AM, FCC, CCM, etc.) is responsible for the payment of any fees required by the AOS, and for charges for personal slides obtained from the AOS photographer. The AOS fees range from \$40-\$60 effective December 2016. Fees may change at the discretion of the AOS.

17. Cymbidium Society of America (CSA) Judging: This Show has been approved for CSA judging to judge cymbidiums, paphiopedilums, and phragmopediums. All appropriate plants, whether entered for ribbon judging or not, may be considered for CSA awards unless otherwise marked by the entrant

18. Other: In addition to the above rules and regulations, applicable portions of the AOS Handbook on Judging and Exhibition will be followed.

19. Plant, Garden, Exhibit, and Arrangement Entry Instructions: Please see details below.

AWARDS

Awards given by the Sacramento Orchid Society:

- Best Theme Garden
- Best Commercial Garden or Exhibit
- Best of Class in each Individual Plant Class
- Best Commercial Plant

Other Awards:

- The **Sacramento Orchid Society Special Award** may be presented in all Sections, provided the exhibit is entered for ribbon judging. Additional awards may be presented at the judges' discretion if it is felt that the exhibit is deemed worthy.
- The **Dick Snow Best Exhibited Species Award** may be awarded for the best species exhibited in a garden, display, or entered for judging. *Only non-commercial growers who are members of the Sacramento Orchid Society are eligible.* While a member may win this award more than once, they may not win two years in a row.
- The **Judges' Cup Trophy** may be awarded for an orchid plant entered by a novice or hobbyist (NOT a commercial entrant) that has unusual merit in the opinion of the judges.
- The **Rob Cutter Memorial Award** is given to the best plant shown by a Novice. *Only members of the Sacramento Orchid Society are eligible.* Previous winners of this award are not eligible.
- The **Sweepstakes Trophy** will be awarded to the SOS member whose plants submitted for ribbon judging result in the highest total ribbon point score based on: Blue = 3 points, Red = 2 points, White = 1 point.

Special Complimentary American Orchid Society and Orchid Digest Awards are awarded at the Judges' discretion. These are awarded for displays of plants, flowers and educational material.

- **AOS Gold Certificate:** awarded to groups of plants, displays, or collections
- **AOS Educational Exhibit:** awarded to an educational exhibit of outstanding excellence
- **American Orchid Society Trophy** may be awarded to a garden deemed meritorious of the award in the opinion of the AOS judges. No size/space requirements.
- **American Orchid Society Artistic Certificate** for artistic display of orchids in use may be awarded for an outstanding exhibit judged to be exceptionally artistic. Available to Novice, Hobbyist and Commercial entrants.
- **Orchid Digest Trophy** may be awarded to a non-commercial exhibit at the option of the judges. It may be awarded to an exhibit which, in the opinion of the judges, displays the highest levels of excellence in artistry, taste, and innovation in design and presentation, flower quality and cultural excellence. It is given to encourage the growing of better quality hybrids and species and to encourage their better culture. Judges may also consider the exhibit's educational value and the rarity of its plant materials. No size/space requirements.

PLANT, GARDEN AND EXHIBIT REGISTRATION

NOTE to GARDEN and EXHIBIT REGISTRANTS

We welcome entries in the Garden and Exhibit categories but we need to know how much space will be needed to accommodate all entries. If you even think you might enter in these categories, PLEASE CONTACT Galen Carpenter, Staging Chair, galenbarb@gmail.com, no later than Friday, March 17, to guarantee your space. We may not be able to accommodate your entry if you have not pre-registered.

SECTION I: GARDENS

FLOOR OR TABLE TOP GARDENS

EXHIBITORS: Members of the Sacramento Orchid Society, orchid groups, and vendors are eligible.

ENTRANT CATEGORIES: **Non-Professional** (Novice/Hobbyist) and **Professional** (Commercial)

JUDGING CRITERIA: Judges will consider flower quality, plant variety, general arrangement, labeling of plants, and the title of the display. There are no restrictions on the number of plants per garden that may be registered for ribbon judging. The primary focal point must be orchids, not the props or foliage. If a garden contains plants provided by multiple growers that are to be considered for judging, then a separate Plant Entry Form for each grower/entrant must be completed.

PLANT LABELING: All orchids in gardens must be uniformly labeled in an attractive and discrete manner.

GARDEN TYPES:

Table-top garden with a minimum of **5 blooming orchid plants**. Garden size must be a minimum of ½ the size of the table top (~ 3' x 4') and a maximum of the entire table (~ 3' x 8').

Floor garden with a minimum of **15 blooming orchid plants**.

AWARDS:

- **First, second, and third** place awards may be given in each class
- The **AOS Educational Certificate** may be awarded, if merited

BASKET GARDENS

EXHIBITORS AND ENTRANTS: Exhibition and competition is open to members of the Sacramento Orchid Society only. Entries by commercial orchid nurseries not allowed. All entrants are considered hobbyist, i.e., a non-commercial individual with no restrictions based on past awards.

BASKET GARDEN RULES: The only blooming plants are to be orchids, with no minimum or maximum number allowed. Foliage plants and/or dried plant material may be included. Non-decorative pots are to be concealed. The container should enhance the design and the orchids. Orchids are to be appropriately identified and labeled. Basket size is limited to what can be carried by one person, and all sizes will be judged together.

SECTION II: EXHIBITS AND DISPLAYS

EXHIBITORS: Members of the Sacramento Orchid Society, orchid groups, and vendors are eligible.

ENTRANT CATEGORIES: **Non-Professional** (Novice/Hobbyist) and **Professional** (Commercial)

JUDGING CRITERIA: Judges will consider quality, educational quality, general arrangement, and appearance of the exhibit, and the title of the display.

EXHIBIT AND DISPLAY TYPES

Non-Professional / Novice/Hobbyist Exhibits and Displays

Categories include:

- Educational Exhibits
- Artist-submitted Artwork / Other Artwork
- Photography
- Memorabilia/Collections Featuring Orchids (e.g., pins, stamps, china, etc.)

Professional / Commercial Exhibits and Displays

Categories are the same as above

AWARDS:

- **First, second, and third** place awards may be given in each class
- The **AOS Educational Certificate** may be awarded, if merited

SECTION III: INDIVIDUAL PLANTS

EXHIBITORS: Exhibition classes for individual plants are open to anyone.

ENTRIES: Non-professionals may enter individual plants for ribbon judging, AOS judging, or both. Professionals may **only** enter individual plants for AOS judging, and these plants are eligible for the Best Commercial Plant award.

DEFINITIONS:

- **Novice:** A non-professional who has not yet won any one of the following: Five (5) or more 1st place ribbons, or an AOS/ODC trophy, or a Best of Class Award at any AOS-judged orchid show.
- **Hobbyist:** A non-professional who has won at least one of the following: Five (5) or more 1st place ribbons, or an AOS/ODC trophy, or a Best of Class Award at any AOS-judged orchid show
- **Commercial:** A professional or business entrant who sells to the general public from an established place of business and whose primary source of income stems from the sale of plants and supplies.

RULES:

1. **Plants entered for individual judging must be correctly identified.** Persons entering plants for individual ribbon judging shall be responsible for entering their plants in the correct class, including correct name(s) or parentage of plant, spelling, and any awards given to it. Plant name and class of entry must be submitted on the entry form provided, preferably in advance (See Plant Entry Instructions, below). Assistance will be available at Registration for plant identification and class placement.
2. Plants may only be entered in one class, plus, if qualified, as a specimen plant.
3. Any plant, including those in gardens, may be entered for AOS and for CSA (Cymbidium Society of America) judging. If a plant is not to be considered for AOS and/or CSA judging (because it has been judged previously), please indicate on the plant registration form
4. There is no limit to the number of plants in a garden that may be registered for ribbon judging. If a plant will be located in a garden, rather than on the bench with other plants in the class, the entry form must indicate in which garden the plant is located so the judges can find and evaluate the plant.
5. Judges retain the option of not judging a plant that is entered in an inappropriate class and/or to relocate the plant to an appropriate class.
6. The owner of any plant receiving an AOS award is responsible for payment of any certificate and registration fees required by the AOS, and charges for personal slides obtained from the AOS photographer.
7. All plants entered for ribbon judging must remain on display throughout the Show. Plants from non-members of the Sacramento Orchid Society that earn an AOS award also must remain on display throughout the Show. Owners may claim their plants on Sunday at the close of the Show.
8. Plants must have been owned by the exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) months.

AWARDS:

- **First, second, and third** place ribbons will be given, if merited, to non-professional entries in each class section.
- The **Sweepstakes Trophy** is given to the individual who receives the most total award points.
- The **Best of Class** award given to the best plant in each plant class entered by a Novice or Hobbyist. Best of Class awards are **only** given to Sacramento Orchid Society members in good standing.
- The **Best Commercial Plant** award will be presented to the entry selected by AOS judges.

PLANT ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Complete the Plant Entry Form (attached), type or print clearly, and keep a copy to assist in reclaiming your plants after the show. If you have a lot of plants and working with the form/table is tedious, you may list the information in a similar format in the text of your e-mail, OR provide a simple list in Word, WordPerfect, or in Excel, OR hand write, scan and send as a PDF. We can deal with the information - so long as it is LEGIBLE.

If you are uncertain about a plant being ready or too far gone to display, list it anyway! We have approximately 450 entries to catalog and tags to print and that's a lot at the last minute! Far better to have more entries in early, and delete the 'no-shows', than have last minute entries on Friday evening. This is especially important if you are driving in from any distance and could encounter traffic delays.

Taxonomists have been busy rearranging and renaming plant classifications over the last few years. We will utilize this more accurate terminology. PLEASE access the Royal Horticultural Society website, search the easy to use International Orchid Register, and get the current, accurate nomenclature for your plants!

If you do not know which class a plant belongs in, PLEASE get some help from an experienced grower or one of our local vendors, and make a note of your concern on your registration form if you are still unsure. In most instances, we cannot guess appropriate class placement from the name alone.

2. E-mail the registration information to Penny Walgenbach at pjwalgenbach@frontiernet.net by Tuesday, April 4. Registrations received after this date may be delayed.

3. Deliver your plants to Plant Registration on Friday, April 7 from 1 to 6 pm. In order to be out of the building by 9 pm and have all the plants entered, placed in the appropriate display area, and cross checked by the clerks before this deadline, **all plant entries must be on site no later than 6 pm.** If you cannot meet this deadline, please contact the Registration Chair well in advance to make special arrangements.

4. Upon delivering your plants, pick up identification tags for your pre-registered plants entry and work with registration personnel to place your entries in the appropriate display area.

5. Advise registration personnel of any changes in your plant entries (additions or deletions) so appropriate adjustments to the database and identification tag corrections can be made.

6. *If you have not pre-registered, please arrive as early as possible, but no later than 6 pm, complete an entry form upon arrival and remain on-site until identification tags are completed. Once you have your tags, please assist registration personnel in placing your plants in the display area.*

If you have a lot of plants and working with the form/table is tedious, just list the information in the text of your e-mail, OR provide me with a simple list in WORD or in EXCEL, or hand write, scan and send as a PDF. I can deal with the information - so long as it is LEGIBLE. I can also handle WordPerfect.

I UNPLUG MY COMPUTER AND PRINTER, AND PACK THEM UP, ON THURSDAY AT NOON BEFORE THE SHOW. I DO NOT HAVE ACCESS TO MY E-MAIL THEREAFTER.

IF I DON'T HAVE YOUR ENTRIES BY WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON OR EARLY EVENING, YOU WILL NEED TO BRING THE FORM TO ME ON FRIDAY WITH YOUR PLANTS AND WAIT WHILE I DO YOUR ENTRIES AND TAGS.

We must be out of the building by 9 pm Friday night. In order to have all the plants entered, placed in the appropriate display area, and cross checked before this deadline, **all entries must be on site no later than 6 pm.**
