DHS S&T UNDERSECRETARY REGINALD BROTHERS TO SPEAK AT 2016 U.S. SCIENCE & ENGINEERING FESTIVAL

WASHINGTON – On April 16, Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Under Secretary for Science and Technology (S&T), Dr. Reginald Brothers will deliver a keynote message at the 2016 U.S. Science & Engineering Festival, a national grassroots effort to advance science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education. In an effort to inspire the next generation of scientists and engineers, Dr. Brothers will discuss the importance of STEM in elementary education, how technology is making an impact in the government arena, and how parents should get involved in their children’s education.
