This is an exciting time. Thank you for all you did in 2023. Your generosity and trust encourage us to do even more.


We look forward to 2024 and beyond, and we hope you do too.


Fueling Christ's Mission in China

Welcome Bin "Chris" Wang as our China Mission Specialist

The Outreach Foundation is pleased to announce that Bin Wang, or Chris as we know him in the United States, has joined our team as China Mission Specialist. He is an amazing young man and a close disciple of Jesus Christ. Chris will be working 20 hours per week, serving to deepen and extend the work of The Outreach Foundation both in China and among Chinese living in diaspora.

Chris is a Chinese national whose life was miraculously changed in 2003 when he was in college. He confessed Jesus Christ as Lord as a response to God's call to him in a vision. Chris served the Church in China as a pastor for over 12 years. Since 2008, he has played a pivotal role in the development of our partnerships in China and has received teams from The Outreach Foundation in Suzhou, his home city.





Chris holds a Master of Arts in Theology from Nanjing Union Theological Seminary, China (2008) and a Master of Arts in Theological Studies from Princeton Theological Seminary (2012). In 2020, Chris relocated to the U.S. with his family for further theological studies concentrating on missional leadership. He lives in Charlotte, NC, with his wife Qian "Vivid," and two wonderful girls, Ying Ya (Christie) and Jing Wei (Valerie). They are members of Westminster Presbyterian Church in Charlotte.

We are excited that the church leadership in China has invited The Outreach Foundation to a broader presence in China. Chris brings essential expertise and connections to make this possible in mainland China, Hong Kong, and the diaspora. The word of the Lord is spreading in China, despite the increased pressure against Chinese Christians. The most remarkable Christian growth has happened among college students, peasant migrant workers, and the professional marketplace. They mostly reside in megacities like Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, and Suzhou. This phenomenal rise of the urban Christian movement in China and among Chinese living in the U.S. merits serious engagement from our congregations. We stand in awe of our Lord who at this challenging time between our countries has said "Go deeper!"

Within the last five years, FPC Mooresville has rekindled its partnership with The Outreach Foundation thanks to the leadership of its pastor, Reverend Dave Rockness. You can also bring us to those experiences or bring those experiences to us."

Dariush is a key part of The Outreach Foundation's Persian Diaspora Partnership, and he loves to tell the stories of the Persians he works with. The other experience Pastor Dave alludes to is that Vic Petrenko, an elder at FPC Mooresville, is traveling on an upcoming Outreach Foundation trip to Ukraine. Among other aspects of his trip, Vic will be helping to hand out Individual First Aid Kits or IFAKs that are crucial to saving the lives of Ukrainian soldiers on the frontlines. FPC Mooresville is just one of the many church partners that send their members on trips with The Outreach Foundation each year, helping fuel the global mission of Christ in the process.

In addition to budgeted support, FPC Mooresville recently did a Chili Cook-Off. Proceeds from the event were donated to help partners here at The Outreach Foundation. We celebrate church partnerships like FPC Mooresville that demonstrate the deeper calling of partnership over that of just sponsoring one of our partners financially. Reaching the Lost, Training Leaders, and Restoring Lives

A Snapshot of Our México Partnership

From the windswept high desert highlands of central México to the sweltering tropical jungles of Southern México, the Spirit of God is on the move in a mighty way in this predominantly Catholic country. The Outreach Foundation has been partnering with the National Presbyterian Church of México (INPM) since 2021 to advance the gospel in multiple ways. The Presbyterian church is alive and thriving south of the border with 6,000 congregations and over three million members.

REACHING THE LOST - One of the key priorities of the Presbyterian Church in México is planting new churches where there is minimal evangelical church presence. Outreach Foundation donors and church partners help support a church plant in the southern city of Tapachula which focuses on ministering to the +30,000 immigrants that come across the nearby border with Guatemala. We also support a vibrant new church for the next generation in the southwestern state of Oaxaca, which includes youth and young adult ministries and regular evangelistic outreaches. Executive Director Mark Mueller and Trustees Rev. Deena Candler and Doug Nielson recently completed a trip to México with the INPM leadership team where multiple new church plant/church revitalization opportunities were identified. In the high desert state of Hidalgo in central México, we met Pastor Noe and his congregation at Santa Rita church. They have a vision to reach six neighboring villages with the gospel message and God's Word. The unique twist is that a majority of the population in this area are Otomí Indians, and many speak Otomí as their first language. The Outreach Foundation is looking to come alongside Santa Rita to help print New Testaments in Otomí as well as build a roof over their large patio area so they can hold evangelism campaigns.

Later during our trip, we flew south to the heart of the Mayan world in the Yucatán Peninsula. We met with the Presbytery of Sac Be in the colonial town of Izamal. This presbytery has a vision to revitalize churches in the area. The Outreach Foundation is excited about partnering with this presbytery to hire a pastor for the church in Izamal that has been without one for an extended period.



TRAINING LEADERS – The Outreach Foundation is also partnering with the INPM to sponsor leadership training events to help church leaders faithfully lead their flocks and re-energize their personal walks through accountability groups. These one-day conferences use an interactive curriculum taught by experienced Mexican pastors and have reached hundreds of pastors, elders, and deacons over the past year. These conferences will continue in 2024 as the INPM team attempts to reach as many of their 76 presbyteries as possible.

RESTORING LIVES – The Outreach Foundation also has the joy of working with Centro Shalom (Peace Center) located on the outskirts of Tapachula, Chiapas. Centro Shalom focuses on providing residential rehabilitation services for men with drug and alcohol addiction. The men (a combination of locals and immigrants) at the center receive treatment and counseling to help them recover from their addiction as well as spiritual mentoring. Approximately 1,400 men have gone through the three-month program over the past 13+ years.

God is using this ministry in a major way to heal the hearts and minds of men who need His healing touch.

Resurrecting and Rebuilding Hope in South Sudan

The Church at Nasir

In 1912, American Presbyterian missionaries settled in the village of Nasir in southern Sudan. Over the next 45 years, they established a church, hospital, and schools, sharing the Good News of Christ's redeeming love among the Nuer ethnic group of southeastern Sudan. When civil conflict erupted in the 1960s, the missionaries were forced to leave. But the seeds of faith remained. The unrest lasted for decades and millions were displaced.




Elizabeth, a teacher who lost her husband in the conflict, was one of those. By God's grace, she escaped with the 30 children from her class, and walked 240 miles to safety in a refugee camp. She came with her faith and joined others in establishing the church in the camp. She organized (through her church and with the support of The Outreach Foundation) a widows' group that cares for hundreds of unaccompanied refugee children. Everyone in the region has experienced trauma. The conflicts have left survivors with physical, spiritual, and mental scars. A high priority of the displaced Presbyterian Church of South Sudan is the need for trauma healing. Outreach has been faithfully supporting this work in the camps, by working closely with John Jock Gatwech, a compassionate teacher and experienced leader, to train trauma healing trainers and establish healing groups. They have also established preschools and adult literacy programs distributing 12,000 Bibles in the Nuer language.

A ceasefire was declared in 2018 and security is slowly returning to eastern South Sudan. Some of the refugees have been in camps in Ethiopia and Kenya for a decade and are eager to return to their homeland. Others remain afraid of facing the destroyed infrastructure, eroded farmland, and mass graves in their home area.

In this context of both fear and longing, our Presbyterian family in Nasir, South Sudan, is rebuilding their war-torn church. It will be a beacon of hope, a place of worship, refuge, and community. The Outreach Foundation has joined South Sudanese Presbyterians to renew a pledge to complete the church. It will be their "Zion." We look forward to the day when we can worship with them in their sacred space!

Outreach Trustee Powell Jones from First Presbyterian Church in Thomasville, GA, traveled with The Outreach Foundation to Germany, visiting some of our Persian friends in diaspora. One thing that stood out to Powell was seeing the work of the Holy Spirit first-hand in the lives of the Iranians. Powell writes, "I do not remember in 25 years of global mission trips seeing new believers come to Christ. During this visit to Germany, four individuals gave their lives to Jesus Christ. One of those was baptized in a special private ceremony. Our team was impacted by the passion and courage we witnessed during our visit." Powell is one of many travelers who come back from our trips with a new perspective on the global mission of Christ being lived out by partners around the world.
