she graduated from the Hebrew University, Tel Aviv, with both a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree. She graduated cum laude from Hebrew Union College in 1992, and that same year became the first female Sabra (native Israeli) Rabbi ordained in Israel. Rav Maya has been a rabbi with Kehilat Me-



vasseret Zion since 1993 and from 2010 to 2014 served as chair of the Israeli Reform Rabbinical Council. She has written and edited many publications; her latest being "Parashat Ha'Mayim," published by Ha'Kibbutz Ha'Meuhad in 2010.
