Garden Gate

General instructions: Read through all directions before beginning. Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam; seam allowances are built into the cutting directions. All pieces are sewn right sides together.


Yardage

Fabric A	GGAT 440 G	$\frac{7}{8}$ yard
Fabric B	GGAT 439 W	1 $\frac{3}{8}$ yards
Fabric C	GGAT 442 P	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard
Fabric D	GGAT 441 P	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard
Fabric E	GGAT 436 W	$\frac{7}{8}$ yard
Fabric F	GGAT 442 G	1 yard
Fabric G	GGAT 438 W	$\frac{3}{4}$ yard
Fabric H	GGAT 437 W	1 $\frac{1}{8}$ yards
Backing	any GGAT fabric	3 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards
Batting	73" x 85"	


Cutting


All strips are cut across the width of the fabric.

From fabric A (GGAT 440 G), cut:


(4) 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (20) 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut each square in half diagonally twice for 80 quarter square triangles (QST). 

From fabric B (GGAT 439 W), cut:


(8) 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (80) 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut each square in half diagonally for 160 half square triangles (HST). 

(3) 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (20) 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut each square in half diagonally twice for 80 quarter square triangles (QST). 

From fabric C (GGAT 442 P), cut:

(3) 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (20) 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut each square in half diagonally twice for (80) quarter square triangles (QST). 

From fabric D (GGAT 441 P), cut:

(4) 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (40) 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut each square in half diagonally for 80 half square triangles (HST).

Quilt Size: 66" x 78"

From fabric E (GGAT 436 W), cut:

(4) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips; cut into (20) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for the block center.

From fabric F (GGAT 442 G), cut:

(12) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strips; piece strips together and cut into (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " side border #1 strips; (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 50" top and bottom border #1 strips; (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 68" side border #3 strips ; (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ " top and bottom border #3 strips.

(8) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strips- piece together for binding.

From fabric G (GGAT 438 W), cut:

(6) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips; piece together and cut into (2) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62" side border #2 strips and (2) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 56" top and bottom border #2 strips.

From fabric H (GGAT 437 W), cut:

(7) 5" x 42" strips; piece together and cut into (2) 5" x 69 $\frac{1}{2}$ " side border #4 strips and (2) 5" x 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ " top and bottom border #4 strips.

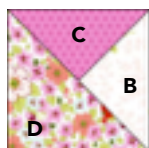
Blocks

1. Sew a fabric B half square triangle to both short sides of a fabric A quarter square triangle to make 1 flying geese unit (FG). The FG unit should measure 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 4 FG units per block for a total of 80 FG units.

2. Sew a fabric B quarter square triangle to a fabric C quarter square triangle along a short edge. Sew the triangle unit to a fabric D half square triangle. Corner square should measure 3 1/2". Make 4 per block for a total of 80 corner squares.



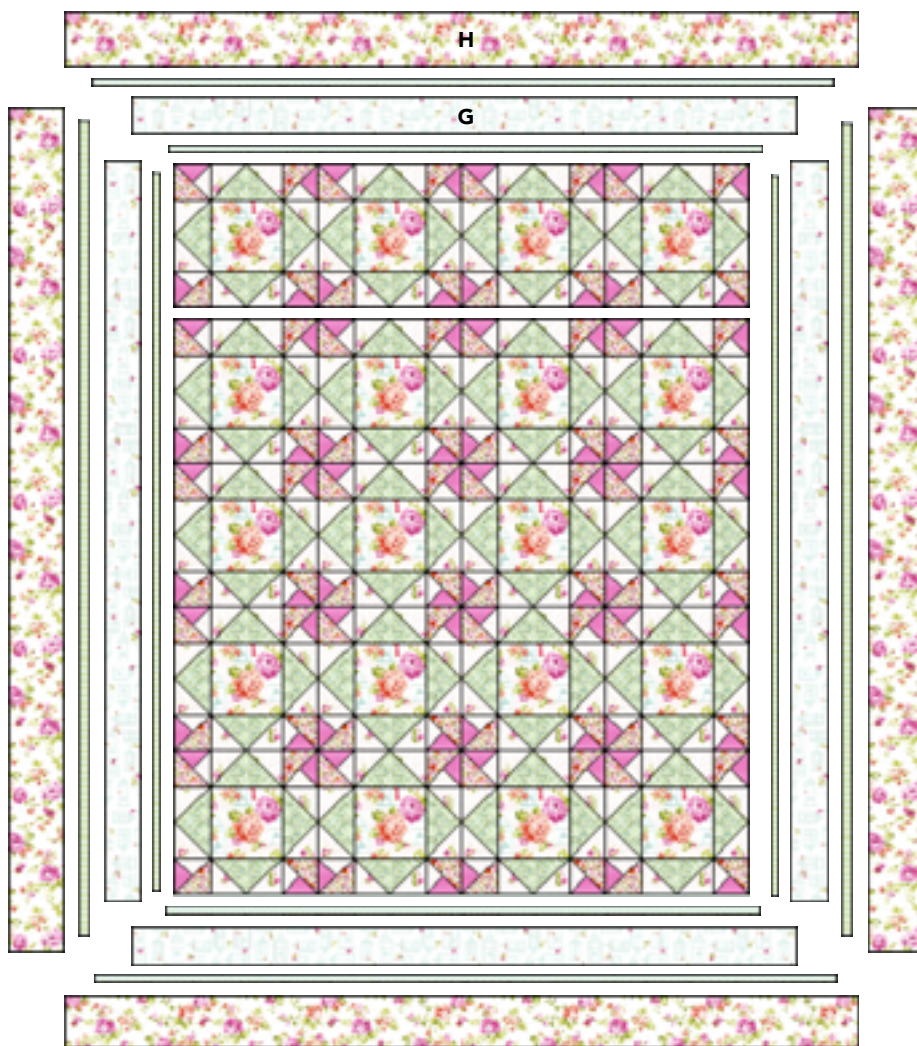
Corner Square

3. Following block diagram, sew 4 FG units, 4 corner squares and 1 fabric E center square into rows. Then sew the rows together to make a block. The block should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Make 20 blocks.



Quilt Assembly

1. Refer to the quilt assembly diagram. Sew the blocks into 5 rows of 4 blocks each. The quilt top should measure 48 1/2" x 60 1/2".
2. Sew a 1 1/4" x 60 1/2" fabric F border #1 to each side of the quilt. Sew a 1 1/4" x 50" fabric F border #1 to the top and bottom of the quilt.
3. Sew the 3 1/2" fabric G borders to the quilt in the same manner. Then add the second set of 1 1/4" fabric F borders and finally the fabric H borders. The quilt top should measure 66 1/2" x 78 1/2".
4. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the 2 1/4" wide fabric F binding strips, bind the edges to finish.

Pillow Size: 20" x 20"

General instructions: Read through all directions before beginning. Sew using a ¼" seam; seam allowances are built into the cutting directions.

All pieces are sewn right sides together.

Yardage- for 2 pillows

Fabric A	GGAT 442 P	½ yard
Fabric B	GGAT 439 W	½ yard
Fabric C	GGAT 440 G	¼ yard
Fabric D	GGAT 442 G	⅛ yard
Fabric E	GGAT 437 W	¼ yard
Fabric F	GGAT 437 T	¼ yard

Backing	any GGAT fabric	⅞ yard
Batting	2 pieces 21" x 21"	
Pillow Form	2 pillow forms 20" x 20"	

Cutting- for 2 pillows

All strips are cut across the width of the fabric.

Pillow #1 has the light outer border and pillow #2 has the blue outer border.

From fabric A (GGAT 442 P), cut:

(1) 7 ¼" x 42" strip; cut into (2) 7 ¼" squares. Cut each square in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 quarter square triangles. ☒

(2) 1 ¼" x 42" strips; for border #2 for pillow #2, cut into (2) 1 ¼" x 14 ½" side borders and (2) 1 ¼" x 16" top and bottom borders.

From fabric B (GGAT 439 W), cut:

(1) 7 ¼" x 42" strip; cut into (2) 7 ¼" squares. cut each square in half diagonally twice for a total of 8 quarter square triangles. ☒

(3) 1 ½" x 42" strips; for border #1 for both pillows, cut into (4) 1 ½" x 12 ½" side borders and (4) 1 ½" x 14 ½" top and bottom borders.

From fabric C (GGAT 440 G), cut:

(1) 6 ⅞" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 6 ⅞" squares. Cut each square in half diagonally for a total of 8 half square triangles. ☐

From fabric D (GGAT 442 G), cut:

(2) 1 ¼" x 42" strips; for border #2 for pillow #1, cut into (2) 1 ¼" x 14 ½" side borders and (2) 1 ¼" x 16" top and bottom borders.

From fabric E (GGAT 437 W), cut:

(2) 2 ¾" x 42" strips; for border #3 for pillow #1, cut into (2) 2 ¾" x 16" side borders and (2) 2 ¾" x 20 ½" top and bottom borders.

From fabric F (GGAT 437 T), cut:

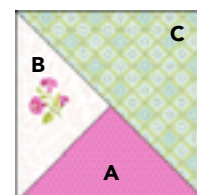
(2) 2 ¾" x 42" strips; for border #3 for pillow #2, cut into (2) 2 ¾" x 16" side borders and (2) 2 ¾" x 20 ½" top and bottom borders.

Backing, cut:

(4) 14 ½" x 20 ½" back panels.

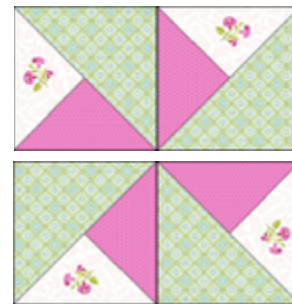
Block

- Following Step 2 under quilt instructions, make 4 corner squares for each pillow using fabric A and B quarter square triangles and fabric C half square triangle. Square should measure 6 ½" x 6 ½".



Square- make 8.

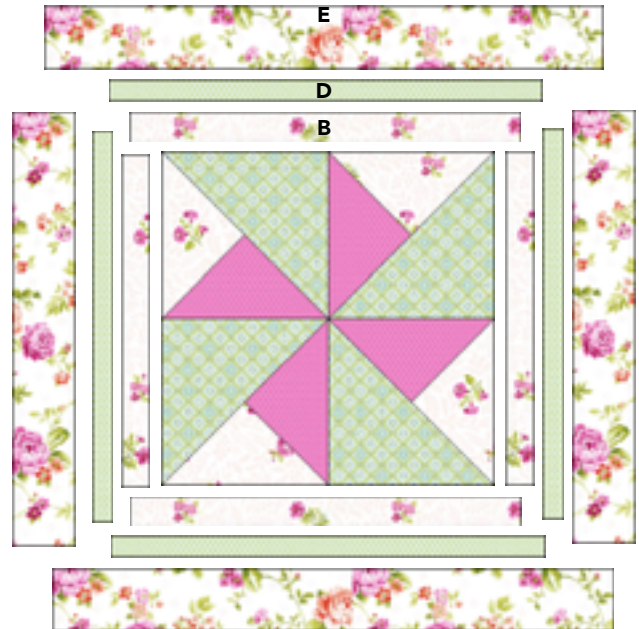
- Following the block assembly diagram, sew 4 squares from step 1 together. Watch the rotation of each square. The block should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Make 2 blocks- one for each pillow.

Pillow Assembly

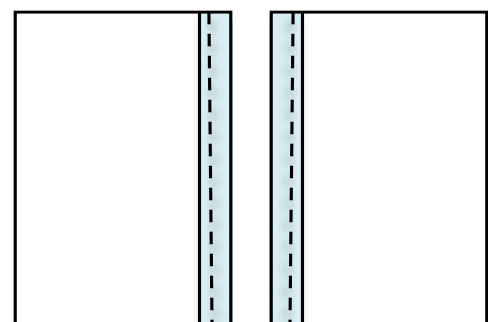
- Refer to the pillow assembly diagram (Pillow #1 is shown). For both pillows, sew a 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" fabric B border #1 to each side of the block. Sew the 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" fabric B border #1 to the top and bottom of the block.
- For pillow #1, sew the 1 1/4" fabric D border #2 to the pillow top in the same manner. Then add the 2 3/4" fabric E border #3. The pillow top should measure 20 1/2" x 20 1/2".
- For pillow # 2, sew the 1 1/4" fabric A border #2 to the pillow top in the same manner. Then add the 2 3/4" fabric F border #3. The pillow top should measure 20 1/2" x 20 1/2".
- Layer the pillow top with the batting and quilt as desired. Trim batting even with pillow top edges after quilting. The pillow top should measure 20 1/2" x 20 1/2".
- On both pillow back pieces, finish one 20 1/2" edge by folding under the edge 1/4" twice and then topstitch about 1/8" away from the folded edge.
- Layer the pillow front right sides together with both pillow back pieces, matching raw edges and overlapping the finished edges of the pillow backs. Sew around all 4 sides of pillow. Clip the corner seams to reduce the bulk. Use a zigzag or overcast stitch to finish the raw edges if desired.
- Turn the pillow right sides out, push out the corners and insert the pillow form. Done!
