Scott Wiener campaign would like to thank the voters of District 8 for overwhelmingly voting for Wiener's re-election to the San Francisco Democratic County Central Committee (DCCC). In his successful re-election to the Democratic Central County Committee, Wiener came in first place overall in District 8, ahead of all candidates including well-known current and former Supervisors. Wiener's first place finish in D8 was a direct result of his extensive and long-term community involvement and outreach, as well as the hard work of his large grassroots volunteer base. These results show that Wiener is truly District 8's neighborhood candidate.

Wiener's first-place finish was particularly strong in light of the fact that he was outspent considerably by a concentrated and coordinated effort of citywide and state organizations determined to see him not get re-elected. This coordinated campaign ran a slate of twelve candidates that excluded Wiener, promoting it with significant amounts of money - including from real estate interests and organizations from outside the city. Despite being outspent by that slate, Wiener was able to come in ahead of each of the slate's candidates in District 8.

The DCCC results in District 8 are seen by many as an early indication of the strength (or lack thereof) of the leading candidates in this fall's Supervisorial race. Wiener's main opponent, Rafael Mandelman, was also re-elected to the DCCC; however, Wiener did much better than Mandelman in District 8, including:

- Wiener came in first place in District 8, whereas Mandelman came in sixth.
- Wiener came in first place in 40 out of District 8's 65 precincts (62%), beating citywide figures such as Aaron Peskin, Carole Migden, David Campos, and David Chiu. Mandelman came in first place in only one precinct. *Please see the map accompanying this release.*
- Wiener defeated Mandelman in 48 out of 65 precincts (74%).
- Wiener surpassed Mandelman in overall votes 55% to 45%
- Wiener won nearly every precinct in the Castro, Noe Valley, Glen Park, and Diamond Heights. He also did well in parts of the Mission.

Wiener's strong results show his broad support across the district, created by his extensive outreach and many years of work and commitment within the community. Wiener and his supporters will continue their hard work to elect District 8's only true neighborhood candidate.
