TBI WELCOMES STUDENT RABBI ARRON ROZOVSKY!

HUC Second-Year Student Rabbi Aaron Rozovsky will serve as the temple’s Student Rabbi for the 2014 -15 academic year. He will arrive in time to lead services during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and to spend the intermediate days with our congregation's kids and adult members.

Aaron is a 28 year old from Bloomfield, Connecticut, a small town near Hartford. He is currently a captain in the 43rd Military Police Brigade, Rhode Island Army National Guard. After spending this past year in Israel, he began to transition over to the Army's Chaplain Candidate Program. He was deployed to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba for a year as a Platoon Leader (September 2009-September 2010) and Afghanistan for a year as a Battle Captain (March 2011-March 2012). The Army also sent him to Brazil for language and cultural training (2007). While in Israel, he was part of the National Guard element that works with the Israel Defense Forces.

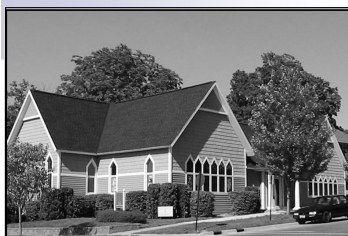
